"ya gotta have hands" **by Bob Barthol**

Altho you are reading this in the February issue, the brutal and selfish deadline schedule set by scrooge Ferrario forces me to write it on the New Year week-end, so I am torn between writing a brutal and selfish, or an inspirational, Christmasy - spirit article. So I'll compromise and set off some trivia.

One of the advantages of writing a column is that I can express my pet opinions without setting a lot of back-talk, (providing I write my stuff while locked in a clothes closet so my wife can't offer literary (?) criticism). Without a column, I had to corner some luckless dancers; many of whom can out-run me, and try to get my points across, and some of my victims are so thoughtless that they actually argue and try to prove me wrong. I usually burst into tears and stamp off the floor. I have found that I can get in a few licks by arguing my points in a square, and with this tricky maneuver can get them seven at a time. I can also cover a lot of people during a dance, because, for some reason, I rarely see the same faces in the next tip. With a column, all this has changed. The only back-talk comes by mail, and by moving occasionally without leaving a forwarding address, I can handle this problem easily. So herewith my opinions for this month.

There are certain area, club, and personal idiosyncrasies in our dancing, and I would like to comment on, and object to, a few. Next time you are engaged in that complicated basic, the grand right and left, note the various and varied approaches of your oncoming dancer. The most variation is in the hand contact, and most methods are satisfactory to all concerned. Some, however, are a little disconcerting and irk me. One, fairly rare, is the gal who glides around the circle and removes her hand just before contact is made, leaving me grasping futilely at thin air. (Ever heard of anyone grasping at thick air?) I sometimes handle this by making a two-handed lunge at her after the third or fourth time. This method is questionable, because it leaves me in a silly position, standing there grasping her tiny wrist in my paws and effectively tying up the square. Muttered epithets like "Bully!" etc. coming from the rest of the set are not uncommon in this situation. A more common peculiarity is the gal who reaches out her hand but tucks her thumb into her palm. The thumb is usually used as a stop and guide in a handshake position, and I miss it if it isn't there. If we are moving fairly fast, my hand usually slides half-way up her forearm. I always get the feeling that she dreads physical contact with me.

The hand-squeezer is another type that merits mention, and this is not confined to the male sex alone. I remember my first experience with this as a new dancer, before I realized that it is fairly common. Rolling around the circle, I met a pretty little gal who, when I grasped her hand, gave me a distinct squeeze. Inasmuch as this was the most encouragement I had had in years, it shook me to my boots, causing me to stumble and blush prettily. The next time around it happened again, and my passions almost overwhelmed me, so that after the tip, I sidled up to my love (I can take a hint!) after mumbling some excuse to my wife about going after a cold drink. Inasmuch as the girl's partner was already in attendance, and my eyes were on a level with the lower line on his club badge, my ardor cooled immediately, and I engaged in small-talk in my manly - and cowardly - way. On the gal's side, the poor little taw caught in a square of four dedicated male hand-squeezers will end up with numb hands and enlarged knuckles. With some dancers, this hand-squeezing is a compulsive and unconscious gesture, but with others I suspect it to be a safe, invisible, and antiseptic form of flirting.

A more advanced form of this is the waist-squeezer in a star promenade. The same rules apply, but due to the longer (and I must admit, much more satisfactory contact) far fewer have the courage to engage in the game, as the recipient has time to react, for or against. I only try this on girls with small, and preferably elderly, escorts.

Another maddening habit, indulged in, for obvious reasons, only by female-type dancers, is the one where the girl whips into an unexpected swirl at the conclusion of an allemande left when I am unsuspectingly advancing into the grand right and left. This changes the timing, so I have to slam on the brakes, mark time until she finishes her lovely pirouette, while the other males are piling up behind me, and then start all over again. I have found a

fairly effective counter to this is for me to pirouette also, which causes some consternation to the girl. I suppose it is a rather frightening sight for her to come out of her twirl in time to see my 180 pounds of twinkle-toed manhood reeling with elephantine grace in her direction, and normally results in her taking a more cautious approach in the future. In a particularly stubborn case, against a double-twirler. I, too, tried a double twirl. The double-twirl had the effect of a couple of double-martinis (a form of intoxicating cocktail that I have heard about from some of the older boys) so that I had trouble locating the square, let alone the girl. I now handle the double-twirler by merely sneaking by her to the next girl, leaving her somewhat perplexed, although not necessarily displeased, by my absence.

I guess that's enuf for this time. I hate to criticize other people like this, but somebody has to, and having no faults, peculiarities, or bad habits myself, who is better fitted?

