WATCH THE GIRLS GO BY!!

Vacation is over. I had three glorious weeks of rain, hail, high winds, and rough water. Two outboard motors broke down, two boats sprung serious leaks, and my battery-operated phonograph quit working. The whole family had colds, my son hit his knee with an axe, and I lost a gold inlay and broke a tooth. The FERRARIOS were supposed to visit us on the last week-end, got a report of the disasters, and ED faked a back injury and failed to show up. It was the only bright spot of the vacation.

Now, to top it all off, on my last two days, I have to write an article - without a typewriter, pen, or lined paper. The article will probably turn out to be the final disaster. (They're ALL disasters. Ed. note.)

I journeyed into Tahoe on several occasions, and watched the girls (?) go by. Shorts, swim suits and Bikinis bore me. (O-o-o-h, what a liar! Ed. Note.) I yearned to see the sight of square dance dresses. In previous years, under a different author, this column contained numerous comments concerning square dance dresses, so I think I'll become an expert and express my opinion. Let's start with a nice, non-controversial subject like club dresses. I feel onery anyway.

The gals decide on club dresses because they don't have to make agonizing decisions as to what to wear. All they have to do is take a quick, cheerful vote on the color and style, then all rush home, whip out identical creations, and everyone is happy. (Gimme a puff of that before you throw it away. Jane's note.) Having been through numerous cheerful club decisions, such as whether to serve frosted or unfrosted cupcakes at a hoedown - and watched the dance floor run red with blood - it is inconceivable to me that any club has club dresses. The short, chubby ones want one style, and the beanpoles another; the blonds, brunettes, and redheads each want a different color. Then, when it comes to the discussion on material, a working knowledge of judo is very handy, either to swing the vote or to defend yourself. It is usually decided by the gal who runs to the store first, buys up a carload of material and appears in a working model.

The poor male, who has just loved the friendly, well-mannered girls, has to look on in horrified fascination as the pre-decision screaming, insults, and tears rage around him. To top it off, he ends up with a vest, shirt, or tie of the same material, which he has to wear, or face a highly personal drama of screams, insults and tears in his own parlor.

There are many pros and cons on the subject. Among the pros: A set of club dresses looks great in a grand march, particularly if you are a large club; new members get a feeling of belonging immediately, and feel a warm sense of comradeship, if not downright relief, when they spot the familiar outfit at an outside hoedown; it is a great leveler - the rich gal and the poor gal look alike, and the competition of fancier and fancier dresses, which is like the upward spiral of inflation, is eliminated; other clubs can immediately spot your club dancers supporting their workshops and hoedowns.

Among the cons: A stumble-footed member of your club is identified as your club, and the onus is shared by all; the gal who enjoys being different and creative is stifled and unhappy; it tends to eliminate the individual personalities of the gals - your corner is indistinguishable from numerous others (I have been known to end up three squares south of my starting point under these inhuman conditions); the size 20 gal is not at her happiest when alongside a size 10 in the identical dress.

I don't know how the club dress first originated back in the murky past of square dancing, but suspect a small community bought its flour from the same company, and sacks being of cloth and not paper in them these days, the frugal taws whipped them up in the sewing bees. I also suspect that the telephone companies must put out a lot of propaganda to get the ball rolling, because they happily declare enormous dividends after the club dress is adopted. The cutting and sewing cannot be accomplished without long and serious discussions and instructions being relayed from the experienced seamstress to the novice via the telephone; the decision to

wear or not to wear for a given affair is debated, decided, reversed, and reinstituted by the same means. The fact that one is torn, needs cleaning, is in the wash, or is being used by Susie in the school play throws the whole carefully organized plan into confusion.

Now that you understand all the advantages and disadvantages, go to it. Have your debates and make your decisions - it doesn't bother me one way or another. I look lousy in a square dance dress anyway.
