ROUND DANCE OF THE MONTH

Hey, Mr. Guitar



By Manning and Nita Smith, College Station, Texas

RECORD: "Hey, Mr. Guitar" - Grenn 14001

POSITION: Facing, M's back to COH, both hands joined

FOOTWORK: Opposite; steps described are for the M

INTRO: Usual Acknowledgement

MEASURES

1 - 4 SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, BRUSH/TURN; BACKUP, 2; 3, TOUCH;

Step L to side along LOD, step R behind L; Step L to side, face LOD and Brush R starting to turn away from partner (M LF & W RF) and releasing joined hands to end facing RLOD M's L & W's R hands joined; Step bwd 3 steps in LOD R, L; R, touch L toe beside R.

5 - 8 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; ARC TWO-STEP; TO OPEN TWO-STEP;

Facing RLOD do 4 fwd two-steps, moving slightly apart on the 3rd two-step; continuing the arc and turning in to face LOD on the 4th two-step, releasing joined M's L & W's R hands and rejoining M's R & W's L hands. End in OPEN POS facing LOD.

9 - 12 FWD, 2; 3, SWING; BACKUP, 2; 3, TOUCH;

Step fwd in LOD L, R; L, swing R fwd; Still facing LOD back up R, L; R, and touch L toe beside R turning to face partner and wall and assuming CLOSED POS.

13 - 16 TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN (TO SIDECAR);

Do 4 turning two-steps progressing LOD, ending in SIDECAR POS (L hips adjacent, M facing slightly R of LOD).

17 - 24 SIDECAR OUT, 2; 3, STEP/STEP; BANJO IN, 2; 3, STEP/STEP;

SIDECAR OUT, 2; 3, STEP/STEP; BANJO IN, 2; 3, STEP/STEP (TO SEMI-CLOSED);

Moving diag to R of LOD M steps fwd (W bwd) L, R; L, and does 2 quick steps in place RL as he crosses to BANJO POS facing slightly L of LOD; Moving diag to L of LOD M steps fwd (W bwd) R, L; R, and does 2 quick steps in place LR as he crosses to SIDECAR POS facing slightly R of LOD; Repeat action of Meas 17-20 still prog LOD in a zig-zag manner. On the last 2 quick steps both face COH in SEMI-CLOSED POS.

25 - 28 (TWD CENTER) IN, 2; TURN, POINT; W REV TWIRL OUT, 2; 3, TOUCH;

In semi-closed pos step twd COH L, R; L, then (still in closed pos) pivot individually and point R toe twd wall joined hands held high; W twirls LF under M's L & W's R hand as W moves twd wall stepping L, R, L, touch R - M follows W stepping R, L; R, touch L to end in FACING POS, M's back to COH.

29-32 TWO-STEP BACK; TWO-STEP BACK; TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP FWD (TO FACING);

Releasing hands and starting M's L do 2 two steps backing away from each other; Then, do 2 two-steps twd each other to end in FACING POS to repeat dance from the beginning.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES PLUS ENDING

ENDING: Repeat Meas 1 thru 12, ending with bow to partner on last count of Meas 12.

WHY...OH WHY ???

Why are you a square dancer? What is the attraction that keeps you coming back week after week, month after month, year after year, to do essentially the same patterns over and over again with the same people or with perfect strangers? If it was a form of competition, or a matter of recognition, or a status symbol, it would be easily understood. But square dancing is none of these things. My busy little mind got to mulling this over last night because Jane and I square danced for the first time since last October - and it felt wonderful, as if we had finally come home. Since October, I have been a no-frequency dancer due to a muscle and nerve injury that sidelined me completely. ("He's getting old." Jane.) ("Getting old?" Ed. note.) But what did we do for recreation during this period? We went to square dances and watched and listened. We continued with our NCSDA Board, Delegate, Committee, and Roundup meetings. We went to parties and potlucks with square dancers. All this although we were no longer active participants. What is this fascination that absorbs so much of our leisure time?

