RECORD: "Sleepy Time Gal" - Grenn 14030
POSITION: OPEN-FACING for Intro. Dance starts in SEMI-CLOSED POS, facing LOD
FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

- 1-4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, TOUCH, -; TOGETHER, -, TOUCH, -;
In OPEN-FACING POS, M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined, wait 2 meas; Then step apart on L, -, tch R beside L, -; Step tag on R, -, tch L beside R, - assuming SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

DANCE

- 1-4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; TURN AWAY, 2,3, SWING; TOG, 2,3,TCH;
Starting M's L do 2 fwd two-steps LOD; M turns LF twd COH (W RF twd wall) and walks fwd 3 steps L,R,L, swing R around making LF turn to face wall (W swing L making RF turn to face COH); Walk fwd 3 steps to ptr R,L,R, tch L beside R, assuming BUTTERFLY-BANJO POS, M's back twd COH.
- 5-8 BANJO AROUND, 2,3,-; CALIF TWIRL, 2,3,-; SIDE,TCH, SIDE,TCH; W TWIRL, -,2,-;
In Butterfly-Banjo walk 3 steps CW L,R,L,- (in a half-circle); Cross over in 3 steps R,L,R,- (Calif twirl - W crosses under joined lead hands, M's R & W's L, with a LF turn on 3rd step to face ptr) assuming BUTTERFLY POS M's back to COH; Step swd LOD (short step almost in place) on L (sway body twd LOD), tch R beside L, step R swd RLOD (short step) (sway body twd RLOD), tch L beside R; Walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L,-,R,- as W does a RF twirl in 2 steps under joined lead hands - M's L & W's R - to assume SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.
- 9-12 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-4.
- 13-16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 5-8 - EXCEPT to end in LOOSE-CLOSED POS, M's back twd COH.
- 17-20 SIDE,CLOSE, CROSS,-; SIDE,CLOSE,CROSS,-; TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN;
In Loose-Closed Pos M's bk twd COH step L swd LOD, close R to L, step L XIF of R (W XIF also), -; Step R swd LOD, close L to R, step R XIF of L (W XIF also), -; Do 2 RF turning two-steps down LOD.
- 21-24 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-20.
- 25-28 SIDE,BEHIND,SIDE, IN FRONT; WALK, -,2,-; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, IN FRONT; WALK, -,2,-;
In LOOSE-CLOSED POS M's bk twd COH step L swd LOD, step R XIB of L, step L swd, step R XIF of L (W same); In SEMI-CLOSED POS walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L,-,R,-; Repeat action of Meas 25-26.
- 29-32 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; W TWIRL,-,2,-; WALK,-,2,-;
In Semi-Closed Pos do 2 fwd two-steps LOD; Walk fwd 2 slow steps while W makes 1 slow RF twirl in 2 steps under joined lead hands (M's L & W's R); In SEMI-CLOSED POS walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES

ENDING: On the last time through, Meas 31-32, W does 2 very slow twirls, bow & curtsy.

WHO SNATCHED!

Many and varied are the customs of the square dancer. Most are based on fun and friendship and have been sanctioned over a long period of time as being part of the flavor of our activity. But occasionally a practice creeps in that appears to be fun - but has built-in trouble that is not immediately apparent. The idea seems tremendous, and at first, creates a lot of spirit and laughter. These activities are usually started on the spur of the moment, are used as a surprise by one set of friends on another, and are great successes. But then, like so many ideas, they are taken up by others and used over and over, until there is no novelty or surprise. The cost to the ones being surprised is not taken into consideration - and in some cases, the fact that it costs the other party anything at all does not even register. Two such activities are banner-snatching and knuckleheading, both of which have been with us a long time, and had apparently run their courses and died out. However, there has been a renewal of the practices of late, to the point where they are again getting to be a problem - and are creating quite a little bit of resentment on the part of the lucky victims.

