This will serve to answer you doubting Thomases who said "It couldn't be done." I did it! I think.

The reader response to the transistor radio article was surprising. Apparently people DO read the Magazine! Besides having a number of subscriptions cancelled, Editor Ferrario was horse-whipped. If it hadn't been that the horse was rather old and Ed outweighed him, he could have been seriously hurt. I received two anonymous telephone threats, a short length of transistor ear-plug cord (tastefully shaped into a noose), and a personal visit from a giant Giant fan who suggested I eat my words. As a result, I can testify that Square Dance Where has a distinct oily flavor and gives me the hiccups.

And now let me answer Madeline's last column. First of all, I didn't want to start a feud - Madeline did. I am a lovable, quiet type who abhors violence. Some men are fighters, some are lovers; I'm a talker.

As to the question "is the Traveling Caller on the way out?" Which "scrapper" Allen says she wants to kick around. (Refer to her article in the September Issue, Page 4, Paragraph 4), let me start by saying that some of them are way out, and those I would like to kick around - around 14 inches above the back of their knees. Today's dancers are not breaking down the doors to attend the Traveling Callers Dances as they used to do years ago, for several obvious and understandable reasons. In the "Olden Days" (Hi, Scrapper!) there were few callers, and fewer yet adequate Callers, in any given area. The local caller did not have access to much new material, because there were no Dancers or Callers Associations or publications disseminating the new stuff as they now do, and there were no institutes or conventions furnishing the opportunity to callers to exchange ideas with one another. So, the Traveling Caller was a welcome change, a chance to hear a fresh approach and new material. Remember, Madeline, that the local callers were the ones most eager to attend these dances.

Also, a few years back, the Traveling Caller was a novelty. Now? Just check the last issue of Square Dance Where for advertised Traveling Caller dances. At a quick run thru, I find Arnie Kronenberger, (twice), Glen Story, Morris Sevada, Gary Norum (Canada), Harley

Smith, George Elliott, and Buzz Brown! Remember - this covers only one month, in one area and only those dances advertised in Square Dance Where! Where's the novelty? And we have local callers that are just as good who call those same nights.

Just in passing, I wonder how many of our local dancers are scared off from these Traveling Caller dances. Increasingly, when a "top" caller is brought into the area, the dance is limited to "top" dancers. Invitation is by word of mouth, with the direct statement, or at least the inference, that the average dancer could not handle his stuff, and would louse up the floor. This creates a feeling of inferiority in many, many dancers, who decide that they had better not subject themselves to embarrassment - and as a result stick to their own caller and a few Hoedowns given by clubs in which they have friends.

Now, as to my stepping into the ring with Madeline, let me say:

Her threats keep me tossing at nights
As she tries to involve me in fights
'Cause I'm beaten, I've found
Right into the ground
By just dancing to calls that she writes

Windsor Records conducts survey

September 2, 1960

Dear Round Dancing Friend:

As you know, we have been conducting a "poll" of R/D teachers and leaders on the use of Latin rhythms for round dancing. We are now able to report to you the results of this poll - and our analysis of the situation.

Questionnaires mailed out.....166
Replies received.....158

IN favor of Latins..... 92
NOT IN favor of Latins..... 66

The above tabulation indicates a clear majority IN FAVOR of Latin music for round dancing. However, we feel that there are factors other than mere numbers that must be considered in making a fair and perceptive analysis of this poll. Therefore, we have taken into consideration (1) the length of experience of each individual teacher that voted, (2) his, or her, prominence and prestige in the activity, (3) the number of dancers or students handled and (4) the "remarks" submitted on the return card or in the many fine letters received.

After weighing all of these factors, we come to the conclusion that:

- A. The majority of teachers do believe that the judicious use of Latin music for R/D-ing will not be harmful to the movement and will add variety and interest.
- B. At least to start with, routines should be fairly simple and composed so that they may be done with either round dance or Latin styling.
- C. R/D teachers should acquaint themselves with basic Latin steps and styling in order to properly teach such dances.
- D. Strict moderation in the release of records with Latin rounds must be observed by producers to avoid a harmful "flood" of material - and the music must be GOOD.
- E. For the time being, Latin rounds should be offered to "round dance dancers" and not, under ordinary circumstances, forced on square dancers.

In accordance with these conclusions, Windsor has decided to release an occasional Latin round dance with good music and relatively easy routines. Copies of this report are being sent to other record producers with the hope that they will benefit from and be guided by the tabulation and analysis herein.
