THIS IS A COLUMN?

ASKS ED FERRARIO

Bob Barthol says he wrote it

Last month Madeline warned you she was going on her vacation, and intended to foist a guest columnist on you this year due to the anguished cries from her bereft and forsaken readers (Dan and Ed Ferrario) that resulted when she missed an article last year. In furtherance of their scheme, Madeline and Ed approached me and said they had been looking for an experienced square dancer and talented writer to take over Madeline's column this month while she was away. I blushed, dug my toe into the carpet, and told them I really didn't think I was that talented, and doubted if I could do nearly as good a job as Madeline. This they agreed to with insulting readiness, but explained that everyone who was qualified was too busy. I then pointed out that I was as smart as the next man, but inasmuch as the next man was Ed, I felt I hadn't proved anything. Anyway, I was promised one free month's extension on my delinquent Square Dance Where subscription if I wrote just one teensy-weensy article. So - I'm an author!

One of the points they stressed was that I could write anything I wanted, freedom of the press and all that. Madeline has utilized many acres of type in her battle to right wrongs, correct abuses, sell ideas, and generally better square dancing. Not all dancers - including the writer - always agreed with all her ideas, but on the other hand, most of us agreed with most of them. I will therefore continue in the Allen tradition of fearlessly riding forth to battle a wrong. Of course, this is my first article, and I don't want to over-match myself, so I'll choose a rather small wrong first.

I should like to attack a growing habit among a few dancers (usually male) that I think takes a lot of the "togetherness" out of dancing, and also consider not only impolite, but down-right insulting. This, in all honesty, is not confined to square dancing. As a matter of fact, it has been a real and growing problem in many fields, and has just recently been noticable in our circles. The symptoms of this habit are unmistakable - a vacant stare; unnerving changes of expression and mood ranging from excited shouts to sepulchral groans, from pure joy to abysmal despair that has no relationship to the activities around him; but it is always characterized by the complete withdrawal of the victims from his physical surroundings. This withdrawal I call "Transistor Trance".

I am, of course, referring to the guy who holds a little transistor radio against his ear at all times except when he is actually dancing, and listens to the baseball game, basketball game, football game or boxing match, thereby removing himself spiritually, if not physically, from the rest of us. This is undermining the very foundations of what made square dancing the tremendous, friendly recreation it is. This addict adds nothing to the group in conversation, laughter, interest, or friendship. As a matter of fact, (and this may surprise some of the transistor addicts) he breeds some resentment in the people who are trying to get up a square, a conversation, or a meeting.

The most sophisticated type has an inconspicuous wire leading to an earpiece, and is therefore a little less noticeable. This is even more disconcerting because you don't notice it while you are happily gabbling away - and then discover he hasn't heard a word. Several weeks ago I was talking to - or at - a square dancer between tips and didn't notice the sneaky little wire (he had big ears), and in the middle of my sentence he suddenly smiled broadly, surprising me, as I was seriously asking his opinion on something. He then announced, "The Giants hit a homer!!". In my old-fashioned way, I regarded this as pretty discourteous, like someone walking out of a square. I think transistor radios are mysterious and wonderful, and a tremendous technological triumph, but their place is not at a square dance. Right? Right!

I will admit I was very relieved to discover that some of my acquaintances I thought were showing signs of encroaching age by wearing hearing aids were merely mis-guided sports enthusiasts.

So there you have it. I am now a Controversial Figure! I have been published! I have probably also been retired as a columnist. But what can you expect from the inexperienced help you get these days?

Goodby now - remember to keep those letters and postcards coming!

THE FRESNO AREA BEGINNER CLASS REPORT *by Burt Garner*

An idea conceived by the Fresno Ass'n to promote a greater number of Beginners

Since I was asked to give a brief run down on what Fresno did this year, in way of handling Beginners Classes, and since this is low ebb of the season on club news I will attempt to give the above requested information at this time.

For one reason or another (opinions vary as to "why") Fresno found herself, this past fall, with fewer oncoming square dancers than at any time since '48 or '50. Regardless of the "why" it was self evident, by all who were really interested in the local situation, that something had to be done.

The simple, obvious solution of course was to get more beginners into the picture and to salvage or "re-interest" the previous drop outs and get them back into square dancing.

This was all easy to think and say but the question was "how" to go about doing it; in other words what type of a program should be set in motion and who should sponsor or be responsible for it?

