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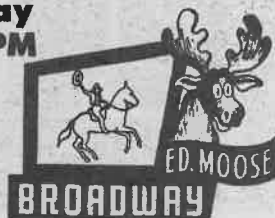

Did anyone get the number of that truck? In case you didn't read Madeline's last article, she sang her swan song - and bequeathed her column to me - each and every month. I quote from her last line ".....you can just run on each month in your own lovable, easy-going way, until you've said all you have to say, too. Good Luck!" I have been had. My mother didn't raise me to be a columnist. I am even considering taking the non-columnist oath. (Puns like that we shouldn't even print in the letters to the editors column. Ed. note.) I really haven't much to say - even if it takes me a page and a half not to say it. But rather than leave old, easy-going, lovable old Ed Ferrario with a blank page, I'll write another great contribution to American Literature.

To start, I can finally have the last word on our controversy re the traveling caller. Madeline has rebutted by rebuttal by claiming that the high frequency dancer is "average" and pointing out that maybe I don't dance enough any more, and says, "what makes you think you are 'average' Bob?" I maintain Madeline is not an average dancer - not many dancers anywhere dance as often as she does. I think I speak from the standpoint of the average dancer - like me, I hope.

I can think of something I'd like to say, now that the typewriter is warmed up. I would like to expound on another old problem that is beginning to rear its ugly little head again in the area, namely, rough dancing. This is a steady battle that has been going on ever since square dancing graduated from the stomp'em up 'barn dances' with the liquor, fights, and general "carrying on" that was part of the activity. Perhaps the biggest step forward was the elimination of the drinking during square dancing - which automatically eliminated most of the trouble. One of the most important additional steps was the advent of "styling", which is merely the standardization of the varying movements so they are done in the same way in each area, (and preferably the same way in all areas) and the smoothing out of the movements to eliminate roughness.

Now come the standard screams of indignation and scorn: "We enjoy high-kicking", (or back-lashing, or multiple twirling or back flips) "Whadda ya wanna do - take all the fun out of it?" Nope - quite the contrary. Styling is designed to keep the fun in it for far and away the majority of all square dancers. Take a look around, and you will notice that it is a very small minority of the dancers who are kicking, twirling, bounding around on their knees, etc. There are very practical reasons for this. In the first place, an expert, in any field you can think of, does his specialty, whatever it is, smoothly and without interfering with his teammates. He never makes showy movements that will interfere with the necessary rhythm of his activity. The Western Gunman who twirled his revolver prior to shooting, or between shots, was very briefly mourned by his fellows. He looked good, but you had to look quick - he didn't stay around long. The halfback racing down the field to a certain touchdown who feels an almost unendurable exuberance and gives vent to it by balancing back and giving a high kick, shortly thereafter approximates the feeling - and possibly the appearance of chopped liver, and incidentally, lives forever in the memory of his teammates. The same timing is necessary in square dancing - the whirls and kicks usually serve to louse up the timing, thus spoiling the easy flow and rhythm of the dance that is the primary source of satisfaction and enjoyment we get from dancing.

Does this mean we can't ever cut up and do all the odd-ball things most good dancers do at all times? Perish the thought! In your own club, with your own friends, have at it, if the spirit moves you. But don't inflict it on others at a hoedown, particularly on a crowded floor, or with unwarned visitors. As I mentioned earlier, this problem has been growing in the area, but it was brought home forcibly on October 29th, when dancers of the Northern California Square Dancers Association were asked to put on an unrehearsed exhibition at the Alameda Naval Air Station at their 20th Anniversary celebration and open house. Ye Editor, Ed Ferrario, called and we danced. All was well, and the untrained public was given a look at our recreation in all its trappings and grace. But - two or three couples proceeded to display to

the interested onlookers the high kicks and multiple whirls and fancy extras that are sometimes depicted on a TV commercial, but are certainly not representative of square dancing in this area.

One reason we were happy to put on the exhibition was to interest some of the non-dancing onlookers and maybe get a few recruits for beginners' classes. I wonder, what was the reaction of an average, non-acrobatic couple in the usual age bracket of our recruits when they saw the fancy stuff. The probable reaction was that it sure looks like fun for kids or professional dancers, but it's too complicated and energetic for us married folk.

As for me, I cut up on occasion (sometimes when I make a real wowser of a mistake, I gayly pretend I was horsing around. This, to date, has fooled nobody but me, but I try.) But I enjoy smooth dancing, and firmly believe that for once, I am with the majority.

Okay, Ed, here is your column. May I solicit from your literate, articulate, and intelligent readers (huh? Ed. note) letters, pro and con, or suggestions (Drop Dead! will not be considered) ideas, comments, challenges, (verbal, not physical) or what have you. I'd like to find out: A) Does anybody actually read this stuff; B) Does anybody care; and C) What other areas not already covered are important or controversial enough to merit more highly opinionated articles. JUST TO REMIND US....

