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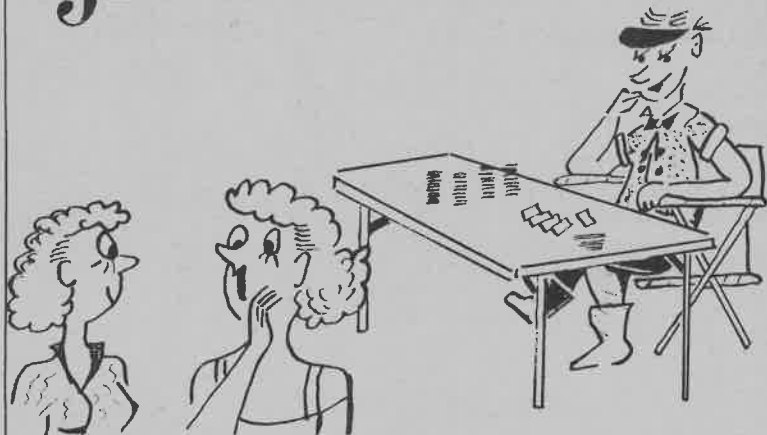

The Better Way of Life

Hardened readers of this column probably have gotten the glimmering of an idea that I'm interested in square dancing, which is rather perceptive of them. Actually, I'm not only interested in square dancing but in square dancers - especially the pretty ones, (Me? Ed. Note.) and I'm also endlessly fascinated by our philosophy and customs. In the past, I've commented on some of the peculiarities and habits we have, but have never tried to analyze why square dancing has such a far-reaching effect on the lives of so many people. The simple act of dancing alone could not hold the absorbing interest it does for so many people for so long a time, and we have previously discussed some of the other factors that make it so much fun - the companionship, the laughter, the intangible spirit of square dancers. But let's enter a new field of inquiry: did you ever stop to think how square dancing has changed the lives and personalities of its devotees?

Suppose we take a telephone directory, riffle the pages, pick one hundred names at random, and gather those people in one place. Most will be conservative, somewhat shy, non-aggressive personalities who normally go to great lengths to avoid attracting attention to themselves. Now ask some of them to go out and play a couple of sets of tennis in front of a crowd of spectators - and they'll go wall-eyed with fright and embarrassment. Dress a few couples in fancy and colorful costumes and send them into a restaurant - and they'll feel like lady Godiva without the protection of a horse. Assign some of them (who have never planned anything larger than a family picnic) to start from scratch and plan and handle a public affair involving hundreds of people and hundreds, or even thousands, of dollars - and they'll panic and run screaming for the hills. Request them to step forward and volunteer to give up a few evenings and Sundays to plan activities and solve problems for other people, mentioning the fact that it involves hiring baby-sitters and driving a

lot of miles to and from the meetings - and they'll recoil against the far wall in speechless indignation. Pull this kind of stuff and your voice will be echoing hollowly around the empty hall, while all our irate one hundred will be home regaling their unbelieving friends with tales about some kind of nut who made such outrageous and impossible demands upon them.

But.... instead of making all these unthinkable requests, let's form this ill-assorted and stand-offish group into a beginner's class, and mold them into square dancers. In a remarkably short time, this same group will be doing all the things they would have considered ridiculous and impossible a short time before, without being asked - and loving it! They not only perform before crowds, but eagerly seize the opportunity - and complain if the crowd isn't large enough. They flock into restaurants in their fanciest duds, proudly and at ease. They plan and handle hoedowns, stampedes, round-ups, and state conventions, and not only feel confident, but often show up the professionals. They serve on committees, boards, and panels, paint back-drops, hang banners, sweep floors, carry tons of equipment, and work like dogs - unpaid, unsung, and happy.

I maintain that these people will never be the same again. Through the medium of their square dance activities - not just square dancing - they have uncovered latent abilities and talents they had no idea they possessed. They have tasted the joys of giving free rein to the unadulterated ham in themselves that was impossible to release before, and feel not the least bit self-conscious. Most of us don't realize, until we think back, of the self-confidence, the social skills, the organizing and speaking abilities, that have been developed in us. Think of the astronomical increase we have all made in the number of our friends in a few short years - many who had only half a dozen social friends in the past now count them by the dozens, and see them more often. I think this growth in our individual personalities, and the satisfaction derived therefrom, has a lot to do with the king-size and long-burning enthusiasm of square dancers for their hobby. And how can we help but utilize these new-found skills and con-

fidence in our outside life! (What outside life? Ed. Note.) I think this is what people mean when they say, "Square dancing is a way of life". This is taking in a wee bit too much territory, but can we doubt that square dancing has given us a better way of life?

No. Calif. Square Dancers Ass'n George Norton

At the State Council Meeting in Los Angeles in April, the first Teen-Age Association was admitted to the State Council as an Associate Member. While an Associate member is limited in their participation in the affairs of the Council, it does allow them to attend the Council Meetings and participate in discussions. The Teen-agers should gain much valuable experience and be able to return to their own associations with many interesting items of information. Teen-age square dancing in the southern part of the State is enjoying a very active growth and they have many talented groups that have performed at National and State Conventions over the past years.

One very interesting bit of information discussed at the State Council Meeting was a bid by the South Coast Association of Long Beach to host the National Convention in Long Beach in 1964. This will allow, if South Coast is successful, a great many people on the pacific coast an opportunity to attend a National Convention right in their own back yard.

At the invitation of the Horseman's Association, a number of square dancers from Association Clubs put on an exhibition square dance for the benefit of foreign students attending the University of California. This program was arranged to acquaint these students with some of the early history of the west. In addition to the square dancing, there were exhibitions by the Shriners Mounted Patrol, The Sheriff's Mounted Posse, a Gun and Rope exhibition and an authentic Stage Coach used in the early days as a means of transportation, and which was fill-

ed with many of our own square dancers as it circled the arena. Our thanks to Ed Kettwig, Director of District #7 for his efforts in arranging the square dance portion of the program.