Forty-five clubs were represented at the General Delegate meeting of the N. C. S. D. A. held in Alameda on December 18. President Max Harn opened the meeting by announcing the Directors of District #2, Jim & Genene Hill of the Dudes and Dolls, had resigned their office due to the expected arrival of another square dancer in their family (officer material Genene?). Replacing the Hills will be Bill & Peg Gillespie of the Boompie Daisies. This makes two "Bill & Peg" couples on the Board, but we are sure Bob Barthol can go through his files and come up with a suitable nickname for one pair (did you see that cute Christmas Greeting picture of Bob in the December issue?)

As Faye and I go dancing at various Hoedowns we can't help but notice that the Delegates are wearing their new Delegate Badges. This is good - be proud of the fact that you are one of a group that is working FOR square dancing. To those Delegates who have not received their badges they are waiting for you at the next General Delegate meeting.

Harn announced and Barthol described the functions of a newly organized permanent committee to be known as the Club Service Committee. According to Bob this Committee stands ready to assist any club in whatever difficulty they might encounter. It will act as a mediator and already results have been obtained in their first "case"-satisfaction for all concerned. Just another service of the Association, take advantage of it if your club needs help.

A second new service being offered, and we think it is a big one, is a free Liability and Property Damage Insurance Policy. The Board feels there has been a long time need for some form of insurance that would provide protection for Square Dance Clubs. We were fortunate in coming up with a policy that provides protection at a premium the Association can absorb. The only requirements for participation in this service is that the club be a member in good standing and that necessary information be furnished the Secretary. The coverage includes \$100,000 and \$300,000 Liability; \$5,000 and \$25,000 Property Damage and full coverage for Products (this covers food poisoning from foods served) and went into effect January 1, 1961. Your Club will be covered at all Club sponsored activities including Hoedowns with one exception. The policy does not cover Hoedowns advertised as money making dances, such as benefits, etc. Remember, get your annual dues in to the Treasurer so that your Club will be in good standing.

Harn got the Golden State Roundup (coming up the third weekend in May) off to a good start by announcing to the Delegates the appointment of John Strong as Program Chairman. This popular caller, who incidentally can spell, announced the main event callers. They will be JERRY HELT of Cincinnati, Ohio; HAROLD BAUSCH of Lie, Nebraska; DICK ENDERLEE of Parkville, Missouri and BOB DAWSON of Sarasota, Florida. Joe & Es Turner of Bethesda, Maryland will be the Round Dance Team. More on the Roundup next time.

Veep Norton displayed the new decals and announced that member Clubs could have them with their own Club name if they so desire and are willing to pay just a little extra. Contact him for further information.

Hope you enjoyed yourselves at the Big Tenth Anniversary Dance. Where can you find better callers than we have in our own back yard. Congratulations and thanks to each of you; Lee Helse!, Jim Mork, Bob Page, Johnny Barbour, John Strong, Bill Castner, Jack Logan and Bill Theede. Also how about the fine job turned in by M.C. Jim Knudson of the Dancers Workshop? Thanks Jim.

Richmond Auditorium is the place and Hall Manager, Norton asks that all dancers be informed that the sound WILL be improved. LETTER TO THE EDITOR...

Dear Ed:

Let's forget the twirling, spinning, kneeling and backslapping, and talk about callers. Time and time again I have heard, "Gee so and so would be a great caller if only he would slow down a bit and give us a chance to catch up with him."

I go to dances for three reasons, (1) I like to dance, (2) I like people, and (3) I like to have fun. All the fun goes out the window when a caller gets so carried away with trying to see how fast he can call, he loses the floor completely.

After one of these wild men finish a tip you are ready for the old rockin' chair. I feel and I know others do also, that his calls must flow smoothly, without getting so far ahead of the dancers they have trouble remembering what he has said. He should give the dancers enough time to complete the movement called, but not so much time they are standing waiting for the next call.

What I am asking is, why, at 40% of the dances you attend the caller is 2 & 3 movements, not beats, ahead of you. What happens is you forget about the rhythm and timing, and begin running to keep somewhere even with the guy. And there goes the fun of square dancing.

Some time ago we attended an out-of-town headman, for what we thought would be an afternoon and evening of enjoyable square dancing. The afternoon session was wonderful with all dancers having fun. The caller had a nice change of pace, some fast, some a little slower, but never a tip in which you had to run to stay even.

That night however, it was different, 60% of the floor was stopped tip after tip, for one reason only, the dancers could not keep up with the caller. That is not square dancing, that is race-horsing, and race-horsing is for the birds!
