when is a crowded floor fun, asks BOB BARTHOL



It may seem surprising to the uninitiated, but plans and meetings for the next Golden State Roundup on May 26-27, 1962 are already underway. It seems surprising to me too, but it takes that much time to work out plans and get things organized. In these preliminary meetings we drag all the comments, good and bad, we have picked up concerning the last roundup and analyze them. First, of course, we brag about the good comments, and take mutual bows, and try to take individual credit. We then charge each other with the bad comments and deny all individual responsibility. After everybody is red-faced and pouting, we finally decide that the things that went wrong were the responsibility of those committee members that aren't present at the meeting, blame them and assassinate their character and good judgement, shake hands all around and feel virtuous. We try to arrange for continuation of the successful items, and correct the unsuccessful ones.

But the above is merely preliminary to the subject of this perceptive article. One of the complaints I have often heard, not only about our sacred Golden State Roundup, but about Stampedes, Conventions, and Large Festivals is, "We don't go to them - they're so crowded we can't dance." To those that feel that way, I can only say that you are missing the point - and most of the fun - of a big square dance function. If you really want ideal conditions, why not get together one square of good dancers on a large, well-kept, wooden floor, and dance to square dance records, which have been recorded without error under ideal conditions? This way, everything is perfect, and you can dance to the calls and callers you like best with the people you like best, without bumping, crowding, outside noise or interference of any kind.

Why don't we do it? Simply because it isn't much fun. Let's compare it to a really good comedy movie. If you go alone, it's not much fun, because laughter must be shared to be really enjoyed. If you are with someone but the theatre is nearly empty, again it will not be too enjoyable. But go with someone, in a full theatre, where the whole place roars with laughter, and you'll find your chuckles will be full-throated laughter too. That's why TV programs are played before live studio audiences, or canned laughter is added - to give the home viewer the illusion of sharing the fun. Exactly the same thing holds true in square dancing. A small club-dance doesn't satisfy us all the time, so we give hoedowns, Stampedes, Roundups, etc., because the size of the crowd generates the enthusiasm and spirit that lifts us into the stratosphere.

So it is that the Roundup busts out at the seams with laughter and fun. Now I'm as aware as you are that we are jostled and thrown off stride and crowded and hot in these affairs, and we all wish fervently that we could give you more room - but there isn't any way to do it, and I suspect that it would lose a little of its flavor if we could. I don't attend with the expectation of ideal dancing conditions, and I no longer attempt to dance every tip. I have found that the Roundup or any other big affair is like a family reunion. I see friends I haven't seen in a long time and have a chance to renew our friendship, catch up on their news - and may even get a chance to get in a square with them. No matter where you establish your stand in the auditorium, sooner or later I will pass by, because I like people - and I can find more old friends and meet more new ones by circulating around part of the time. The couple that dances only with their friends or their own club misses a lot but they don't know it until they finally get around to circulating, and then they find that their horizons are greatly broadened - and regret the fact that they didn't start earlier. There is certainly nothing wrong with dancing with your club or particular friends, but don't limit yourself to this exclusively.

Another way to multiply your fun is by taking an active part in the running of one of the affairs. The sense of belonging is vastly increased, and your circle of friends grows larger and stronger, because the shared responsibility and accomplishment establishes a powerful bond among the participants. If you haven't tried it yet, do so this time. Even a little experience will convince you. If you are a square dancer you like people, because a square dancer who doesn't like people is like a swimmer who doesn't like water - it is his natural element, and if it wasn't he wouldn't be a swimmer. Realize this and develop your natural inclination, and you will never again say "I won't go because it's too crowded to dance."

Maybe this will help, too. In your own club, if you get bumped or crowded, you laugh and take it as part of the game. We never object to being crowded by friends - only by strangers. And since when are there any strangers in square dancing? They are merely friends you haven't had the opportunity to officially meet yet. You think this is a play on words? Just let any one of those strangers join your club, or become associated with you on a committee, or even see you and dance with you several times during a hoedown, and when you bump into them at the Roundup, what do you do? You laugh because they are friends. So you know it's no play on words - it's happened to you in the past - they are just un-met friends. Look at it from this standpoint and your irritation should vanish.

So plan on being among those present next May 26th. Come up and bump me sometime. I'll smile - I think.