Banner-snatching generally goes like this: One club visits another club en masse, usually at a hoedown or party nite, and some-where near the end of the evening, members of the visiting club either sneak out the host club banner, or openly hi-jack it, and triumphantly bear it off to their own lair. An official or unofficial message is left with the bereaved club that they can get it back when the victim club visits the pirate club at its hoedown, sometimes with the stipulation that at least as many squares return the visit as the pirate club brought. There are other variations to the game, limited only by the ingenuity of the instigators. This little gimmick was first thought of as a gag to build reciprocal attendance at both hoedowns, and was done with great glee and the best of intentions. I suppose that the first time or two it was done between clubs with excellent relations and was sort of a put-up job. However, it almost immediately got out of hand, and real resentment has been built up. Let's look at it from the victim club's standpoint. A banner costs money, and is not a sturdy article at best, particularly one that has fancy fringes or gimmicks on it. Quite often it is returned in poor shape - wrinkled, soiled, torn, creased, or stained. This, of course, builds a fine spirit of camaraderie between the clubs. The losing club might be planning to use the banner for some projected affair or beginners' class, or just for its own workshop nites, and it is not available. The snatching club never takes this into consideration, and may even think it is pretty funny to discomboerate their "friends". There have been a couple of instances recently which triggered this article. One attempted hi-jacking ended in bitter argument, and another stolen banner was returned after the threat of a petty theft complaint. Regardless of your feelings in the matter, any activity that results - or might result - in bitterness or ill-feeling is bad for square dancing.

Knuckle-heading is in a different category. This consists of a group of square dancers descending on the home of a caller after he has retired for the night, waking him up and having him call a square for the invaders. Again, on the surface, it seems like an hilarious gag - and sometimes is. But what are the by-products? From the standpoint of a caller, the horde may descend on him at a very inauspicious time. He has called a dance, possibly some distance away, is tired and let-down, possibly has to get up early, probably has young children he doesn't want awakened, and undoubtedly has not bettered his relationship with his neighbors who have been awakened. The caller's wife may well be embarrassed by not having her house neat and tidy. Also, after the third or fourth knuckleheading, the caller's smile and greeting may be an itty-bit forced. Possibly the worst side-effect is the re-appraisal by the non-dancing public of the fine public image we have so successfully created. If you were a non-dancer, sound asleep in the wee hours, what would your reaction be to a noisy group of celebrants arriving in several cars, with the accompanying car-door slamming, laughter, footsteps, and conversation, followed by music, shouts, clapping, squeals of laughter, and all the other bedlam that is the hall-mark of our fun? And all this followed by the noisy exodus thereafter! If you were a good and understanding neighbor, you might laugh it off (after the caller explained and apologized the next day). But would you still understand if it hap-

pened a second, third, or fourth time? I wonder how many neighbors, not knowing square dancers, have misunderstood the hilarity as being compounded of spirits, rather than high-spirits.

Both these activities were clobbered some time ago by the Northern California Square Dancers Association, when the delegates from the clubs voted unanimously that it was no longer to be condoned. I hate to be put in the position of having to apologize for square dancers!

While we're at it, let's take a quick look at some of the bright ideas that are plaguing us. Some of the "clever" badges that we can "earn" by dancing in various locations are really cleverly designed to make square dancing look like the last haven for a bunch of overage, immature, high school sophomores. (This will probably earn me a batch of nasty letters from high school sophomores, most of which will be mis-spelled and illegible - but sincere) I can cover my broad, muscular chest with badges - each of which, I note, will cost me about one buck - by meeting the requirements, one current example of which is dancing in a Laundromat while my clothes are being washed and dried. (I suspect the clothes will be rompers). Why not a Blackfoot Badge (dancing barefoot on a freshly-tarred supermarket parking lot)? A Sieve Badge (dancing in the woods while wearing a brown coat and antlers during deer season). A Wild West Badge (dancing on horseback, after which you scalp the caller). (Free badges will be sent if you send me certain callers' scalps. I will trade two Ed Ferrarios for one John Strong). I am going to become famous for originating these and will also become rich selling the badges. I have one more that will also help square dancing, it is called the Final Square Badge. You earn it by dancing in the middle lane of the freeway after a hoedown. It comes with an Oak Leaf Cluster if your caller is out there with you. Send me the money for the badge first - it is awarded posthumously.

Let me make a suggestion. Let's have all the fun, create goodwill instead of bad, and earn - and I mean earn - a chestful of badges we can be proud of. Why not haul this fun-loving square down to a Veterans' Hospital, Children's Hospital, Mental Hospital, or Old Folks Home? Or to a rally publicizing the United Crusade, Cerebral Palsy Fund, or like activity? Call it the Public Service Badge, that will be in the shape of a heart, rather than that of a donkey!

Northern Calif Square Dancers Ass'n
