IT HAD TO BE YOU

By Ross and Mable Hatton, Minneapolis, Minn.

RECORD: "It Had To Be You" - MacGregor 8575
POSITION: Banjo, M Facing LOD (Following acknowledgement)
FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout; steps described are for M.
INTRODUCTION: In OPEN POS, wait 2 meas; then do customary balance apart, acknowledgement and assume starting pos - bring W to R side of M in BANJO POS, M facing LOD.

MEASURES

PART A

- 1 - 2 STEP, CLOSE, STEP, BRUSH; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, BRUSH/PIVOT;
 Starting M's L do 1 two-step fwd and brush with inside foot; Starting M's R do 1 two-step fwd pivoting to SIDECAR POS M crossing L ft over R (W-XIB) to end M facing RLOD.
- 3 - 4 STEP, CLOSE, STEP, BRUSH; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, FACE/TOUCH;
 Repeat action of Meas 1-2 prog. RLOD, ending in LOOSE-CLOSED POS, M's back twd COH.
- 5 - 6 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; STEP, POINT, STEP, TOUCH;
 In loose-closed pos step L to side along LOD, step R XIB of L (W-XIB), step L to side, step R XIF of L (W-XIF); Step L to side along LOD, point R toe just in front of L toe, step R to side along RLOD, touch L to side of R.
- 7 - 8 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; STEP, POINT, STEP, TOUCH;
 Repeat action of Meas 5-6, W pivoting 1/2 L-face on final "step-touch" to assume BANJO POS, M facing LOD.
- 9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS - 1-8, except END IN SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

PART B

- 17 - 20 LADY IN; WRAP UP; LADY OUT (UNWRAP); SPIN L;
 (All of Ws pos changes are done with 3 walking steps and a touch) W crosses in front of M twd COH making 1/2 R-face turn under joined M's L & W's R hands; (Join both hands) Retain M's R & W's L hands at waist height, raise other joined hands to make an arch under which W will make 1/4 L-face turn moving twd wall to M's R side to snuggle in his R arm; Release M's L & W's R hands as W unwraps moving twd wall making 1 complete R-face turn; Swinging Joined hands bwd (RLOD) W makes 1 complete L-face SOLO turn ending in CLOSED POS. (M's footwork is 4 two-steps done almost in place, maneuvering only for ease of dancing.)
- 21 - 24 STEP, CLOSE, STEP, -; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, -; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, -; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, -;
 In closed pos do 4 slow turning two-steps prog LOD, ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.
- 25-32 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-24, adjusting to BANJO POS, M facing LOD, on Meas. 32, to repeat dance.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES IN ALL. Last time through, however, instead of doing 4 turning two-steps on Meas 29-32, do 2 turning two-steps; Then, while M walks fwd slowly (L, -, R, -; L, -, R, -;) W does 2 slow R-face twirls under joined M's L & W's R hands (R, -, L, -; R, -, L, -). Change hands. B & C.

SO YOU GOOFED - WHAT NEXT?

Do you like "challenge" dancing? Not all the time, of course, but as an occasional change from the "comfortable" dancing we hear so much about? If you do, and you and the caller are slugging it out on the floor, with no holds barred, there are surely times when the caller has slipped one past your guard and the set has collapsed. What to do? Walk off the floor as is required in Australia during a "Knock-Out" dance? Go home and wait for the next call, as we were taught to do in Beginners' Class? Grab someone and keep on going, as we have been doing for years in an attempt to fool the caller into thinking we knew what we were doing? Square dancing is changing all the time, and, based on the last few "challenge" dances I have attended, I have a slightly different suggestion to offer.

