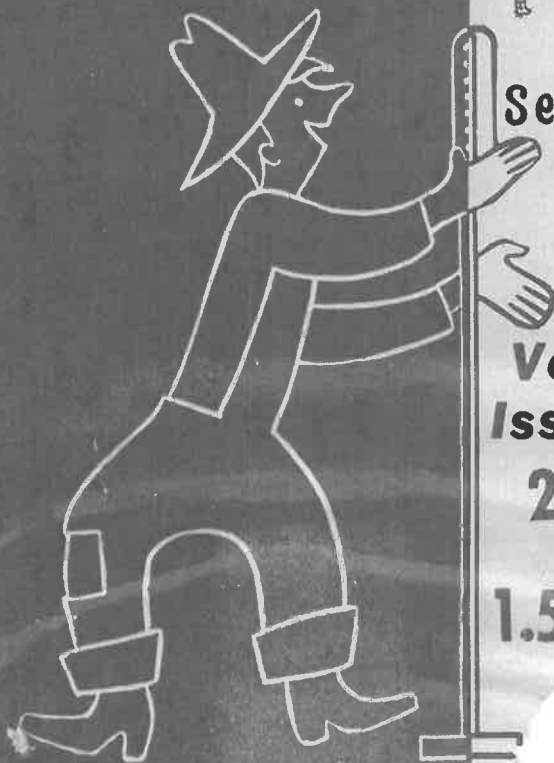

RECORD: "Peggy" Windsor 4674 (Peg O' My Heart)

POSITION: Open-Facing, M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined

FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout; steps described are for the M

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

- 1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER (to Semi-Closed), -, TOUCH, -;

Wait 2 meas in Open-Facing Pos; Step L bwd away from ptr twd COH, hold 1 ct, point R toe fwd to floor twd ptr, hold 1 ct; Step R fwd twd ptr assuming SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD, hold 1 ct. touch L toe beside R, hold 1 ct.

DANCE

- 1 - 4 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH; ON, 2, 3, BRUSH (face); (Closed) DIP IN, -, RECOVER, -;
(Quick) PIVOT, 2, 3, (to Semi-Closed), BRUSH;

In Semi-Closed Pos start L and take 3 light running steps fwd LOD, brush R fwd while dipping slightly on L knee; Start R and take 3 light running steps fwd LOD, brush L fwd and CW around in a small flare while turning 1/4 R to face ptr and wall; Taking CLOSED POS dip bwd twd COH on L, hold 1 ct, recover by stepping fwd twd wall on R, hold 1 ct; Do a quick 3/4 R CP cpl pivot L, R, L into SEMI-CLOSED POS, brushing R thru twd LOD on last ct (taking no wt on R).

- 5 - 8 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH (Slow) TWIRL, -, 2, - (to Butterfly); L BK PAS LE BASQUE, R BK PAS DE BASQUE; ROLL, 2, 3, THRU (to Butterfly);

In Semi-Closed Pos repeat action of Meas 1 starting M's R; As M walks fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, R - W twirls 3/4 R under her R & his L hand R. L ending in BUTTERFLY POS M's bk to COH; Do a back Pas de Basque stepping M's L swd, quickly across behind on R, in place on L, hold; Starting M's R repeat the PdB to R; Swing rear hands thru and release for solo roll away from ptr down LOD in 3 steps as M turns L & W turns R to momentarily face ptr as you step thru on M's R on 4th ct in Butterfly Pos.

- 9 - 12 CIRCLE AWAY, 2, 3, FLARE; TOG, 2, 3, TCH (Butterfly); VINE, 2, 3, TCH; WRAP, 2, 3, TCH (face out);

Ptrs continue turn away from each other this time in a small circle as M steps L, R, L, flares R around to face wall; Continue the circle back to ptr R, L, R, and tch L as ptrs assume BUTTERFLY POS M's bk twd COH; Grapevine along LOD (step L swd, Step R XIB of L, step L swd, tch R beside L -- W XIB also); Both handholds are retained as M steps small swd R, close L, swd R, and tchs L moving RLOD raising his R & her L as W wraps 1/2 L moving RLOD on L, R, L ending in Wrap Pos on M's R side facing wall -- his R arm around W's waist joined with her L & his L & her R joined in front.

