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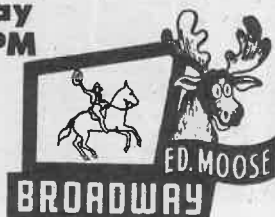

PAZZO-PAZZO

By Ken and Dolly Walker, Westchester, Calif.

RECORD: "Pazzo-Pazzo" - S10 X3125
POSITION: OPEN-FACING, M's R & W's L hands joined, M's back to COH
FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions for M except as indicated

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1-4 WAIT; WAIT; BAL APART; BAL TOGETHER:

Wait 2 meas; Then starting M's L do a two-step balance apart and together swinging joined hands bwd.

DANCE

1-2 AWAY, STEP/STEP; TOGETHER, STEP/STEP:

Swing joined hands fwd & thru between partners while stepping fwd L diag twd COH (W diag twd wall), keeping wt well fwd, step R behind L quickly/step L almost in place; Swing joined hands bwd & thru between ptrs while stepping fwd R diag twd wall (W diag twd COH), step L behind R quickly/step R almost in place. (Styling note: leaning fwd slightly will help your balance here)

3-4 AWAY, STEP/STEP; TOGETHER, STEP/STEP:

Repeat action of Meas 1-2 ending in OPEN-FACING POS, M's R & W's L joined hands raised in an arch, M's back almost to COH.

5-6 LADY UNDER TWO-STEP; AROUND TWO-STEP:

2 fwd two-steps turning RF to end facing RLOD (W does 2 fwd two-steps going under arch & turning LF to end facing RLOD). NOTE: M now on OUTSIDE of circle.

7-8 MAN UNDER TWO-STEP; AROUND TWO-STEP:

2 fwd two-steps going under arch & continuing to turn RF to end facing wall in OPEN-FACING POS (W does 2 fwd two-steps turning LF to end facing COH).

9-16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8 ending in OPEN POS facing LOD

17-18 FWD, 2; STEP, SWING HOP:

Walk fwd LOD L,R; L, swing R fwd while hopping on L and arching body slightly bwd to accent effect.

19-20 BACK, 2; FACE, TOUCH:

Step bwd RLOD R,L; Step bwd & Pivot on R to face ptr (M's back to COH), touch L.

21-22 APART, 2; CLOSE, CHUG:

Back away from ptr (M twd COH) L,R; Close L to R, chug.

23-24 TOGETHER, 2; TURN, STEP:

Walk fwd twd ptr L,R; Step fwd and pivot on L to face LOD assuming SEMI-OPEN POS, step fwd R in LOD but almost in place.

25-26 STEP FWD, SWINGHOP; STEP BWD, SWINGHOP:

Step fwd L, swing R fwd while hopping on L and arching body slightly bwd; Step bwd on R, swing L bwd while hopping on R and bending body slightly fwd.

27-28 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 25-26 ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

29-30 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP:

In semi-closed pos do 2 fwd two-steps in LOD.

31-32 TWIRL, 2; 3, 4:

W does ONE RF twirl prog LOD under M's L & W's R hands as M accompanies her down LOD L,R; L,R.

33-40 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 25-32 then change hands to M's R, W's L for balance step to follow.

41-42 BAL APART; BAL TOGETHER:

Repeat action of Meas. 3-4 of Introduction.

DANCE GOES THRU THREE TIMES but on last time thru finish with a QUICK BOW and CURTSY after completing Measure 40.

★ Choose a Panel- ★

BOB BARTHOL

This month I'd like to strike a blow for the friendless, and propose the establishment for the protection, care, and feeding of underprivileged panels. Panels are a long-time part of the square dance picture at the Golden State Round-up, National and State Conventions, and other large festivals, but these do-it-yourself courses in problem-solving are far and away the most sparsely attended attractions of the whole affair. Pity the poor moderator and panelists, who grin bravely as they look over the long rows of empty chairs, and handle the panel for a small, loyal, and determined group of friends and relatives, and people who wandered by in the mistaken belief they had found the Hospitality Room. Why aren't they better attended? The subject matters are usually interesting and timely, and often the moderator and panelists are tops in their fields, with a real message to deliver. It is not the fault of the dancers in this area alone, because at the National Convention, where up to 18,000 leaders and dancers congregate, panel attendance may go from 150 down to 25 or 30 - out of 18,000!!

