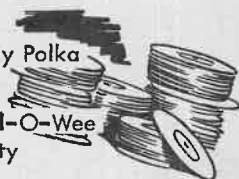

About Freeloaders & Other Creeps

This column is dedicated to the few people who take the trouble to write in and express their opinion of this column in general, or about a specific article, or to suggest I write against some habit they object to in square dancing. In this regard, it is interesting to note that there are more letters screaming against rough dancing than about any other given subject, which is, in essence, the problem of styling which was my thesis for the last two months. The rough-dancing act that brings the most comment is high-kicking. If some of the high-kickers could read the blood-curdling threats that have been written, and realize the fact that most dancers are more bitter and outspoken about this than any other thing, I think they would cease and desist. If the threats were ever carried out against them, they would also cease to exist.

One letter I received last month from a couple had to do with a custom that has practically died out of square dancing - the calling of "mixers". This couple objected to the fact that they were not only broken up as partners but were re-distributed to different squares with their new partners. They make the point that they do not object to being redistributed to another square as partners, but feel that they want to stay together in their dancing. And to quote from their last line: "How about it, what is the general feeling on this - do most couples prefer not to change partners except as part of the call? Or are we the exceptions?".

Dear Mixed Up:

I think you have your answer in past history. The mixer, in squares and particularly in rounds, was once common - until it was found that many couples stopped round dancing because they were separated and had to dance the squares with some one other than their partner. So rounds are practically never progressive today. The same attitude was found in squares, so the mixer is rarely called. I'm with you - with certain exceptions. As you mentioned in your letter, you can understand the procedure in beginners' classes, where it serves a very definite purpose. I will also defend its use within a club, as differentiated from a hoedown. I know callers who use the mixer as a weapon to break up cliques or as a means to spread

the older club members around among a large group of beginners that have joined recently, or just as a change of pace. If used sparingly under these conditions, okay. I do wonder where you ran into this - I haven't seen it for a long time.

Another letter concerning gate-crashers - and the writer was MAD. It concerned three couples specifically, who went to a limited ticket dance and pretended their tickets had been ordered by phone and were to be left at the door. None were there, of course, and the club giving the dance felt sorry for them and let them in - free. This spoiled the whole idea of limiting the ticket sales to keep the crowd down to the capacity of the floor, and also defrauded the club of their admission charge. The writers were objecting primarily because this had been done before, and the club to which the gate-crashing couples belonged was getting a bad name as free-loaders. They also feared the idea would snow-ball.

Dear Mad:

The average square dancer will be inclined to think you are exaggerating the picture a bit, and write the matter off as a tempest in a tea-pot (Say, there's a clever and original phrase. Ed. Note) because there are practically no dancers that would free-load like that. But - the average square dancer would be wrong. At the risk of being hated-because we dislike those who dredge up unpleasant things we prefer to keep buried - I must point out that the situation does exist, that there are a considerable number of dancers who will sneak in without paying, and become very indignant, and sometimes downright nasty, if they are caught and asked to pay. How do I know this? Because I have been active in one capacity or another at every Golden State Round-up from the first to the present - and we found that we have to put guards on the Auditorium side doors to prevent dancers from sneaking in to the roundup without paying. They pretend it is only a joke, but they go to all sorts of fancy maneuvers to get in, such as having friends inside sneak a back door open so as many as eight couples who were patiently waiting outside could sneak in, or going first to the free spectator seats

upstairs, and then coming down with other dancers to the dance floor, without ever going near the ticket takers. I didn't believe it either - but we finally had to face up to the fact that it happened - and to such an extent that it became a large problem. The answer is two-fold: first, the offenders have to stop kidding themselves that it is a "prank", and their admission fee is too small to be missed - the same philosophy a shop-lifter uses when he steals from a large department store; and secondly, the rest of us have to make it very plain that we neither condone nor appreciate the free-loader - and the plainer we make it, the sooner the practice will stop.

So much for the mail bag. I like to get letters, so I can tell if I'm on or off the mark, and don't care if they agree or disagree. Most agree, simply because few people rush up and say, "I rarely read your column - it's lousy." They may think it, but seldom say it - although there are exceptions. (Consider me an exception. Ed. Note.)

No. Calif. Square Dancers Ass'n George Norton

With after parties and a Sunday morning Breakfast to top off a well planned program, every one reported this years Squar Rama one of Fresno's most successful square dance festivals.

One can't help reminiscing, on returning from such an affair, of the many happy hours that were enjoyed, the many

new dancers you faced across a square and the fun and pleasure of reviving old friendships. The information to be gleaned from the panel discussions, for here you have the people who have spent much time in advancing square dancing and certainly have a message for those who will devote the time to listen to them. Here are the ideas that bring new life into your club and help raise the standards of square dancing. Here are the ideas so eagerly sought to develop better leadership in your organization and which will eventually provide more and better square dancing. For those who attend these panels, they never regret the time devoted to them.

Many of the Principal Callers of Association clubs have expressed a desire to attend the Association's General Committee meetings. Either their delegate has not familiarized himself with the Association's constitution and By-Laws, or he has not informed his caller that he is an honorary member of the Association, and as such, is entitled to attend and be recognized on the floor. We feel that many clubs would benefit greatly if their caller attended the General Committee meetings and became better acquainted with some of the problems handled by the Dancer's Association.

Coming in May, at the annual business meeting of the Association, will be the election of officers for the coming fiscal year. It will be the duty of a nominating committee to nominate a slate of officers, from which the General Committee will, with these nominated from the floor, elect its Board of Directors. Also each registered delegate or alternate Delegate to the General Committee may nominate a fellow member who will also be eligible to run for office on the Board of Directors. Recommendations to the nominating committee will be greatly appreciated by them. All delegates are requested to make every effort to attend this important meeting, and if possible, bring their club President with them.

At the last General Committee Meeting, it was brought to the attention of the members that certain Callers had cancelled their calling dates with the clubs at a date too late to allow them to advertise in Square Dance-Where?. Investigation by the Club Services Committee disclosed that in one case, due to a conflict of interests in the club, two separate groups were making ar-

rangements for callers, one group not being aware of what the other group was doing. Another incident was a mixup in dates and was settled to the clubs satisfaction. These incidents are discussed to show the importance of using the Caller Contract forms provided free by your Association for use in filling your calling dates. These contracts provide a simple and concise arrangement where-by dates and financial arrangements are spelled out and there is no last minute misunderstanding to mar your hoedowns. If your Secretary doesn't have a supply in her file, contact your delegate, he probably won't have any either, but he'll get some for you.

Plans for this year's Golden State Round-up continue to progress in rapid fashion. We are pleased to announce that this year's Round-up Breakfast will be held at the Kaiser Center. A fabulous place, beautiful and one that is just right for the discriminating square dancer. Ken & Marge Strehlo of the Aces & Laces will be the Breakfast Chairmen. He will be assisted by members of the Square Pairs and Graham Krackers, with Mr. Square Dance-Where? as emcee. Just get your reservations in early so you won't be missing out on one of the most outstanding Breakfasts in the history of the Golden State Round-up.

This year we are providing an innovation in pre-registration. Registrations will be accepted for individual events, that is, for days or evenings and for either day, with the usual savings by pre-registering for all events. This we hope will eliminate waiting at the ticket window and for badges to be typed. So send in your registrations early and be prepared for one of the best Round-ups you have ever attended.
