DOES SHE ? ..OR DOESN'T SHE??

I am confused. My poor, little, over-worked brain is just not capable of coping with the decisions I have to make nowadays. (This is the first honest, accurate, statement he has ever made in this column. Ed. Note.) In the olden days, as my children are prone to say, I knew when to twirl the girl, when to swing, and what to do with my hands. (HM-M-M. Jane's Note.) Now I am faced with the problem of deciding what I should do each time I get a new girl in the square. Fortunately, my feet understand what is expected of them - just shuffle around. Oh, they go in the wrong direction once in a while, but still in the shuffle. No decision as to whether to hop, skip, jump, kick, or stamp. In the early years of square dancing, each area had certain differences in styling that took a little time to understand; but once understood, they were pretty consistent in that area. Then came dancers' and callers' Associations, and most of the movements became standardized - at least in the local area. We then knew that in certain circumstances we twirled the girl, and in other circumstances we didn't. Both the girl and I were in full accord. Result - smooth dancing, because we didn't throw each other off-stride. This didn't come about by osmosis, but by agreement on an association level, and the subsequent teaching of the agreed-upon styling by the callers to their dancers. Even the now-discarded backlash worked, awkward and time-consuming as it was, because both partners were expecting and doing the same maneuver.

Now, to repeat, I am confused. Our education is being sadly neglected. In our own area, some girls expect to be twirled when meeting in a promenade, others merely half-turn and move into the promenade position. I never know what is expected, with the result that if I try to twirl her under and she wants to just turn and walk with me, I am awkwardly trying to spin an actively or passively resisting girl. (I am used to girls resisting me, but I hate to look awkward about it.) This then leads to an exercise in memory and, because we are friendly people, eager to please, an attempt to adjust to what the partner evidently wants - but

both partners attempt to adjust. So what happens? After the first meeting with each gal I have memorized which method she favors, and when I meet her the next time, I try to merely take her little paws and walk in the promenade. The little gal? She has done her memory work too - and tries to twirl to adjust to what she thinks I want. Result? I am again apparently making a savage attack on my partner. This goes on and on - and the twirl into the promenade is only one of the situations that arises.

Square dancing has gradually become more sophisticated, with more patterns, and more complicated patterns, and the amount of time allowed for the fancy turns and twirls is becoming less, so that many are being eliminated or simplified. Also, on a crowded floor, as in the Roundup, it is foolhardy to twirl out or cut any fancy didoes - the gal can be swallowed up in an adjoining square, or possibly only a portion of the girl will twirl back. For all of these reasons, the better dancers instinctively feel the need of shortening a given movement for the purpose of time, grace, or lack of room, or of substituting an entirely new movement to replace an old one. (I'm not talking about new basics, but the gradual evolution of a movement; for example, the evolution of the double twirl to the single twirl to the half-turn in the promenade). As a result of this gradual evolution, various modifications of the old methods are being experimented with and are picked up by other dancers, so that we have the present confusion. I don't know which modification my current partner favors, and she doesn't know what I will do. I've used the meeting of partners in the promenade as an example, but there are many others where differences in styling are evident. (Space limitations prevent a long discourse on each one, so I'll make this a two-part article, and go into detail on some of them next month.)

This of course doesn't mean that square dancing is all fouled up or not enjoyable - it merely means that it isn't as smooth and effortless as it could be. Modifications and changes are good and progressive - I have no bone to pick with that. My whole point

(Congratulations on getting this far along)...

is - whatever happened to styling??? Club callers used to teach styling as a matter of course on club workshop nites - and not just his bright ideas, but the styling decided upon by the callers Association or the Dancers Workshop, or by whatever group decides upon that type of standardization. The little research I did just prior to this writing indicates that very little time is spent - and that by only a few callers - on styling. Okay, fellahs - let's get together and decide what we're supposed to do - and then teach me. I don't want private lessons - I want you to teach everybody the same thing, so that the other dancers are correct too. I'm so tired of being the only expert on the floor.

One of the complaints at the Anniversary Dance concerned the Dancers not being able to contact their Delegates for membership cards. Clubs should be sure their Delegate is active in attending club and Association meetings and keeps their club informed of Association activities. Also be sure your Alternate Delegate is available when the regular Delegate is absent.

Each member club in the Association received a notice regarding dues and insurance coverage. Please be sure your returns cover the number of members in your club. Also be sure that it is active members only as our insurance charges are based on active members. So don't pad your membership rolls and make your returns as soon as possible.

With the Golden State Round-up coming closer each day, we urge all Association Clubs to be sure their participation forms have been returned. Remember, many hands make small work. As soon as all returns are in, we can start planning for work assignments. This is your Round-up and your participation will determine its success.

The next meeting of the General Committee will be on Sunday, March 18, 1962 at 1 p.m. Cordial invitations are extended to all Club Presidents to accompany their Delegates to the meeting.