In the old Visiting Couple days, the idea of going back to home position and waiting was very sound. If you had no idea what the caller meant by 'Dive for the Oyster', maybe the second couple would know, and they could show you. Also, the figures were not long, they were always repeated four times, and you did not stand still very long. But a few years ago, when all the long, involved Allemandes came in, we found out that once you gave up and went home you might miss half the dance. (Or all of it -- remember the 'Poinsettia Pixilator'? That was all one single figure.) We also found out that even if you goofed on one thing, the next call would probably be something you could pick up right there, like 'Swing your Corner' or 'Into the center like an Allemande Thar!'. It did not matter too much who you swung, or what position you took, because everyone did everything anyhow, and you could keep on like that until you finally promenaded home. In order to keep up the deception, and make the caller think we had won, we just promenaded to any home that was handy, and took that position from then on. Or, alternately, if we were sure we had not goofed, but we were out of position anyhow, we would change over ostentatiously after we got home, to show the caller that he had left us that way. That was one for our side.

In the last year or so, however, the callers have developed a new weapon, and our old system of defense no longer works. Have you ever had this happen to you? You have loused up the set but good -- (not you, of course, but someone in your square) -- and you have grabbed a partner and gone right on, and you are promenading home. But the caller says 'Don't stop, don't slow down, Two and four wheel around' and two couples next to each other do the wheel-around. Someone is out of order, obviously, but you never got home to re-orient yourselves, and now what number are you? By the time you have decided who is going to adapt, two more calls have gone by and you are dead. In modern 'challenge' dancing, it is no longer enough to get a girl and keep going -- you also have to know what position you are and, very important these days, who your corner is. So here is my system for keeping One Up on the caller.

First -- if the caller says 'There's your corner, left allemande', and you are milling around in a mess, go find your original corner, then insist on your original partner for the grand right and left. Accept no substitutes -- if each one of you has his original corner and partner, then the couples will be in the right order too.

If the caller just says 'Walk right into a right and left grand' with no allemande, go right ahead walking until you get your own partner, no matter with which hand, and stick to him (or her). Then promenade, but notice who is in front of you, and if you are not in order, get there, right now, before the caller can start something.

If the call is just 'Promenade', grab your own partner and get in order. But look out -- don't just assume that you'll be right. Maybe you ought to be out of order at that point. Maybe the caller has a tricky way of getting you back that he is planning to pull. At least, though, you'll have a better chance of being right than if you hadn't even tried.

One last warning -- if you are not sure you goofed, don't try to correct yourself just because the set-up looks screwy, like three women together, with one man. If you think you have done everything the caller said but the square looks perfectly impossible, don't worry.

The way things are today, you are probably exactly right. As long as you do just what the caller says, and not what you think he is going to say, you can't lose.

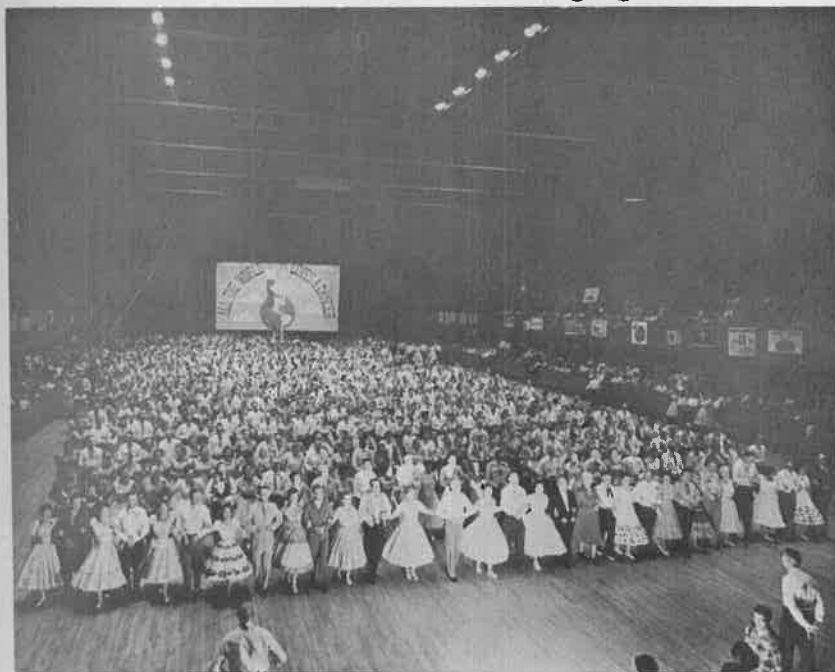