Instead of sadly shaking our heads because the average dancer doesn't rush in to take advantage of all the goodies presented, maybe a good hard look at the reasons for this apathy might be in order. I think the fault lies more with the planners than the dancers - and before the planners prepare the tar and feathers for yours truly, may I state that I know you've worked hard and long to prepare an interesting and instructive program, and can't herd the dancers into the panel at gunpoint. However, if I manufacture the finest product obtainable, but fail to advertise it, put it in an unattractive package, and then hide it on a rear shelf in a back room, I'll just betcha it's not a best seller! And that's about par for the course in handling panels. I'll wager that not 10% of the dancers at the Golden State Round-up could name any panel being offered, and not many more know they are being offered at all.

I think the main ingredient missing is advertising. I know they are shown on the program schedule, but who remembers a panel when he's in the midst of square dancing? I've missed some I really wanted to attend by not watching the time. I think a brief explanation of the subject matter of the panel,

along with a quick recital of the background of the moderator and/or panelists, should be in the program, because no one will attend unless some interest in the subject matter or the personalities involved can be generated. But let's recognize another fact - that a large proportion of the dancers do not read any more of the program than is necessary to find out who the featured callers are. Therefore, an announcement of the panel and personalities should be made over the mike a short time before the panel is scheduled, to at least acquaint the dancers with the opportunity, and then another announcement at the scheduled time, so those who are interested can wander off to the meeting room. Certainly a few one- or two-minute announcements spread over a two-day span would not throw any schedules out, but could double or triple the attendance.

Another factor that works against any large attendance is the time of day that is usually allotted to the panel. A panel scheduled during the height of the big evening program is not desirable, and is never done, but the panel should not be set for 9:00 a.m. on Sunday morning, either. In the first instance, no one wants to go and miss the high dancing point of the whole affair, and in the second instance, no one is around to attend - or if they are around, it is in body only - the spirit is still in bed. For some reason, the planners use panels to fill up time where there is nothing else doing - like the early morning hours. This makes the program look full and complete, but it is only on paper. If the planners thought of their own reactions to dragging their exhausted little bodies to the hall before sun-up, to say nothing of the bitter fight and family upheaval it requires to get their ever-loving - but pooped - spouse to join this doomed journey, they might reconsider the timing.

And then there is the unquestioned fact that most dancers go to dance, not get educated. They cannot fathom why some donkey wants to sit and argue with other donkeys about some esoteric phase of the movement when they could be dancing to Horatio Hot - hash from Pothole, Wyoming. However, I submit that most of these dancers will go and sit on the sidelines to rest - and engage in the same discussions that are going on in the

panels, without the benefit of some pretty solid experts that are leading the discussion across the hall. I don't mean that all dancers should attend every panel, because some are of value to only a certain segment. I would not normally attend a dressmaking panel, because my interest tends toward what is in the dress, not in the preparation of the fancy package. But I do suggest that you take a look at what is being offered, and if it is of interest to you - or your club - that you at least try one on for size. The next chance you get will be at the Golden State Round-up. Give it a whirl.

At the Round-up where all of us meet
Choose a panel and go take a seat
If no knowledge you gain
It won't be in vain
At least you'll be resting your feet.

We are pleased to announce that the liability insurance provided to member clubs in the Association now covers traveling time to and from club activities. This item was added at the request of members who felt that it was a desirable addition to our insurance.

Our attention is frequently called to certain clubs and callers who consistently schedule fifth Saturday dances in opposition to the Association Stampedes. The clubs derive all the benefits that accrue to the organized square dance groups in the area without contributing their share or support. They may be likened to scavengers who pick up the leavings from the organized clubs. These clubs might be termed "Scavenger Clubs" from this practice and certainly do very little

good for organized square dancing in the area. We mention this only as a reminder to Association clubs that their support of Association activities is important in bringing square dancing to its highest level, both for the clubs and the dancers.

The State Convention in San Jose, climaxed by three days of torrid dancing, was termed a huge success by the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancer's Association, hosts for the event. An estimated 700 squares turned out on Saturday night to fill the Exposition Building and the new Pavilion Hall.
