Being Graceful is Easy

In response to many requests, I'd like to tell you how I got my start in Square Dancing. Why my history should be of such interest to so many people is a mystery to me, but a surprising amount of questions have been asked about it. It is very flattering, and in all modesty, I must admit that I am no better than the average graceful, intelligent, experienced, above-average dancer. But still the questions are asked. Like last nite, during one tip, I was asked admiringly by my corner "BARTHOL, where in the world did you learn to dance?", and shortly thereafter my opposite exclaimed with a real gleam of interest in her eye, "Who is responsible for turning out a dancer like you!" In spite of all these nice compliments, I remain essentially the same old-shoe type fellow I've always been. So here is the story.

I hate to admit it, but I got my start in folk dancing. In fact, my spirited rendition of "Clap, Clap, Curtsy" was the talk and envy of the 2nd grade in Argonne Grammar School in San Francisco. I might have gone on to better things, but my career was temporarily interrupted (by about thirty years) when I loosened my partner's tooth in a particularly abandoned "Sailor's Hornpipe" that same semester. It was her timing that was faulty, but her timing in the resultant fist-fight was excellent. However, I felt that being whipped by my partner after each dance was not only painful, but downright embarrassing, so I went into intermural finger-painting instead.

In 1951, Jane, feeling the need of recreation and an even greater need to expose me to culture, accepted an invitation of some friends to join a folk dance group in Berkeley. I consented (because her timing is even better than the girl in the second grade) and we joined the group. Having been blessed with the natural grace of a water buffalo and owning a carefully-cultured total inability to waltz (I can't even do the well-known Chuck Jones' two-step slop-over), I found the going a little heavy. The dances were much more complicated than the sailor's hornpipe and I had trouble remembering all the patterns in some of the dances. I tried using the forerunner of the modern TV cue cards by pinning one on Jane's shoulder, but inasmuch as some of the dances were progressive, I found them hard to read across the floor. I gave up cue cards when I pinned the wrong card to my dear wife, and was happily (?) doing the East Afghanistan Twitch while everybody else, including Jane, was doing the Madagascar Mishmash. This made for an interesting dance, but did create confusion. It did give me an idea, however, and for several weeks I was able to bluff my way through the dances by smiling happily at my partner, wiggling the upper part of my body rhythmically to indicate my feet were executing intricate patterns, - and sneakily dog-trotting around the floor. My perfidy was discovered, of course, and they took away my velvet pants for two weeks.

The end of my folk dance career came suddenly. We were doing a third-string Lower Slobbovian Gavotte which was progressive and repeated the pattern twice. The end of each pattern consisted of the man facing the woman after a twirl, placing his hands on her waist, and both executing a knee-bend. They both then straightened up quickly, the woman leaping gracefully into the air, and the man assisting her with an upward push on her waist. She would rise a couple of feet off the floor, and then be lowered gently to the ground.

On this fateful night, at the end of the first pattern I was facing a small, lithe, young woman who had the muscles and reflexes to sweep all events in the women's Olympics. She went into her graceful knee-bend (and I into my awkward squat,) with my hands at her slim waist. We rose simultaneously, and as I pushed upward she gave a prodigious leap and, to my utter horror, sailed free of my clutching hands and practically went into orbit. I was able to retrieve her with a one-handed running catch several couples down the line, which she thought was grand fun, but which shattered my morale. At the end of the next pattern I faced a gal who could have played defensive tackle for the 49'ers, and I knew I was overmatched. I went into my knee-bend, but, like my Waterloo in the 2nd grade, her timing was one beat behind mine. Just as I straightened up and gave a desperate upward thrust with my hands to raise Goliath II off the floor, she dropped into her knee bend. My vertebrae sounded like Chinese New Year's as they popped like a string of fire-crackers. That did it. I hung up my satin shirt and dancing pumps for the last time and hobbled painfully off the floor in ignominious defeat, through with dancing forever.

Very shortly thereafter we were asked to join a new square dancing club that was forming. (This was before the days of beginner classes). Some of the group had dabbled in folk dancing, some had no experience, and none were square dancers. My first reaction was to run screaming into the hills, but then I recalled that about twice each evening during the folk dance class they did a folk dance called, if I remember correctly, American square dancing. I remembered I had eagerly awaited this portion and was disappointed when it was over. There was a folk dance I could understand!

The rhythm was easy (no waltz step); no cue cards were necessary (the caller had to tell me the pattern); a shuffle step (My natural way of walking); and when I made a mistake they didn't laugh at me, but with me. Jane liked it too - possibly because I occasionally did what I was supposed to.

And so we joined. We learned to Square Dance, and found that slowly, gradually, and inexorably, it took over our personal lives. Our formerly varied recreation became almost entirely square dancing, and our friends were all square dancers (either those we met or old friends we dragged in with us). I cannot even remember what in the world we used to do for amusement and recreation before we square danced. I cannot conceive of what we would do in the future if we couldn't square dance, and expect to die with my boots on. Square dance boots, that is.
