My Favorite Character (IS ME)

This thought suddenly struck me when deadline time rolled around again, and I realized with familiar horror that I had not yet mailed in my article. As a matter of fact, I realized I had not written anything, and furthermore, had no ideas whatsoever. I went around rubbing lamps, hoping a genie would appear and grant me an article, but the only thing that materialized was Jane, who complained bitterly and noisily about the grimy finger marks on her lamps. I'll either have to give up rubbing lamps or start washing my hands more often. (He'll give up rubbing lamps. Ed note) after I found that feeling sorry for myself and crying quietly failed to produce anything, I began to wonder why I go through this monthly agony. Fame? Glory? That can't be it - most of you that have read this far will have to look back to the by-line to find out who wrote it anyway. I suspect that most SDW subscribers avidly turn to the club news section to see if their name or club name appears, check to see if their hoedown is listed, search vainly for a comic strip, and then file the thing in case they want to look up a dance at some later date. Money? Ha! With what I get paid and 10¢ I can buy a cup of coffee.

Which reminds me of how some of us are heartlessly exploited by selfish commercial interests, crushed beneath the heel of the unfeeling press monopolies. One does not have to go far to find a good example of this ruthless breed; in fact, you, the reader, are unwittingly subsidizing one by subscribing to the very magazine you are now so eagerly perusing. I refer, of course, to SDW and its editor, Ed Ferrario. Here is a man who masquerades as a friend of the ordinary square dancer, who purports to sacrifice himself, to labor mightily to put forth this magazine. He basks in the compliments and credit he gets for this effort, and, with becoming modesty, shyly murmurs that it is nothing, that anyone could do it. I agree! Anyone could do it. Let me expose this monster, this cynical Fagin. Let me rip off the mask and show you what a charlatan he is!

Take me and this column for an example. Let me first refer back to the diabolical conspiracy engineered by Ferrario and Madeline Allen, where I was to be a guest columnist, to merely offer occasional rebuttal to Madeline's articles, which required no thinking. Two articles-and kaboom! Madeline retires and I am conned into months of agonizing labor. You can't convince me that this sinister turn of events wasn't carefully contrived in a smoke-filled room somewhere in the wilds of Marin County or Alameda. Being young and filled with innocent enthusiasm, I agreed, not knowing how one-sided it all is.
