ROUND DANCE of the MONTH GOLDEN GATE WALTZ

RECORD: "Golden Gate Waltz" - Grenn #14040

POSITION: Intro-Open-Facing, M's R & W's L hands joined, M's bk to COH.
Dance - Same as for Intro.

FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout, directions for M except where indicated for W.

INTRO: 4 Meas. WAIT; WAIT; BAL APART, POINT, -; SIDE, DRAW, -;

MEASURES

- 1-4 WALTZ AWAY, 2,3; WALTZ IN, 2,3 (To face RLOD); ON AROUND, 2,3 (To face LOD); MANUEVER, 2,3, (To Closed Pos);
In OPEN POS start M's L waltz slightly away from ptr LRL moving in LOD; waltz twd ptr & LOD by stepping fwd on M's R, to side twd LOD on L turning to face ptr, close R to L at the same time change hands to M's L & W's R & face RLOD; stepping bwd twd LOD on L & releasing hands, ptrs turn out & around (M R-face, W L-face) M steps RL; continuing on around twd LOD ptrs manuv to take CP with M's bk to LOD in 3 steps RLR;
- 5-8 WALTZ TURN, 2,3; WALTZ TURN, 2,3; WALTZ TURN, 2,3; TWIRL, 2,3 (To Open Pos);
In CP starting bwd on M's L do 3 R-face turning waltzes prog LOD; twirl the W R-face under the M's L & W's R hands as the M moves alongside RLR to end in OPEN POS facing LOD;
- 9-16 REPEAT Meas 1-8 except to end in BUTTERFLY POS with M facing ptr & LOD at end of twirl.
- 17-20 TWINKLE OUT, 2,3; TWINKLE IN, 2,3; TWINKLE OUT, 2,3; CROSS, TCH, - (To Butterfly Banjo);
In BUTTERFLY POS starting M's L do 3 twinkle steps moving diag out twd wall & LOD then diag in twd COH & LOD (M XIF, W XIB); at end of 3rd twinkle step the M steps R across L twd COH & LOD, tch L beside R, hold 1 count (slightly Banjo Butterfly pos);
- 21-24 TWINKLE OUT, 2,3; TWINKLE IN, 2,3; TWINKLE OUT, 2,3; CROSS, TCH, - (to Closed);
Starting M's L repeat twinkle steps moving in RLOD (M XIB, W XIF); at end of 3rd twinkle step M cross R XIB of L, tch L beside R & at the same time take CP, hold 1 count to end M facing LOD & ptr;
- 25-28 BAL BK, -, -; WALTZ FWD TO SEMI-CLOSED, 2,3; WALTZ FWD, 2,3; THRU, SIDE, CLOSE (To Closed);
In CP M bal bk twd RLOD on L, hold 2 cts; starting fwd on M's R do 1 waltz fwd in LOD RLR to SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD (W steps bk on L starting to turn R-face, steps side on R completing turn, closes L to R); in SEMI-CLOSED POS waltz fwd in LOD LRL; both do a thru, side, close (M RLR) to CP to end with M's bk to COH;
- 29-32 BAL BK, -, -; WALTZ MANUV, 2,3; WALTZ TURN, 2,3; TWIRL, 2,3; (To Open Pos)
In CP with M's bk to COH, bal back on L, hold 2 cts; starting fwd on M's R do a waltz manuv making a 1/4 R-face turn to end with M's bk twd LOD RLR; starting bk on M's L do 1 R-face waltz turn LRL; twirl the W R-face in 3 steps as M moves fwd in LOD alongside to end in OPEN POS facing LOD RLR;
- DANCE IS DONE A TOTAL OF THREE TIMES, AT END OF MEAS 31 ON THIRD TIME THRU, TWIRL THE W (Slow Twirl) AS THE MUSIC RETARDS, CHANGE HANDS, BOW & CURTSY..

LOOKING BACK

This is being written after the 9th Golden State Roundup whooped its way into history, and I retain many of the little vignettes that added flavor to the scene. It was very easy to spot the newer dancers on the floor, and brought back memories of when I was a brand-new dancer. (The difference between then and now is scarcely visible. Ed.Note.) The soul-shattering awakenings of a new dancer attending his first large dance, away from the protective arms of his own group and teacher, are never forgotten, but are the experiences necessary to the emergence of a competent dancer. These first-timers usually congregate near the back of the hall and don't venture far from the walls, so they can retire in disorderly panic without attracting too much attention. They are, of course, certain that everyone's eyes are upon them and feel very self-conscious if they goof, which is practically inevitable.

I recall our first venture into the "big-time", after we had been dancing a short time. We were already accomplished dancers, having put on an exhibition at a ball-room dance given by the Dad's club of an elementary school. As a member in more or less good standing in the Dad's club, but not being present at a meeting and unable to defend myself, I was appointed Chairman in charge of furnishing entertainment for the dance. Therefore, I collected a square of our best dancers, of which, naturally, I was a member (This gives you a rough idea of the calibre of the entertainment. Ed. Note.) and we practiced "Down Yonder" over and over again before the appointed time. Our own caller called, and we did fine - only one or two goofs and the square kept going. There was tumultuous applause - square dancing was still pretty new in the area - and flushed with success, we considered hiring ourselves out as a professional exhibition group. It was shortly thereafter that our caller told us about Stampedes, and suggested we attend as a square. This

intrigued us as a new field to conquer, and on a Saturday nite, off we went.