It was finally brot' to the attention (officially) of all the clubs at a meeting of the Dancers Association. BRUCE STOTTS and DUANE WAMSLEY at this time, in plain English, painted the picture exactly as it was. BRUCE made several observations of past short comings and suggestions that should help a future program. Since he and DUANE were from the Callers' Association he assured the group that whatever action or program the Dancers Association decided upon he was sure the Callers Association would back them 100%. Usual discussion followed, terminated by Association President MON TELFORD appointing MAURICE WITT to head a "crash committee" with a green light, to get a beginners program in operation as soon as details could be worked out.

CLAY ADAMS, BURT GARNER, NATE HASKELL, GEO. POLLOCK and BETHEL THOMASON were chosen by MAURICE WITT to serve on the committee.

If any Committee ever worked hard on an assignment this one did and giving credit where credit is due MAURICE should be given that credit for all the extra time he put in. The program was worked out in detail to start the Monday following the Annual Squar-Rama in February.

From discussions, previous to the appointing of the committee it had been pointed out that the most successful Beginners Programs, in the past, were those that had been co-sponsored by the Dancers' Association in connection with the Fresno Recreational Department. Therefore when the committee met they first started mapping a program that would be co-sponsored with the Recreational Department. (Which meant not only prestige and confidence of those who later saw the advertising matter, but assured school halls for class, at a nominal fee, and made it possible to offer a 70¢ per couple registration fee.) Fortunately the Recreational Department agreed to the program. However, the committee had an initial schedule for a class on each night of the week, but schools weren't available for a couple of the nights.

The callers, as promised, went along 100% with the program. Several offered to call for free, if necessary, to get the program rolling but they were paid \$6.00 each class night, and two callers were assigned to each class. (WHITTS' biggest problem came when he couldn't use every night for a class. With the available nights and available callers it proved impossible to make a schedule where one particular caller wasn't left out. It looked like discrimination but instead it was "WHITTS' HEADACHE".) The committee decided upon a six weeks intensive advertising campaign to terminate the last day of the Squar-Rama with classes opening the following evening. This campaign was to include a paid daily ad. in the Fresno Bee (with picture of two square dancers) two columns wide by two deep to run for seven days. Spot ads on T.V. and Radio and the printing of 25,000 folded six page brochures. The latter to be distributed home by the children of the schools, of the districts where classes were to be held, distributed in the shopping areas (Super Markets, etc.) distributed to the spectators at the Squar-Rama and given to the clubs of the Association for distribution amongst their friends. The expenses of the above to start the program, were estimated at \$1,000. The money was raised by each club contributing \$50 plus a contribution from the Callers Association and the balance to be met by the Dancers Association.

Two members from each club on a staggered rotation basis were to serve as registrars and the program was to be for 26 weeks. During that period no one was to visit the classes with the intent of soliciting future club members. However, classes were informed of all local clubs - nights they danced - hall locations - name of club callers, etc. and upon graduation they could make their own choice. Furthermore hoedowns were planned for the last three weeks at which time all clubs who wanted new members were invited to act as hosts and solicit members as they saw fit. The only major change in the program was brot¹ about by Daylight Saving time and the onslaught of early hot weather, plus the reluctance of the schools to arrange halls for the summer months. The latter plus the drop in attendance, caused by Daylight Saving time and weather, made it necessary to graduate the classes sooner than was planned. (Next years classes will start in the fall and this will solve the time problem.) The "formal" graduation was held in Roeding Park at the first Association Dance of the summer, Sunday eve. June 26th.

Undoubtedly you are asking how many squares were involved, or new dancers were brot¹ into the activity. The answer is roughly 40. Don't ask if that wasn't, too, few for the amount of effort and money that was expended, because that is an intangible question. However, the committee was not satisfied with the number enrolled. Can any reason be given for the light enrollment? Yes, that's the sad part of it all. The program was hardly under way when a "bloop^{er}" was discovered. (But no way or time to correct it.) It was in the final wording of the 25,000 brochures that went out. They read in part that "square dancing was for the whole family and Square Dancers are of all ages". To you and me that makes sense, but we found to the general public it meant anything but an adult program. Kids of all ages appeared on the scene the first night (and were turned away) and later in the program adults (when classes had closed) were phoning every committee member asking if it weren't possible to yet enroll - saying "we just learned that the program was for adults".

The unnoticed "bloop^{er}" was apparently costly - and yet it may pay off later - who knows?
