ROUND DANCE of the MONTH

RIDING ALONG

By Dud & Barbara Huggins, Bremerton, Washington



Record: "Riding Along", Accent AC-1050

Position: OPEN, facing LOD. Directions for M, W does counterpart.

Measures: INTRO:

(WAIT 2 Meas) Turn away from ptr (M L-face, W R-face) making a small circle in 4 walking steps to end ptrs facing and join M's L & W's R hands (M facing wall, W COH);

PART A

1 - 4 CROSS TWO-STEP; FACE TWO-STEP; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, SIDE, CLOSE, BACK;

W crosses twd COH under M's L as M crosses twd wall; on second two-step ptrs turn to face each other assuming CLOS POS; do 2 BOX TWO-STEPS - M steps L swd RLOD, closes R to L, steps fwd twd COH with L; M steps R swd LOD closes L to R and steps back with R; (release M's R & W's L, retaining M's L and W's R);

5 - 8 CROSS TWO-STEP; FACE TWO-STEP; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK;
Repeat action of Meas. 1-4 RLOD to end M facing wall retaining CLOS POS;

9 - 12 DIP, RECOVER; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD;

In CLOS POS, M dips back twd COH on L, transferring weight smoothly from R to L foot, recover - M transfers weight smoothly from L to R foot, retaining CLOS POS (M facing wall); M then steps L swd LOD, close R to L, cross L in front of R (twd RLOD) (W XIB); step swd RLOD with R and close L to R, M steps back with R (twd COH); step LOD with L, close R and step fwd (twd wall) with L;

13 - 16 SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2;

M step R swd RLOD, close L to R, step thru in front of L with R (twd LOD) assuming CLOS POS (W XIF); do two turning two-steps followed by W doing 1 SLOW R-face TURN as M does two walking steps LOD; (Assume SEMI-CLOS POS facing LOD);

PART B

17 - 20 WALK, WALK, CROSS, CROSS; CUT/BACK, CUT/BACK; DIP BACK/LIFT, RECOVER, TCH;

Walk LOD (L,R) turning to face partner; M crosses L over R twd RLOD (placing weight on L), cross R over L, (placing weight on R, turning to face LOD (W crosses in front both steps); cross L over R (placing weight on L), step back on R, assuming weight, then step back again with L (still keeping L crosses over R), taking weight with L step back with R (placing weight on R); bring L ft to outside (W R ft), dip backward with L, lifting R, step fwd LOD with R touching L alongside R, maintaining SEMI CLOS POS;

21 - 24 WALK, WALK; CROSS, CROSS; CUT/BACK, CUT/BACK; DIP BACK/LIFT, RECOVER, TCH;

Repeat Meas 17-20 (On RECOVERY, turn slightly twd partner and wall to begin PART A).

ENDING: On LAST TIME through PART A, following twirl, turn away from partner (M twd COH, W twd wall) and back in 3 slow walking steps (making a small circle).
JOIN M's R & W's L hands and acknowledge partner on count 4.

SEQUENCE: INTRO - A - B - A - B - A - ENDING

psychosis of square dancing

Herewith is the second part of a two-part article I started in September and failed to finish in October on account I moved and didn't get around to it. I'm now around to it, and you've forgotten what I wrote about. To bring you up to date, I maintained that the inadequate dancers among us who lower our dancing level are not the beginners, but older dancers who never progressed beyond the beginner state and apparently never will. This group I divided into those inadequately trained, those who dance so infrequently they don't keep up, and those who are tone-deaf, lack a sense of rhythm or are poorly coordinated. Finally, I maintained that the first and the last group can be salvaged - if they want to be. Now go on with the story.

First and foremost, to solve a problem, we have to understand exactly what the problem is. Let's set up a mythical dancer who has the problem we are trying to lick. The caller gives a command, and this dancer isn't quite sure what he is supposed to do until one or more of the other couples start to execute the command, and then he goes into action - usually just a shade late, lousing up the timing. What is his problem? He simply does not have a mental picture of what is meant by a given command. What is worse - he is unaware of this as a conscious thought. It is NOT - repeat not - that he is uncoordinated and can't react quickly enough or has no sense of timing. Do you want proof? Okay - watch him when "alemande left, grand right and left" is called! His timing, coordination, and reaction time is the equal of anyone - BECAUSE HE HAD A MENTAL PICTURE OF THOSE CALLS AND KNEW EXACTLY WHAT HE WAS SUPPOSED TO DO! It is just that simple. Let's look at it another way: unless you are a really top-flight dancer, there are certain calls that you are not completely sure of. Do you know the difference between do ci do, do sa do, and do pas so? Eight chain through, all eight chain, and grand chain eight? Immediately, without thinking? If you don't, your timing and reaction is going to be slower than it should be. Remember when "square through" first came out, and we loused up our squares

and didn't like the call? Now it is automatic, without conscious thought - because we have that necessary mental picture. This points out part of the ACTUAL problem of our mythical dancer - and the solution is so obvious it hurts. His trouble is that he is only partially familiar with the call, and will go on through years of dancing without ever consciously trying to learn and understand it. Why do we do this! Often it is because we are afraid to ask someone, afraid to admit we don't know. I suggest a grand experiment to my loyal readers - search through your little minds and come up with one call you're not absolutely certain of, whatever it may be, and as soon as you can, have it explained and worked out for you by a caller or another dancer who knows it well. Then wait a few days and try to explain it to yourself, your wife, friend, or what have you, even to the mirror, and see how you do. If you really understand it, you can explain it to someone else - if you don't quite know it, you'll tangle yourself up in short order. I guarantee that if every square dancer in this area, beginner, intermediate or high-level, takes one such call and works it out in this fashion, the result would be immediately obvious to everyone. Note the all-important point in this idea - this troublesome call is not to be taught to you in a workshop - which is being imposed from without - but it is learned by you on your own initiative. The act of explaining it to someone else out loud makes it become part of your knowledge from that time forward. Every one of us has used this technique in square dancing or some other field, and found it to be successful. The whole idea is to consciously concentrate on the maneuver until it is completely understood. The results are certain. I may even try it myself, if I can find a call I don't already know perfectly.