- 13 - 16 UNWRAP, 2, 3, TCH; CHG SIDES, 2, 3, TCH (Butterfly); SIDE, TCH, SIDE, TCH; CHG SIDES, -, 2, - (SCP);

As M steps L, R, L, and touches R in place, ptrs release his L & her R handhold as W unwraps twd wall turning 1/2 R in front of M with R, L, R, tch L to face at arms' length with M's R & W's L joined; Ptrs change sides under joined hands in 3 steps as M turns 1/2 R with R, L, R, tch L & W turns 1/2 L into BUTTERFLY POS M facing COH; M steps swd RLOD on L, tchs R, swd on R, tchs L; Maintaining same handhold -- his R & her L -- change sides again in 2 slow steps L, -, R, - to end in SCP facing LOD.

DANCE GOES THRU FOUR TIMES -- On last time on Meas 32, the final change sides is done in two quick steps L, R as ptrs change to M's R & W's L handhold and step apart in usual B & C.

SOCIABILITY VERSUS DANCING

Two months ago I touched upon the subject of the beginners and the problems they have in morale when they foul up a square and feel self-conscious. This subject has been discussed, written about, and researched for years, and all sorts of answers have been developed. It is always assumed that additional experience in dancing will finally solve the problem, and eventually the beginners will take their place in the ranks of experienced dancers. This is normally true - a beginner in any field can be furnished formal training in whatever art he is to learn, but only by field experience does he become competent, for classroom training is of necessity somewhat sheltered and divorced from the cruel outside world. But what of those not inconsiderable numbers that never do become really competent dancers but remain with us to lower the level of our squares and clubs? We all know couples like this, sometimes the backbone and mainstay of the club, the most regular in attendance, the hardest workers, - and the lousiest dancers. More often they are not the backbone of the club, but merely members. What do we do with these people, or, indeed, can we do anything with them. Nobody ever writes about this, although they are more of a problem than the beginner, because a beginner can be expected to improve, but these people only get worse, by a normal process that is inevitable.

Here's how that process works: One of the standard cliches in square dancing is that we do not pick a square, but dance with everyone on a random basis. In theory this is wonderful - in practice it is rarely done consistently, even if we try. Poorer dancers are self-conscious about squaring up with the good dancers - afraid they will foul up the square and afraid of being embarrassed, so they tend to join up with others like themselves, and therefore perpetuate their mistakes. But another factor enters here - the poorer dancer is apt to be the last to drag himself off the sidelines, by

which time the better dancers have hit the floor and squared up, so again, he dances with others like himself. This is also sometimes the cause of the unfair complaint that the better dancers freeze him out and set up their own squares. Watch this in a club sometimes - the "good" dancers don't set up the squares - they are merely more eager and get their squares formed while the others are finishing their coffee or conversation.

This is the old vicious circle - or should that be "vicious square" - because the guys who need the experience of dancing in competent squares quite often deliberately avoid just that - so they fall farther and farther behind. This is the process I mean - but how can it be reversed?

First, why are they poor dancers? Sometimes the answer to this gives us the solution. Quite often it is because they have not been thoroughly trained, either because of an inadequate teacher, or because they were slower than average in picking up the skills (and some of our best brains are the slowest in learning to dance). Others are poor because they dance so infrequently they don't remember the patterns well enough to react quickly. Still others, and the smallest percentage by far, are tone-deaf, lack a sense of rhythm, or are so poorly-coordinated that they are unable to master the physical skill necessary. (It is from this group that we get our Callers. Ed. Note.) (He's a liar - I never said that. Ed. Note.) The first group can be rather easily brought up to standard if the club leaders understand the problem - and are actually leaders. The last group can be salvaged, and brought up to at least adequate level. The middle group - the infrequent dancers - will probably remain a problem, simply because they do not have sufficient interest to respond to treatment. Let's be realistic - in modern square dancing, with the constant addition of new and complicated material, the occasional dancer is just not going to keep up. By occasional dancer, I don't mean only the couple that comes intermit-

tently, but the term also includes the couples that may attend every session, but rarely get on the floor to dance. Every club has these couples who attend for the companionship and regard the dancing as incidental. These will never be dancers, because they don't care.

How do we raise the level of the first and third groups? Due to the Editor's stingy policy as to space allowed for this column, these two groups will just have to remain inadequate for another month, at which time I have a couple of suggestions. Do you think you can stand the suspense?
