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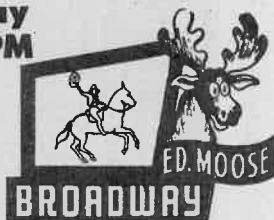

ROUND DANCE of the MONTH



Rainier Waltz

By Mary and Park Bagley, Seattle, Washington



RECORD: "Rainier Waltz" - Aqua 211
 POSITION: Open, facing LOD
 FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout. Directions given for M
 INTRO: 4 Meas: WAIT 2 Meas; then, ACKNOWLEDGE PARTNER,
 BALANCE AWAY; BALANCE TOGETHER (Balance done with step-touch);

MEASURES

1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY; LADY ROLL ACROSS TO VARS POS; WALTZ FWD; TURN L (face RLOD);

Starting M's L and in OPEN POS facing LOD do 1 fwd waltz slightly away from partner; M waltzes across LOD twd wall as W makes 1 LF roll XIF of M twd COH to end in VARS POS facing LOD with 3 steps LRL (Hand change, W's R to M's R. is necessary on 2nd ct of Meas 2 - W is now on inside of circle); Do 1 fwd waltz LOD; Still prog LOD and retaining handholds, each makes 1/2 LF turn in three steps to end facing RLOD, still in Vars Pos with Won inside.

5 - 8 WALTZ BWD; TURN TO BUTTERFLY; TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN TO OPEN POS;

Waltz bwd LOD; Release L hands and then R hands as M wheels 1/2 RF to face LOD and W steps back on L in LOD to make 1 full RF turn to face RLOD (each use three steps and on 3rd ct prepare to proceed to BUTTERFLY-SIDECAR POS); In Butterfly-sidecar Pos, twinkle diag twd wall (M XIF - W XIB); M XRIF (W XLIB) on 1st ct of meas 8, M steps L diag twd COH and closes R to L (W steps R to side along LOD, closes L to R) to end in OPEN POS facing LOD.

9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8, ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS, FACING LOD.

17 - 20 STEP, SWING, HOLD; FWD, SIDE, BEHIND; ROLL ON, 2, 3; WALTZ FWD;

Step L fwd, swing R fwd, hold; Step R fwd, step L swd along LOD turning to face partner and release M's R & W's L to open to face RLOD momentarily as XRIB (W XLIB); Pull lead hands thru and release to make full 1 1/2 solo turn in 3 steps, M turn LF (W RF) keeping prog LOD; Assume SEMI-CLOSED POS and prog LOD with 1 fwd waltz.

21 - 24 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-20, ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS, FACING LOD.

25 - 28 SLIDE AWAY; LADY IN FRONT; WALTZ BWD; WALTZ FWD (TO SIDECAR);

Waltz fwd LOD as W "slides" from semi-closed pos to OPEN POS with Inside hands joined (W should travel diag fwd twd wall using 3 steps instead of waltz step; however, M does waltz step); M steps RLR in place and adjusts to W's pos as W again takes 3 steps to sweep 1/2 LF to end directly in front of M and partners assume CLOSED POS; Do 1 bwd waltz directly RLOD; Do 1 fwd waltz LOD maneuvering to SIDECAR POS on 3rd ct.

29 - 32 TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN (TO CLOSED POS); PIVOT, 2, 3; STEP, TOUCH, -;

In sidecar pos twinkle diag fwd and twd wall, M XIF (W XIB); Twinkle in and on 3rd ct assume CLOSED POS M facing wall; Do 3-step couple-pivot making 3/4 turn; Quickly assume SEMI-CLOSED POS and step R fwd LOD, touch L beside R, hold.

DANCE IS DONE THREE COMPLETE TIMES. 3rd time thru on Meas 32, step thru on R, join inside hands and step away on L, B & C.

NOTE: Keep dance flowing LOD at all times unless otherwise indicated

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TRAVELLING CALLERS

--Yes And No

Last month my "worthy opponent" actually picked up and tossed around one of the various gauntlets I let fall, and in the course of his argument he made a crack about the "average dancer" not being able to handle the high-level calling of the many Travelling Callers now being brought into this area. Speak for yourself, Bob -- what makes you think you are "average"? Maybe you're not dancing enough these days.

First, a little quibble -- who is a Travelling Caller, anyhow? How far does he have to travel? Bob lists eight Callers last month from Los Angeles or farther -- naturally, when I looked this month I could not find a single one. Do you count Fresno and Sacramento? Or Santa Rosa? And are you going to lump the week-end travellers who practically commute from Los Angeles, with the full-time professional Callers who make one Tour a year? My own feeling is that the good old Law of Supply and Demand will take care of those Callers who carelessly accept too many dates too close together in the same area. My only fear is that the reaction will include the once-a-year type who really are different, and who really have something special to offer.