Square dancing is a social recreational force, which like a rolling snowball, has gained size and momentum very rapidly in the past decade. It is an activity that brings people together for fun, food, and sociability; however, present day dancers do-si-do and sashay around without knowing too much about the origin of the dances.

Actually the square dance developed chiefly during the 19th century accompanying country festivals, such as the completion of a new barn or at a corn husking bee, etc.

Calls accompanying the Western square dance were never written down, but were transmitted from caller to caller via the oral route. Where the original calls came from one can only surmise. They were, most likely handed down from father to son, and passed from community, to community spreading without record. Usually something was lost or omitted from the original call until some caller came along who liked to keep up a continuous patter of words and phrases; the omission would be filled in with something new of his own, and another variety of call was created. These country folk were sometimes very jealous about their special kind of talent and were very secretive about divulging their knowledge.

It is believed that the main sources of the possible origin of Western square dances were the New England Quadrille and the Kentucky Running Set. Also, perhaps the Mexicans contributed something in the way of steps, but their dances were usually not "called". It is also supposed that some of the figures of the Western dance were borrowed directly from old European folk dances, as the New England Quadrille was an adaptation of a European dance, with France being credited with the origin of this form, although dances done by four couples arranged in a square figure with a couple on each side of the square are found in the peasant dances of nearly all European countries. One of the differences between the Western square and the Quadrille was in the numbering of the couples.

Another difference was evidenced in the music and the steps themselves, as music for the Quadrille was precise and measured, and the dancing was done to that tempo. It was impossible for people in the West to do a measured and precise Quadrille. Distances were so great and there was such a variety of different classes of people, they needed something simple in pattern that could be learned quickly. In this manner a true Western dance was developed from the New England square formation with the change from a "prompter" to a "caller" directing the dance.

In the mountains of Kentucky and throughout the southern Appalachians an old form of dance called the "Running Set" is still danced, and the figures that are executed between couple and couple in this dance are identical to some Western figures.

Square dancing today is somewhat uniform all over the country, but every area features little differences that seem to grow up in the evolution of the activity. For instance, the position for a promenade, the hold for a swing, the type of right and left thru, etc., have some differences that point to the area in which they are done. Devotees of this type of dancing, however, feel that there is no such thing as a right or wrong way in square dancing, (as long as it's comfortable).

Callers spend a great deal of time learning their "art" and there are many callers' workshops held every year throughout the country, where ambitious individuals go to acquire knowledge in perfecting the two types of calls, patter and singing. The "big name" callers are much in demand and travel all over the United States and parts of Canada, sometimes as much as 70,000 miles in one year. Some also direct the choreography of square dances in western pictures. Some call to "live" music, but the majority "patter" to records, which have a pronounced downbeat featuring plenty of bass.

Dance workshops are also held in conjunction with those of the callers, where dances, which are the most popular throughout the immediate area, are learned and reviewed.

Another form of dancing learned in the workshops, which is used as a "filler" between square dance "tips", is round dancing, a couple dance as in modern ballroom dance. Our grandmothers' couple dances were always special dances, such as the polka, the schottische, var-souvianna, or mazurka, while the round dance of today is usually a one-step, two-step, or fox trot.

Many sidelines have developed from the advent of square dancing, including the publication of several interesting magazines, which give "area" news regarding dancers, instructions for new dances, and other items of interest. Record companies are hard pressed to keep up with the new "hoe-downs", and public address manufacturers are continually improving on their sound equipment.

Every year most clubs hold an annual square dance festival in their area, in addition to a national festival, which at one particular festival, "Allemande left with your left hand" was a familiar call to approximately 20,000 dancers from all parts of the country including Hawaii.

In conjunction with the festivals, fashion shows featuring the latest in square dance styles are often presented.

The usual costume for square dancers is known as Western, which was developed years ago from styles worn by Spanish and American pioneers in the early settlement of the southwest. The men often choose "frontier pants", western shirts with long sleeves, string or bow ties, and boots. The boots provide support for the men's feet in the sometimes strenuous dances. The women, of course, exhibit more variety in their outfits. The dress, to be comfortable for square dancing, must have a wide skirt, often reaching from six to twelve yards around the hem. Under this is worn bouffant petticoats to add swish and swirl to make the dancing fun to do as well as to watch. Pantalettes are also worn under the wide skirts, which usually match the skirt, altho some are in bright contrast. The bodice of the women's dress is often fitted, with the sleeves short and puffed, while the neckline is a wide V or curve. Women's shoes are always low-heeled. Many prefer the ballet type with ribbon ties about the ankles, while a "Mary Jane" type of shoe with a strap to hold the shoe in place is also favored. Couples usually have dress and shirt in matching fabrics.
