WHITE DOVE WALTZ

By Orie Rouland, Detroit, Michigan

RECORD: "White Dove Waltz" - Grenn 14024
 POSITION: Open-facing, M's bk twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined
 FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions given for M
 INTRO: (4 meas) WAIT 2 Meas; then, BAL APART (acknowledge); BAL TOGETHER;
 MEASURES DANCE

1 - 4 WALTZ OUT, 2, 3; TWINKLE, 2, 3; TWINKLE, 2, 3; STEP THROUGH, TOUCH,
-(to Butterfly);

Starting M's L waltz fwd in LOD moving slightly apart while swinging joined hands fwd; Step diag fwd on R while turning into temporary BUTTERFLY POS (arms well extended), step L swd along LOD (release M's R & W's L as you turn to face RLOD), close R to L; Step L XIF of R in RLOD, step R swd along RLOD momentarily touching both hands in BUTTERFLY POS (releasing M's L & W's R as you turn to face LOD), close L to R; Step thru on R XIF of L in LOD turning to face ptr in BUTTERFLY POS, touch L to R, hold.

5 - 8 BAL APART, TOUCH, -; BAL TO BANJO; 1/2 AROUND, 2, 3; W UNDER, 2,
OPEN;

Step L bwd twd COH (both hands joined), touch R, hold; Step R fwd into BUTTERFLY BANJO (R hips adjacent), touch L, hold; Banjo around L, R, L; Release M's L & W's R hands both moving down LOD in OPEN POS.

9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS. 1-8

17 - 20 WALTZ OUT, 2, 3; WALTZ IN, 2, 3; TURN (BK-TO-BK), TOUCH, -; SIDE,
TOUCH, -;

Waltz fwd (as in Meas 1); Waltz fwd moving slightly together while swinging joined hands bwd; Step diag fwd on L in LOD to back-to-back pos while swinging joined hands fwd, touch R to L, hold; With joined hands extended at shoulder height step R swd along LOD, touch L to R, hold.

21 - 24 BWD/TURN, TO, FACE; SIDE, DRAW, -; DIP IN, -, -; MANUV WALTZ, 2, 3;

Step bwd in RLOD turning twd ptr L, R, L while swinging joined hands bwd; Take CLOSED POS and step R swd along RLOD, draw L to R, hold; Dip bwd on L twd COH, hold for 2 cts; Step R fwd and maneuver waltz to end with M facing RLOD.

25 - 28 WALTZ (R), 2, 3; WALTZ, 2, 3; DIP IN, -, -; MANUV WALTZ, 2, 3;

Do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD (3/4 turn) to end with M's back twd COH; Repeat action of Meas. 23-24.

29 - 32 WALTZ (R), 2, 3; WALTZ, 2, 3; WALTZ, 2, 3; TWIRL, 2, 3 (to OPEN);

Do 3 RF turning waltzes down LOD (1 1/2 turns); M waltzes fwd as W twirls RF under her R & M's L hands to OPEN POS ready to repeat dance.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES, ENDING WITH TAG

TAG: As music retards, step L fwd while swinging joined hands fwd, touch R to L, hold; M steps R bwd to face ptr and steps L, R in place as W does a slow reverse twirl L, R, L under joined hands which are swung bwd and upward; Step L bwd twd COH & bow.

YOU KNOW WHO???

The subject of badges has been discussed from square dance time immemorial by everyone who can talk, write, or point. Too many badges, the wrong kinds of badges, too big, too little, too heavy, too cute, undignified, juvenile, and so on. I can hardly let such a popular subject get by without waltzing it once around the floor myself. Although it can be approached from numerous angles, my main point is a plea for the older, nearsighted, dancer with the failing memory who needs a badge to look at or else call everybody "Doc" or "Mac". In my own case, I rarely forget a face or a name. Almost every time I meet my mother, father, wife, or children, I can call them by name without any trouble. Practically total recall.

I'm speaking of name badges of some kind, whether the name be on a club badge or separate. There is big psychological difference in our attitude toward a person when we know his name, and the more names we know in a group, the friendlier we feel, and the more we feel a sense of belonging. But let's face it: in square dancing, we meet people in great globs at each dance, so that literally hundreds of faces become familiar to each one of us. Names? In the first place, we don't often introduce ourselves by name in a square, but merely enjoy one another during the tip, smile our thanks, and meet another two or three couples during the next tip. Multiply this by the number of tips at a dance and the number of dances we have attended over the years, and even allowing for the fact that the majority are repeaters, we have "met" an awful lot of people that we have not really met. When we have a chance to talk to them at a later date, it is customary and unembarrassing to ask their names or deliberately look at their name badges at the start of the chat. But I'm talking about meeting people we've talked to before, where their names are a complete blank, and it becomes embarrassing and vaguely insulting not to call them by name. It is fascinating to watch two dancers greeting each other while each is staring at the other's badge, because it takes some practice to keep your eye on the badge and still grasp the other guy's outstretched hand on the first try. I have developed certain sneaky maneuvers in this regard. When I want to greet somebody I try to sidle closer and read the badge at a distance before he is aware of my presence, and then greet him by name in a loud hearty voice, thus gaining points. This has sometimes been disastrous, as when I've called him "Daisy", only to find I've read the wrong line on his badge and he turns out to be Alas Strongheart of the Daisy Chains. Another gambit is to start the conversation and hope

to sneak a look at his badge along the way, then after using his name with complete abandon as though you knew it all the time. It is sometimes possible to distract him by calling attention to something across the hall, and then grabbing your peek while his head is turned. Showing great concern about a speck on his badge and wiping it off accomplishes the purpose occasionally, but tends to wear out your sleeve. I've even remarked on what a clever badge he wears and bend forward for a look. This makes him wonder about my mental capacity if he is wearing a plain black and white plastic badge - But at least I know his name.

What kind of badge should we wear? Any kind at all, providing the name is visible at a reasonable distance. The larger the badge, the larger the name can be. I personally prefer one about the size of a large pizza, which can also be used as an auxiliary plate for potlucks. If your club name, personal name, city, and a brief Biography are all contained on one badge, the name is hard to find and the letters are small. Also, yellow letters on a chartreuse background is esthetically pleasing but makes for low legibility beyond 18 inches.

Where do you wear them? Preferably high on the chest. Placement about belt level leaves one looking like the hunchback of Notre Dame at the end of the evening. I have a special gripe against those gals who pin them on the lower hem of their dresses. My only hope is to pretend to drop something and get scrabbling around on the floor in hopes of glimpsing the name. Jane usually figures I am ogling her ankles more than her name badge, and manages to carelessly step on my hand.

Practically speaking, I know no one is going to scrap their present club badges because the names aren't legible as they might be, but at least keep these points in mind if you decide to re-design your badge, and pass the information on to new clubs being formed. One other point that will get you a mental vote of appreciation from guys like me - when you are talking to someone and he doesn't seem to know your name, get him off the hook by positioning yourself so the name is visible, and then look away so he can read it. He'll feel better and so will you. I wish there was a law requiring everyone to wear a name badge at all times, not only for the above reasons, but because it would take care of a common major embarrassment. Have you ever tried to introduce two people to each other, when both are close friends of yours - and your mind becomes a complete blank? Names you know as well as your own become impossible to remember, and you probably could

en come up with your own without reference to
your driver's license at that time. I've been in that
position many times, and would have paid a pretty
price for a name badge to assist me. Even that old
hand-er, ED Whatsizname who runs this maga-
zine, agrees with me on this. I'll fight 'til I get
my name badge, or my name isn't -uh -oh, you know
what I mean!