Our recent article concerning clubs who do not belong to an Association and schedule fifth Saturday dances caused certain of the clubs to defend their position. This is as it should be for any club who does not belong to an Association should feel free to hold such dances. But we also stick by our original contention that square dancing has come as far as it has through the organized Associations who work to keep the best and weed out the inferior. One has only to travel and dance in those areas where no organization exists to realize the vast difference between the two types of square dancing. We can point to California, noted as one of the outstanding areas in square dancing, with its material sent to all parts of the country to realize what strong Associations have done to bring square dancing to its present level. Clubs who do not belong to an Association reap these benefits without doing their share of the work. In almost all areas, Associations of Square Dance clubs have followed the example of the Northern California Association in holding their Associations dances on the fifth Saturday. They do this so that they will not interfere with the regular Saturday night hoedowns of member clubs. We should also point out that we do not refer in our article to Party Night held by non-member clubs, but only to large, well advertised Hoedowns which are aimed at only one thing, to attract those who do not attend the fifth Saturday dances sponsored by the Associations.

We will again return to the Richmond Auditorium for our June Stampede in the Bay area with Earl Johnston coming all the way from Connecticut to do the honors. Earl as you will recall was one of the featured callers at the 1960 Golden State Round-up. The Peninsula area will hold their Stampede at the San Mateo Fairground with a new and outstanding caller. New to this area, and as outstanding as the late Mary Shilling. We refer to Bob Ferraud from Indio, Calif.

This seems a most appropriate time to express our thanks to the many committees, callers, clubs and dancers for their help in making the 9th Annual Golden State Round-up a success. The Round-up is the joint re-

responsibility of every club in the Association and it is only through their help that a Round-up can be successfully put on. Again, as in the past, everyone pitched in to help and we enjoyed another wonderful Golden State Round-up. So to everyone who helped so wonderfully, and to the many dancers who supported our efforts, go our most sincere thanks and appreciation for their help.

Dear Editor,

Back when I used to be in Bob Barthol's shoes, searching frantically each month for a new idea for a column, people would say to me, "I just love your column - I agree with almost everything you say!" Sensing a real controversy coming up, I'd eagerly demand to know what particular things they did not agree with - but no one would ever tell me. What a disappointment! So I made a promise to myself - I would never write in and comment on Bob's articles until he said something I could honestly disagree with, and then I'd come right out and say what it was. Deadlines being what they are, and there being no one on my tail pushing me, I am just now getting around to disagreeing with Bob's column in the February issue, in which he wants to legislate on the subject of twirls.

Now don't get me wrong (to coin a phrase). I am all for Standardization, whenever it affects the traffic pattern. I am in favor of all passing right shoulders on a Pass Thru, and I am against twirling your girl between each two hands on a Grand Right and Left, while everyone else has to stop and wait for you. I am in favor of 'Cross Trail Thru' meaning the same thing in both ends of California, and I will never forget the shock of dancing in Dallas and finding out, the hard way, that in that one area they do 'All Around your Left Hand Lady' backwards - the man goes toward the center. Fortunately, the effect of all the Magazines and Workshop Notes and Travelling Callers has been to cut down regional differences like that and make it possible to dance anywhere without getting too confused.

But Square Dancing is supposed to be 'Fun' (where have I heard that before?) Unlike the Ballet or the Chorus Line, Square dancers come in all shapes and sizes, and all ages, and if we are all going to dance together and do the important parts of the calls right, we are going to have to allow a little give and take. Sure - I'll go along with Bob and standardize the number and speed of twirls, providing he'll standardize them the way I like it -- very few. But suppose (as is quite possible) I am in the minority? Suppose the vote goes in favor of twirling every time you meet, and twice when you get home? And on top of that, suppose the floor is sticky?

A couple of tips like that, and I'm thru for the night. But I don't want to keep all those young sprouts from letting off steam by twirling whenever they have time - more power to them. As long as they stay within the time limit the Caller gives them, and don't delay the game, I don't care what they do. Square Dancing is not a spectator sport - we don't have to 'look good', unless we are giving an exhibition, which is another story.

Bob's real complaint seems to be that he hates to have to make decisions all the time. In the first place, the decision to twirl or not to twirl is none of his business - the girl has to do all the work, so she should choose. We do try to make our choice obvious - we can't help it if Bob is a little slower on the uptake than the rest of the men. Maybe instead of demanding more standardization of styling, Bob should be asking for signals from the women that even he could understand.

Much as I hate to do it, I'll have to agree with Bob on that 'Alamo Style' business. Personally, I prefer the 'Hands Up' style on a

real Alamo, or on an Ocean Wave unless it is going to be followed by a Right and Left Thru or a Square Thru. As the dancers cannot tell what is coming next, I think it is up to the Caller to cue them - 'Alamo Style with the Hands Up High' - when he wants it done that way. Then it becomes his problem.

I have one more comment on styling. When I am helping out at a Beginner Class, I am careful to do each thing exactly as the Caller is teaching it, and I twirl when he says to. If I am in a Square of fairly new dancers, I try to execute each movement properly, to help them along. But when I am dancing with people I assume are as experienced as I am, I feel free to take liberties with all sorts of things, knowing that individual styling will not upset them. Even then, if the Square is being challenged to the limit of its powers, I get careful again - cutting up is not funny when it breaks up the Square. I think that one of the criteria of a good dancer is the ability to judge when to dance properly and smoothly, and when to relax and take it easy. Let's have Standardization, by all means, but not Regimentation.
