RECORD: "You're Singing our Love Song to Somebody Else" - Challenge 59072

POSITION: INTRO: Open-facing, M's back to COH, M's R & W's L hands joined

DANCE: Open, facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite, directions for M

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

- 1 - 8 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER, -, TOUCH, -; GRAPEVINE APART; GRAPEVINE TOG; ROCK FWD, -, BACK, -; ROCK BACK, -; FWD, -;
 In open-facing pos wait 2 meas; Then step apart M's L twd COH, -, point R twd partner; Step tog on R to OPEN POS, -, touch L to R; Grapevine apart & touch (M twd COH, W twd wall); Grapevine tog and touch, ending in SEMI-CLOS POS facing LOD; M rocks fwd on L in slight dip, -, back in place on R, -; Rocks bwd twd RLOD in slight dip on L, -, fwd in place on R, -, assuming BUTTERFLY POS, M's back to COH.

PART A

- 1 - 4 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BRUSH; TWO-STEP FWD; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BRUSH; TWO-STEP FWD;
 In BUTTERFLY POS grapevine LOD; side L, R behind L, side L, and on the 4th ct. release lead hands and brush R thru to OPEN POS facing LOD M's R & W's L hands led thru twd LOD at shoulder height and slightly back-to-back; Starting M's R do one two-step fwd; Again assuming BUTTERFLY POS, M's back to COH, repeat action of Meas 1-2, ending in CLOSED pos, M's back to COH;
- 5 - 8 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, -, 2, -; 3, -, 4, -;
 Do 2 turning two-steps prog LOD; W turns RF under M's L arm in 4 steps, ending in BUTTERFLY POS, M's back to COH.
- 9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8, ending in BUTTERFLY POS, M's back to COH.

PART B

- 17 - 20 FACE-TO-FACE; BACK-TO-BACK; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -; (box)
 Prog LOD in BUTTERFLY POS: step side L, close R, side L, pivoting to back-to-back pos, M's R & W's L joined; Step swd LOD on R, close L, side R, pivoting to face partner in CLOSED POS; Starting M's L step side on L, close R to L, step fwd twd wall on L, -; Step to side on R, close L to R, step back twd COH on R, -;
- 21 - 24 DIP, -, RECOVER, -; TWIRL, -, 2, -; ROCK FWD, -, BACK, -; ROCK BACK, -, FWD, -;
 M dips back on L twd COH, recovers stepping fwd on R (W dips fwd on R, back on L) to end in SEMI-CLOS POS facing LOD; As M walks fwd L, -, R, -, W does 1 RF turn under M's L arm in 2 steps, ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD; M rocks fwd on L in slight dip, -, back in place on R, -; Rocks bwd twd RLOD in slight dip on L, -, fwd in place on R, -, assuming BUTTERFLY POS M's back to COH (same as Meas 7 & 8 of Introduction).
- 25 - 32 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-24, ending in BUTTERFLY POS M's back to COH.

DANCE THRU TWO TIMES; THEN REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS - 1-8 PART A.
 Bow & Curtsy.

NOTE: Speed record up slightly.

AND YOU CAN'T BY BOB BARTHOL

So you're a beginner! Welcome to the ranks and may you be with us long. I can understand your problems, having been a beginner myself. (He still qualifies. Ed. Note) May I offer some advice and fill you in with a little lore and also point out some possible misconceptions you have?

If you are a man, you're probably a beginner because, after you withstood months of wheedling and cajoling, your wife finally laid down the law and hauled you forth bodily, and you went to keep peace in the family. You also had a sneaking feeling of guilt because you go to ball games, bowling, and other functions without her and feel that you can give in on one short, two-hour function a week with the better half. The two of you took up Square Dancing because of many factors that appealed - it is good exercise, you'll lose weight, it takes no more than 2 1/2 hours a week, it costs almost no money, no late hours, no expenses, you don't have to dress up, and it's simple to learn. Right? Let me disillusion you!

