ROUND DANCE OF THE MONTH



SILK AND SATIN

By Jack & Na Stapleton, Grasse Pointe, Michigan

RECORD: "Silk and Satin" - Windsor 4658

POSITION: Open-facing, M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined

FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions given for M

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION (4 meas.)

1 - 2 WAIT;

3 - 4 BALANCE APART (acknowledge); BALANCE TOG. (to open-facing);

Bal bwd twd COH on L ft, point R toe fwd twd partner and acknowledge, hold 1 ct; Step diag twd wall and RLOD on R ft swinging joined hands twd RLOD at shoulder height, touch L toe beside R ft, hold 1 ct.

DANCE

1 - 4 FWD WALTZ; WRAP; FWD WALTZ; STEP, TOUCH, -(to Butterfly);

Start L ft and waltz 1 meas fwd LOD swinging joined hands fwd and veering slightly away from partner; As M starts R ft and waltzes fwd LOD with short steps, W makes a full LF turn in 3 steps LRL to end in "wrapped" pos with M's R & W's L hands joined around W's waist & M's L & W's R hands joined in front, both facing LOD; In wrapped pos and starting M's L, waltz 1 meas fwd LOD; Releasing M's R from W's L hand, M steps fwd LOD on R turning 1/4 R to face wall, touches L toe beside R and holds 1 ct while taking BUTTERFLY POS - as W steps fwd LOD on L turning 1/4 L to face COH, touches R toe beside L and holds 1 ct while taking BUTTERFLY POS.

5 - 8 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; MANEUVER, 2, 3; WALTZ(R); WALTZ(to open-facing);

In butterfly pos grapevine along LOD by stepping to L side on L, step on R XIB of L, step to L side again on L; M steps thru on R XIF of L, then takes 2 steps LR to maneuver 1/4 R turn to face RLOD and takes CLOSED POS - while W steps thru on L XIF of R and takes 2 steps RL to turn 1/4 to face LOD and takes CLOSED POS; Start bwd LOD and waltz 2 meas down LOD making 3/4 R turn and opening out on 2 meas to OPEN-FACING POS, M's back to COH, M's R & W's L hands joined and extended at shoulder height twd RLOD.

9 - 12 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1 - 4.

13 - 16 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; MANEUVER, 2, 3; WALTZ(R); WALTZ(to sidecar);

Repeat action of Meas 5-8 EXCEPT to end in LOOSE-CLOSED SIDECAR POS (L hips adj) with M facing slightly to R of LOD.

17 - 20 TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN; W TWIRL/M AROUND HER SIDECAR, TOUCH, -;

Prog mainly down LOD and with a minimum of zig-zag movement, start L & do 2 traveling waltz twinkle, M XIF and W XIB, ending the 1st twinkle in BANJO POS and the 2nd twinkle in SIDECAR POS Releasing M's R & W's L hands but retaining hold of M's L & W's R held high, M takes 4 steps LRL; R to move behind and around W in 1/2 L circle to end facing slightly to R of RLOD in loose SIDECAR POS, touches L toe beside R, and holds 1 ct - while W makes 1/2 R twirl under joined hands in 4 steps RLR; L to end facing slightly to R of LOD in loose-closed SIDECAR POS, touches R toe beside L, and holds 1 ct.

21 - 24 TWINKLE IN; TWINKLE OUT; W TWIRL/M AROUND HER; SIDE, TOUCH, -(to open);

Repeat action of Meas 17-20 moving in RLOD EXCEPT to end W's twirl and M's circle during Meas 23 with partners facing, M's back to COH during Meas 24, step swd on R along RLOD, touch L toe beside R, and hold 1 ct while taking OPEN-FACING POS with joined M's R & W's L hands extended out at shoulder height twd RLOD.

25 - 28 ROLL, 2, 3(1 1/2 times); STEP, TOUCH, -; REVERSE SPIN; MANEUVER, TOUCH, -;

Swinging joined hands fwd then releasing, partners use 2 meas to do a fast 1 1/2 SOLO rollaway from each other down LOD, M turning LF with 4 steps LRL; R to end facing COH in a back-to-back pos with W, touches L toe beside R, and holds 1 ct while joining his R with W's L hands extended at shoulder height twd LOD and glancing at W over leading shoulder, as W rolls RF with counterpart steps; Swinging joined hands bwd then releasing M leads W into a 1 1/4 LF SOLO spin, W using 4 steps RLR; L to end facing LOD, touching R toe beside L, and holding 1 ct while taking CLOSED POS - as M uses 4 steps LRL; R to make a 3/4 turn maneuvering in front of W to end facing RLOD, touches L toe beside R, and hold 1 ct while taking CLOSED DANCE POS.

29 - 32 WALTZ (R); WALTZ; WALTZ; TWIRL (to Open-Facing Pos);

Start bwd LOD on L and waltz 3 meas down LOD making 1 1/2 R turn; As M starts R and waltzes 1 meas beside W down LOD, turning 1/4 to face wall on last step, W makes 1 1/4 RF twirl with 3 steps LRL to end facing COH as partners take OPEN-FACING POS with M's R & W's L hands joined and extended at shoulder height twd RLOD, to repeat dance.

PERFORM ENTIRE DANCE A TOTAL OF THREE TIMES.