Our first shock was finding there were thirty squares, about 26 more than we had ever seen, and a caller we had never seen, heard, or heard of, before (we knew of four callers at the time), but we moved confidently and happily on to the floor, right smack in the middle of the group, and the caller started. We got through the bow to the partner and corner, allemande left, grand right and left, ten seconds of murderous collisions somewhere in the vicinity of where the center of our set had been - and then returned to our original positions. He called so **FAST!** We waited, and on the next allemande left - which was the next call we even recognized - off we went again, dancing beautifully through the following grand right and left - and then returned to position. All I recall of the Stampede was allemande lefts, grand right and lefts, panicky and useless maneuvering in the center, and standing in position. We tried two tips and slunk off home, mumbling to ourselves.

Of course, more experience took care of this (Wanna bet? Ed.Note.) but it took that horrifying debacle to bring us down to earth and show us what we really knew and what we didn't. Knowing how and what to do is one thing, when you are being carefully shepherded through by your own teacher, but having it thrown at you by a stranger with no regard for whether you get it or not is another. I suffered for the new ones at the Roundup, as they went through the same experiences, but also felt proud that they were out there trying.

Have you ever noticed the varying reactions of different individuals to this experience? Some get tight-lipped and tend to flare up at the mistakes of their partner or others in the square, some get red-faced and wish they were home watching television, some go blindly ahead, their minds a complete blank, mercifully numbed by shock, and others, the kind I like best, start to giggle like school-girls, or collapse with helpless laughter at their utter rout. I like these because they have the spirit of square dancing - a sense of humor, the ability to laugh at ourselves, the recognition that this is fun, not a prize contest.

The experienced dancer would do well to recall his own early days and the periods of discouragement that attend the gradual evolution from beginner to old pro. Many of us are still dancing because some compassionate older dancer or caller gave us words of encouragement that kept us trying. The thing that upsets the newer dancer as much as anything is the feeling that he is spoiling it for the others when he goofs up, which adds pressure to the point that makes it impossible for him to do anything right. They also tend to believe that any trouble in the square was caused by them, not realizing that the others may foul up a call too. And to the shame of some of the older dancers, they always blame the poor beginner for the mess, often unjustly. If beginners are in your square, and the square resembles a herd of stampeding cattle after about 15 seconds, don't get tight-lipped, but grin and help them get going again. Others did it for you, remember?

One of the most encouraging experiences for a beginner is for the couple to be split up among three expert couples, and be brought through a complete tip without their usual helpless confusion. When they bollix it up, the experienced couples can smoothly keep them going, sometimes by a split-second rearranging of the square, and the new dancer suddenly realizes the fun and satisfaction of good dancing, and a new world opens up. They also discover the secret to keeping a square going after it breaks down - that the couples may have to be rearranged as to partners and positions, each one falling into his new part automatically without stopping. The learning process is greatly accelerated by the tactful and sympathetic help of experienced dancers, and often it is done by a complete stranger to the beginner. Every one of us owes that responsibility to those among us that are having trouble, not by lecturing or trying to "teach", but merely helping them over the tough spots as unobtrusively and tactfully as possible.

I personally follow this rule, and even after all these years, you will often see me in a square with Ferrario, patiently helping him through, murmuring words of encouragement. ("You bum!" can hardly be called 'words of encouragement'. Ed. Note.) Few of you realize what sacrifici-

ces I make for my art. It's hardly worth the coaching fee his wife secretly pays me.

No. Calif. Square Dancers Ass'n George Norton

Many of our Square Dancers have requested information regarding means of finding out where to square dance at the World's Fair in Seattle... We have been informed that an answering service for square dancers has been provided by the Central Puget Sound Council. The number to call while in Seattle is Ma. 2-0600. All square dancers visiting in the area are invited to use this service for square dance information.

The last year has seen a number of new clubs join the Association, bringing our total membership up to 103 clubs. To the new clubs we want to call their attention to the fact that they are covered by Liability Insurance carried under a blanket coverage by the Association. This liability insurance is free to member clubs, but to have medical coverage they must carry this themselves. The charge through the Association Insurance agent, JOHN CAMPBELL is only 75¢ a member, a year. Many clubs have been providing their members with this Insurance by holding Hoedowns to raise the money to pay the premium, thereby saving their members this additional expense. For further information on Medical coverage, call JOHN CAMPBELL at LY. 1-7151 in San Carlos.

At the last General Committee Meeting it was voted to hold an Anniversary Dance in place of the 5th Saturday dance on December 29th. This will leave the Association Clubs free to hold dances on this 5th Saturday, whether they are New Year's Eve dances or just plain hoedowns. The Anniversary dance is tentatively scheduled to be held on Sunday, January 6th, 1963. Don't forget that you are going to be asked to select ten callers from among those calling for Association Clubs, to call at the Anniversary dance, and ballots will be mailed later in the year for you to indicate your selection.

The Association feels that it owes a vote of thanks to the Callers who have so generously given of their time to call at

the dances that have followed our Association General Committee meetings. This year the Board of Directors have striven for a closer tie between Callers and Dancers through joint Liaison Officers, and feel that efforts to make our meetings more appealing to the delegates have been ably assisted through the generous help extended by the Callers.

Each club in the Association should have the latest copy of the corrected Constitution and By-Laws with an attached list of Standing Rules. At the last meeting of The General Committee, the By-Laws Committee presented their compiled list of Standing Rules, together with suggested additions. We feel that the Committee has done an outstanding job on a difficult assignment, and are to be commended for their work.

As the term of office for the Officers of the Association draws to a close, and new Officers stand ready to assume their duties for the ensuing year, one can't help but look back over the year which passed all too quickly, ending in the Grand Finale of what we hoped was a successful year for the Association and another Great Golden State Round-up. Many of our efforts were successful, some not so successful. But the many new friends and acquaintances we made while working with the different clubs and organizations more than repaid our heartaches and toil after the year. So, while we are sorry to see our term come to an end so quickly, we are happy that someone else will have the privilege and the pleasure of directing the Association, and the opportunity to meet so many nice people like yourselves, the wonderful and friendly SQUARE DANCER.