You'll lose weight? Hah! At your beginner classes, you'll find that there will be refreshments served occasionally - coffee, soft drinks, and doughnuts, to start with - and then the ladies start competing a little bit, as, one after another, they are put on the refreshment detail - and the simple donut becomes pie, cake, sandwiches, chocolate sundaes and pot luck dinners - and the term "pot" becomes clearer to many of the men. Then, on top of this, after you become acquainted with the other beginners, you want to continue the evening a little longer, so two, three, or more couples go out after class to a creamery or restaurant, and hamburgers, waffles, pie, sundaes, etc. become standard fare. Still later in your experience, there will be little get-togethers at the homes of some of the new-found friends - with the same or fancier refreshments. Lose weight? You'll be fighting the dietary battle of your lives!

It takes only 2 1/2 hours a week? True - at first. But refer to the above paragraph. The after-class activities begin to add up, and as you get deeper and deeper into square dancing, there are more and more activities taking place. The square dancer is a nocturnal creature, and the later the evening progresses, the more alert and eager he becomes. I saw fewer dawns come up before square dancing than I have afterwards. No one ever wants to end the evening, so the after-party is as much a part of the evening as the dance itself - and I know some square dancers who are visible only at the after parties, and are rarely seen in a square.

It costs no money? Hah and double hah! True, the club dues average only about \$3.00 per month. But refer to the last two paragraphs above. Food costs, party costs, baby-sitters, clothes, hoedowns, festivals, transportation expenses, out-of-town trips, and numerous other items gradually creep in until you have to add another, preferably large, envelope to the budget box.

You don't have to dress up? This is one of the biggest fallacies of all. To start with, the gals wear a simple skirt and blouse, and slacks or jeans, sport shirt and regular shoes suffice for the men. But then - the gal needs a slightly fancier dress after she sees what the club dancers are wearing, and, as party nites, hoedowns, festivals, and so forth keep coming, she has to get fancier and fancier, until she ends up with a braid and rick-rack dress - no material - just braid and rick-rack. Of course, we don't forget the gal's shoes, petticoats, (each one of which contains about the same amount of material as the sails on a four-masted schooner), stoles, sweaters, buttons and bows. Then she finds she is out of closet space, and begins to beat the drums for Hubby to build more closets - or turns the poor guy's den into a king-size storage area. The man? Who would be seen dead on the floor without western pants, fancy shirt, tie, towel, and of course, boots. Pretty soon, the family beef starts as he begins to usurp part of his former den back for his storage space.

Later on there are other items you'll be considering as necessities. A tape recorder, a station wagon rather than a sedan - to pack all your gear, of course -, a car port (you need the garage for square dancing at afterparties, and naturally will have to clean it up, paint it, and maybe finish it off and put in a little furniture) and it is not unknown that a square dancer decides a larger house might be advisable.

It's simple to learn? Why do you think a beginners class is scheduled for a minimum of sixteen weeks? And then followed by an intermediate class of another sixteen weeks? And

then followed by workshop nights for the rest of your career? Because it is a complicated, precision-type sport that requires expert knowledge, excellent rhythm, and fully-conditioned reflexes to master. You never stop learning, and you never will master everything there is to know, no matter how many hours of dedicated work you put into it.

You think I'm kidding? Ask any old square dancer, Ed Ferrario, for example. (Although he qualifies more on the "old" than he does on the "Square Dancer" part.) I can safely destroy your illusions without running the risk of discouraging you, because the mere fact that you are reading this is proof that you're already hooked, but good. The fact that most of the reasons you started square dancing for turn out to be non-existent not only hasn't bothered you, but won't bother you. You will get to the point where you can hardly wait to drag some other poor, unsuspecting couple into the same maelstrom, with the full expectation that they will be eternally grateful. For these things come to pass only because you discover that they are what you've always wanted to do, and you wouldn't change them if you could.

And you can't!
