SENDING ADS IN...

Since most clubs annually elect Publicity Chairman who are not familiar with Advertising Procedure in Square Dance Where? here are a few tips we hope to be helpful.

1. Ads should be separated from listings & clearly labeled as to size. Many clip out previous ads & make current changes. This is an excellent way to avoid mistakes.
2. We have most Callers pictures on file but if you send one in, it may be any size (Preferably glossy.) We reduce down & strip in to ad. If you like your badges reproduced on the ad this may also be done by sending a sample in. Drawings should be done in India Ink. Pencil will not reproduce.
3. Be sure to write legibly. We may have to make an interpretation of scrawling that could change the context of it's meaning
4. If you send in a ad make-up of your own, it may be any size, but must be a ratio of a diagonal from the lower left corner up thru the upper right hand corner. It will then reduce to fit our margins.
5. Deadline for ads & listings is the 5th of the month. The Printer gets the layout on the 17th. We mail on the 24th, which puts it in your hands by the first of the month.

PROBLEMS? WE GOT 'EM !!! BY BOB BARTHOL

(OLD HAM INSISTED HIS NAME BE THIS SIZE)

I'm a square dancer. You're a square dancer or a Caller. If you weren't, you wouldn't be reading this magazine or this page. Right? Right! and furthermore, the chances are that square dancing occupies the greater part of your social life, because that's the type of person who subscribes to SDW. As mentioned in this space last month, there are many reasons why we enjoy square dancing so much and so often, and why it has become so important to us. The best and most accepted reason is simply that "square dancing is fun!" Did you ever stop to think why it is fun, why, after being in existence for so many years in a relatively dormant state, it suddenly, a few years ago, began to mushroom and finally explode to the point where it is now the second most popular recreation in the country? I won't try to list or analyze the reasons because they are myriad - some obvious, some obscure - and besides, I freely admit I don't know all of them. ("This must be ghost-written. Barthol would never admit he doesn't know everything." Ed. note.) (You keep out of this, Ferrario. Author's note.) But whatever the reasons are, we know that a lot of people had a hand in developing, refining, standardizing, and guiding it to its present place. We're 'way up there and running strong, and it will go on forever. Or will it. What a horrible thing to contemplate - that some day square dancing will go the way of miniature golf or other activities that swept the nation and then faded into oblivion. Is there any tremendous activity that didn't eventually wane? Nope.

It is always fashionable and safe to say everything is lovely, and the guy who sounds a warning note is a bum and a radical and a spoil sport. But history should tell us something, and we must at least look to see if we have present or potential problems. DO we have problems? Sure we do! Too many competing hoedowns. Too many small clubs that can hardly hold their heads above water. Not enough beginners to replace the older dancers that are dropping out. Too many inadequately trained or inadequate callers. Too many new basics. School costs running some clubs right out of business. These and many more. Problems? We got 'em! And most of you have discussed and complained about them, and are aware of the fact that they represent a potential threat to the future of Square Dancing. But - what have you - and I do mean you - done about them? It just isn't enough to complain and regret and deplore. Most of you have definite ideas as to ways and means to solve the problems, or at least alleviate them, but usually the ideas remain merely ideas, and no positive action is taken. My whole point is that you, the average dancer, should - and must - make your desires and ideas known to keep square dancing strong and for the greatest number. It has long been my firm belief that the voice of the greatest percentage of square dancers is rarely heard, that the ideas and direction comes from a vocal few who dance more often, who desire more change to satisfy their particular needs, which may not always be identical with the needs of majority, or always in the best interest of square dancing as a whole. They win by default - and all the average dancer does is complain. This is not to suggest that the vocal minority is wrong or bad. Most of the leadership, dancer and caller, is excellent, and most of it sincere, but I maintain it does not always represent the desires of the mass of dancers. The minority goes along believing it is right, and why not? It doesn't hear or always understand what the majority wants, because the latter just doesn't speak. So, the minority, being square dancers, does what it feels is right, based on what it knows, but can't help going in the direction of its own interests.

What can you do about it? Many things! Do you feel that you have a responsibility to give a very little of your time and effort to further the activity that gives you so much enjoyment? Do you feel that it is right to allow others to do all the work and planning while you merely enjoy the fruits of their labors without offering to help? Test yourself and see what you are doing. Do you belong to a club? If not, you are free-loading, taking the fun and none of the responsibilities. Do you, or have you, held office in your club? If not, you have not shared the responsibility. Are you, or have you been, a delegate to the Northern California Square Dancers Association, or the Association in your area? Have you served on committees for the Round-up? Have you ever voiced your objections to something in the square dance picture to someone in position to do something about it? The answers to these and many other such

questions can give you a good idea as to whether you are doing your share to keep square dancing strong. Remember, the development of Square Dancing doesn't just happen; it is accomplished by the hard work of individual dancers.

To be specific about making your voice heard, here is a simple suggestion. Take your gripe, suggestion, question, or idea and write it in a letter or talk it over the phone or in person with someone who can bring it before a policy-making body or disseminate it to other dancers. Take it to the Dancers Workshop, The Callers Association, Your Delegate, Director, or officer of the Association. Write it to SDW or to me. You'd be surprised how welcome suggestions are, how eager your Association and Magazine and Callers and Leaders are to get your ideas, because all are working toward the same end, and the more information available as to what is wanted, the better they are able to know which way to lead. Remember - if YOU, personally don't do this, you should never again criticize or complain, and can never again be outraged because "they" didn't handle a problem. Why? Because "they" is YOU!