Going back to dancing ability -- I wonder if people in Northern California realize just how unique our dance program is? I don't know anywhere else in the country where the Clubs dance every week, and also sponsor a Saturday Hoedown once a month or once a quarter, and where the great majority of dancers dance at their own Club and then dance somewhere every Saturday night as well. In Southern California, and in most other areas, Clubs dance only twice a month, and whereas many dancers belong to two or more Clubs, there are also plenty who dance at one Club and nowhere else. This system of ours has naturally produced great numbers of dancers who dance more often than the National average and who are therefore sharper dancers -- or so my friends among the Travelling Callers tell me. (How many times a month do you dance now, Bob?) Our average dancer can certainly handle any Caller from anywhere in the country if he wants to. The real problem is, does he want to?

One custom that has developed out of our once-a-week dance night has been the system of having a Guest Caller for the Club's Hoedown, because it would take a very unusual Caller to be able to call every week for a Club and then give them anything extra once a month on Party Night. (That's why the Mill Wheelers still dance only twice a month -- Jim York refused to call any oftener for the same people, because he said they would get tired of him.) At first there was a sort of exchange of Callers between Clubs, but it soon developed that although each Club considers its own Caller the best in the world, the members get more choosy about Guest Callers, and there is now a very brisk competition for those local Callers generally considered to be 'Tops'. Anyone who has been Program Chairman for a Club knows that you have to book your Callers at least a year ahead to get the ones you want, or your dancers want, and even then you have to make compromises when you can't get your choice. Maybe it is frustration that has led so many Clubs to go outside the Bay Area to find Guest Callers for special dances. Now that some of the novelty has worn off, the disadvantages, like cost, begin to be apparent.

Another result of the monthly Hoedown system has been the growing efforts of some Clubs to put on a "Big Dance" and make enough money to carry the expenses of a too-small Club. This makes for competition among Clubs choosing the same Saturday nights, and has resulted in a number of questionable practices, all the way from importing too-expensive Name Callers to knocking themselves out to attract customers by providing fried chicken and door prizes. The simple and friendly reason for the Saturday night dances -- the exchange of hospitality between friends in different Clubs -- has been overlooked in the rush to sell tickets to as many people as possible, whether or not you want to dance with them, just to make more money, and even at the risk of overcrowding the hall. And Guest Callers are often chosen, not because the members want to dance to them, but because they will either bring a lot of people with them or "draw a crowd". To the extent that Travelling Callers are brought into the area to try to make a killing for the Club, I agree with Bob (what did he say?)

As to that "word of mouth" bit - well, that's the way I think the really special dances ought to be promoted. If Travelling Callers are not to be hired just to bring out a big crowd and make a lot of money, how do I think they should be hired? Well, in most Clubs there are a few dancers who like to travel themselves, and who become what you might call "Connoisseurs of Calling". They attend Festivals and Institutes and Square Dance Camps, and they hear a lot of Callers; and occasionally they hear one they like so well that they want their Club to hear him too. So they make the arrangements and set the date, and then the members try to sell enough tickets outside the Club to pay the extra expense of having a Caller from a distance. But unlike the money-grabbers, they don't want to sell the tickets to just anybody. No matter what Bob says, they aren't trying to get "high-level" dancers, either. They are simply trying to get dancers who will appreciate what they are being offered. Lots of Callers who are interesting to me, for instance, would only get the Bird from dancers who want all Callers to sound like their own Club Caller only better. It's just as if I were planning to spend all day making an East India Curry, and wanting to invite a few friends to share it. I certainly am not going to invite anyone who prefers steak and insists on saying so, nor do I want anyone who does not care what he eats. I want either friends who know they like Curry, or else those whose attitude is that they will try anything once. For a steady diet, I'd probably rather have Steak myself, but both in Food and in Calling I do love variety, and I hope there will never come a time when all the Callers we ever hear sound exactly alike, even if they are all perfect.

Bob did say one thing with which I can agree One Hundred Percent. I did enjoy my vacation from writing a Column every month -- after all, I have been doing it for over five years and I've said everything I have to say at least twice. So how about just taking over, Bob? Then you won't have to fight with anyone - you can just run on each month in your own lovely, easy-going way, until you've said all you have to say, too. Good luck!

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

Re Author Bob Barthol (Square Dance -- Where? , August, 1960), may I become Controversial Figure II and to his list of "Transistor Trance" add "Non Square Dance"?

I agree fully, let us not mix my beloved Giants with my beloved square dancing; and let's not mix round dancing with square dancing either. For many years I have driven many miles to attend square dances, only to encounter half the evening devoted to rounds until, now, my only contact with square dancing is reading about it in Square Dance -- Where? . It makes as much sense to add flamenco, ballet, and rain dancing (as well as a ball game) to the program. Devotees of various forms of dancing attend square dances, so why only round dancing for diversion (or intrusion)?

In the old days of amateur callers with untrained voices it was not unreasonable to provide some form of entertainment while those consecrated individuals rested their voices; but in these days of professional callers it is not unreasonable to expect and require that an entire evening of squares be provided, as any professional singer, musician, or speaker is required to do. Round dancing has come of age and should stand on its own, without reluctant support from its ancestor. Indeed, a dance advertised as a square dance and composed of two squares alternating with two rounds constitutes a misrepresentation.

Square dancing should no longer be diluted with round dances, but should remain its own distinctive self; with selective concentration by those who love it to develop more fully than ever before.

I beg that square dancers be given back their original love, namely square dancing.
