 My friends, for fun.

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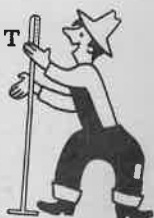

It is a pleasure to inform you of the following message, received in the form of a letter from the Governor's office and signed by EDMUND G. BROWN, the Governor of this great State of ours. The letter reads:

"Californians who Square Dance for fun, are about to embark on another season of rhythm-filled recreation. I salute you and wish you satisfaction in your endeavors, especially in your new classes for beginners. By dancing, you are keeping an important part of our past before us. As Governor of the Golden State, I send my deep appreciation for this contribution to our culture."

We're not campaigning, but this type of recognition does sort of make you feel good - doesn't it?

On August 18, your Association Board attended a State Council Meeting, along with representatives from the other 14 Associations in the State of California.

The purpose of this Council is to promote an active fellowship among Associations interested in encouraging a high standard of Square Dancing in California; to exchange information between Associations and to promote occasional inter-Association activities on a larger scale than any group can do singly.

As most of you know, the 1963 State Convention will be held in Long Beach on May 31st, June 1st and 2nd. The theme will be "Showtime of '63". Among the highlights, there will be a 1 1/2 hour parade, through the streets of Long Beach. They tell me, the Presidents of each Association will not have to walk. That's a relief - but then, they didn't say what we would ride on! Never will forget those jackasses on the Roy Rogers TV Show! (No Ed! the animals, not the people.)

GOOD NEWS -- California will host the 1964 National Convention. Long Beach made a successful bid, for which we are all grateful. Sort of makes you wish we had the facilities in our immediate area to be able to bid for a State Convention, at least. Some day in the not too distant future, we will have our chance. In the meantime, we can think about it and hope.

School Cost problems are cropping up again in different areas, and with various degrees of seriousness. Your Association wants to help, whenever and wherever possible. At the present stage of development, it appears we can successfully experience saving the privilege of using school facilities by clubs. Curbing the cost, is another problem that has to be handled on a school district basis.

As you know, it has never been the policy of this Association to dictate to member clubs. For that matter, we never intend to! We would like to point out however, the injury which can befall each other, if we promiscuously move our club from one school district to another, without legally meeting the residence requirements. It isn't fair to our fellow members who are more fortunate in having little or no cost attached to the use of their schools. It isn't typical of Square Dancers, as a whole.

Our General Committee Meeting, scheduled for September 16, 1962, will have convened by the time you read this article. We are hoping the attendance will be good. If your

club was not represented, please plan on attending the next one in December.

The long hot (?) summer has come and gone. Or, was it ever here? In any event, vacation time is over, the kids are back in school, and we hope all clubs are back to normal membership level. Many clubs have made plans for beginners classes. As time goes by, you wonder where you will ever find new sources to draw from. The results are very rewarding however, when your beginners graduate and you receive the satisfaction of knowing you were instrumental in introducing this GREAT pastime of ours to more people.