I have heard people nod knowingly and say it is because it is a wholesome recreation that both husband and wife can enjoy together. This is true, but Bowling, Ballroom Dancing, Roller Skating, Bridge, Walks in the country, Singing, Swimming, Tennis and Family fights also fit this category - and who does any of these things so often over so long a span of years without losing interest. Frankly, I can't come up with the answer - not, I add hastily, that this will stop me from expressing all sorts of learned opinions.

Let us analyze what we do. We dress differently than we normally do - and differently than anyone else does. We gather together with a lot of other people, with whom we have little else in common - and as a matter of fact, usually have no idea as to what they do for a living, where or how they live, or what their backgrounds are. In fact, we may have never seen them before, and may never see them again. We then form a set pattern with three other couples, always in the same way, and wait expectantly and impatiently for some guy, who is usually not a musician in the real sense, and probably without a good singing voice. To chant or sing a series of instructions to us, which we dutifully follow. The instructions are fairly standard, with a little variation in pattern, but we've done them all thousands of times before, and will again. Then, at the end of the evening, having gone through this familiar - and on paper - monotonous repetition. We scream and stamp our appreciation and go home rejuvenated and happy, our minds cleansed of the worries and troubles that beset us before the dance, and lay eager plans to do it all over again at the first opportunity! Ridiculous! Doesn't make sense! And your author is one of the countless thousands of ridiculous, senseless people who would not have it any other way.

A few of the manifestations of this unlikely phenomena are worthy of note. As in most dancing, it is the wife that drags the husband, protesting loudly and bitterly, to the beginners class. But after a short while, who is the eager beaver who can't wait to rush out to the nearest hoedown? Old hubby, who for years has proclaimed that he had no interest whatsoever in dancing. And most of us, usually so guarded in our acceptance of strangers, become close buddies immediately with other square dancers at first sight. The little woman, shy and retiring, who shrinks in embarrassment into a corner if she is asked to even make an appearance in public, eagerly races out onto the square dance floor to perform for hundreds of people, live or on television. And how about hubby? He won't even wear a loud necktie, and any variation from normal styles of accepted dress fills him with horror. But on hoedown night? Get him - fancy pastel shirt, gaudy string tie (with sequins, yet!), skin-tight western pants, fancy towel, looped in a hand-tooled broad leather belt with an engraved gold and silver buckle, several fancy pins on his chest, and parading around proudly on two-toned cowboy boots! And to show how perverse is the woman (ah, there, Jane!), let's look at her before and then after she became a square dancer. Before, if she went to a party or dance, she got all gussied up in sleek, fancy - yet restrained! Restrained! - garments, as far ahead of fashion as she dared, and then sailed proudly onto the scene - and would immediately burst into tears and flee in confusion if another gal was wearing the same dress. And two women could

be sure of having lifelong and bitter enemies. After square dancing? She and her friends spend hours looking, planning, deciding, and sewing, so they can all prance onto the floor -- and look exactly alike.

And the last phenomenon -- and the one I am proudest of, and the one I use to try to explain to outsiders why we are square dancers is -- but look at it yourself! Stand off at the Roundup, for example, and look at the hundreds of dancers whirling and bouncing around, most of them tired and hot and crowded and bumped. Look at the dancers, and then you will realize that, search as hard and as far as you like, you will never find any group, anywhere, in any activity, where virtually every participant is smiling or actually laughing at virtually all times! I rest my case.

More thanks go to the clubs who helped with the work. It is only because of the member clubs that such events can be staged successfully. To the Aces and Laces, Alameda Wagon Wheelers, Antler Eights, Ball and Chain Squares, Barn Owls and the Baywood Promenaires, we say, your help was greatly appreciated.

Received a letter from one club asking if it were possible to replace their lost Association Membership Certificate. The Board decided that this can be done. But -- there is one little catch, it will cost one dollar. So if your club wants to replace a lost Certificate, send the dollar along with your request to the Secretary.