CLUB SUCCESS

I have received several requests in the last two months to write something about club problems, particularly as to how to revive a club whose enthusiasm has failed, and how to increase membership in a small club. Actually, it is almost the same problem. A club without spirit not only doesn't get new members, but also loses the old, and shortly becomes a small club. Enthusiasm is easier to generate in a large club, and an enthusiastic club usually attracts new members. You rarely hear of an active, enthusiastic club going under, but by the same token, you rarely hear of a very small club that is very active. Do I mean by this that all clubs should be large? No, but the chances of a very small club surviving are not good. For one thing, a very small club is liable to be plagued with financial troubles, because they just can't take in enough in dues to pay expenses. Also, there is only a small percentage of any group that has the ability or desire to take the trouble to lead, and a small group just doesn't have the manpower pool from which to draw the necessary leaders.

In checking various clubs that have folded, or are wobbling on the edge, several common denominators are apparent. They usually lack a real leader, either dancer or caller; neither dancers nor caller plans any activities; they do not have beginner classes; they make no real attempt to get new members; they are either crippled with apathetic dancers or torn between feuding cliques. Any or all of these factors may be present in the dying club. Analysis of the problem is easy, but is it as easy to find the remedy? Sure - the remedy is exactly the reverse of the above. Get a leader, plan activities, have beginner classes, actively recruit new members, show some spirit, and stop the feuding. I'm not being facetious, either - these are the remedies! The hard part is the first one; getting a leader, one who is not only willing to work to accomplish the above aims, but is able to inspire others to follow. A leader without the confidence and loyalty of his followers is apt to storm up the hill and find out he is all by his little lonesome, or be tripped up before he gets started.

A natural-born type leader - one whom everybody instinctively follows - is a rarity. The best the average leader can expect is to have most of the club behind him, and have the rest merely passive. But the club members have a responsibility also, to actively support the leadership. The most unfair and immature attitude you can find is that of the dancer who will not accept any responsibility himself, but will criticize and attempt to block the program of the guy who is trying. If a president and board is elected by will of the majority, give them a chance and back their play, and if their program doesn't work out, then try to elect someone else next time. Always remember that the whole idea of a democracy is to argue, vote, and then close ranks behind the man or policy chosen. A minority can and should continue to discuss and attempt to talk others over to its position, but has no right to sabotage or block programs or refuse to play with the team. It is surprising how much better things move when a spirit of team-play takes over.

As to planning activities, the possibilities are limited only by the limits of your imagination. It doesn't make a lot of difference whether you use old and tested activities, or dream up fancy new ideas of your own - the secret is to be doing something. Most of us have had the experience of being part of a committee or work-party developing some big affair, whether it be in square dancing or any other field, and almost always find that we have not only enjoyed the affair itself more, but have actually enjoyed the labors that helped bring it into being. Ask any Round-up Chairman or Committeeman if he didn't enjoy the Round-up he worked on more than the ones he merely attended. The reason is not only pride of accomplishment - which is considerable - but also the wonderful feeling of being part of a team, large or small. It automatically builds spirit - and that is precisely what we set out to do. A club that is working hard to accomplish something, whether it be a hoedown, party night, visiting night, picnic, or what have you, has no time or inclination to sit out, not come, or gripe. Even the most apathetic couple will finally go along, if only because they can't stand being alone. One of the big popular aims nowadays is "togetherness", and here it is!

On a practical club level, what are some of these activities? Well, for instance, a good caller plans some sort of dancing gimmick - a change of pace. Remember that old double-

square, where two men danced as one man and two women as one woman? And the five or six-couple square that made you really concentrate to keep going? There are many more ancient and honorable gimmicks that we don't see any more, and they were fun! Are we too sophisticated to enjoy them now? If so, I fear for square dancing. An excellent activity is to invite another club over en masse, and then plan a return visit to their club. A pot-luck dinner, or an old-fashioned box-social, with bidding for the boxes to increase the treasury, or choosing by lots, will bring out the eaters as well as the dancers. A white elephant auction, where the dancers write their bids for each article during the course of the evening unseen by anyone else and then closing the bidding at some unexpected time, followed by the opening of the "sealed" bids can be hilarious. Try picnics, or Sunday morning breakfast at a park or recreation area (this is better in the summer - the turn-out in a rainstorm tends to be disappointing). Instead of a money-losing hoedown, try renting a recreation facility on a Saturday afternoon and evening, and have a swim, pot-luck, and dance for your own club and invited guests. You'll see members you've almost forgotten. Almost anything works, and will build interest and therefore spirit.

Beginners classes are a necessity, whether a large-scale, ten-square epic, or teaching one or two squares of New Dancers each week before the regular workshop. Without new blood, a club will stagnate after a few years, but don't swamp a small club with more new members than old, or some of the old ones will drop out. One of the most successful policies with a beginner's class is to have some of the club members in evidence at each session to help out and fill in. This will cut the drop-out rate sharply, and also ease the awkward period when the beginners join the club, because they will know the members and feel welcome.

This is not meant to be a panacea for all ills, but just a set of suggestions. You gotta want to solve your problems, and you have to make a start. So go out, get a leader, fill him full of spirits, let him clique his heels, give him fuel for thought, and let me know how you make out. G'Luck!
