Vacation time is like Christmas time - we look forward to it eagerly, but the effort expended in preparation sometimes makes me wonder if it's all worthwhile. As we again prepare to disappear into the wilds of the High Sierras at Echo Lake, faithful readers will recall my last summer's article on our annual tribulations caused by Jane's frantic packing around Christmas Time - packing for our summer vacation, that is. (She also starts wrapping Xmas gifts about January, for the following Xmas. Some time she's going to lap herself and get two Xmas' ahead.) Anyway, we're all packed and ready to go - next week - and every thing I need for this week is unavailable. My little helpmate is particularly pleased this year, because we acquired a boat and trailer we're gonna drag up there. Pleased because we have the use of a big new boat to whip around the blue waters? Nope - she's happy because we have all that lovely space she can use to pack things. She has some fascinating theories on packing that are years ahead of their time. I'd offer her services to Cape Canaveral except the personnel manager would go into orbit after he heard her ideas. For example: Did you know that objects packed inside of other objects so they take up no more space also do not add weight? Same with objects hidden out of sight under seats. The result is that this year I have to put overload springs on the overload springs I put on last year. Of course, the boat being dragged up the mountains has no weight either, because it isn't in the car - see? This will be the only boat to sink in the middle of Highway 50.

With two desperate bailers, we set a record last year of remaining afloat for 18 minutes. Unfortunately, we were bucking a head wind at the time and were still in the middle of the lake when we went under. Frank & Carolyn Hamilton, who have a place on the lake and a big powerful boat, rescued us and I've never lived it down. Imagine a square dancer being rescued by - if you'll excuse the expression - round dance instructors. The #3 boat is a two-place kayak which immediately turns up-side down when two men are in it, but sails dutifully along when occupied by my wife and daughter. I once tried to point out that it had something to do with the center of gravity being much lower when she is aboard, as all my weight is in my shoulders. For the next three days I became the Hermit of Echo Lake. The last boat is - or was - a small hydroplane which was too slow for the younger set and too fast for me. It also leaked, and was later used as a minnow bucket, then was finally buried with full military honors in the wood stove. The insurance company valued the entire fleet at 98¢. (Riding his boats is like reading his column - you only try it once. Ed. Note.)
