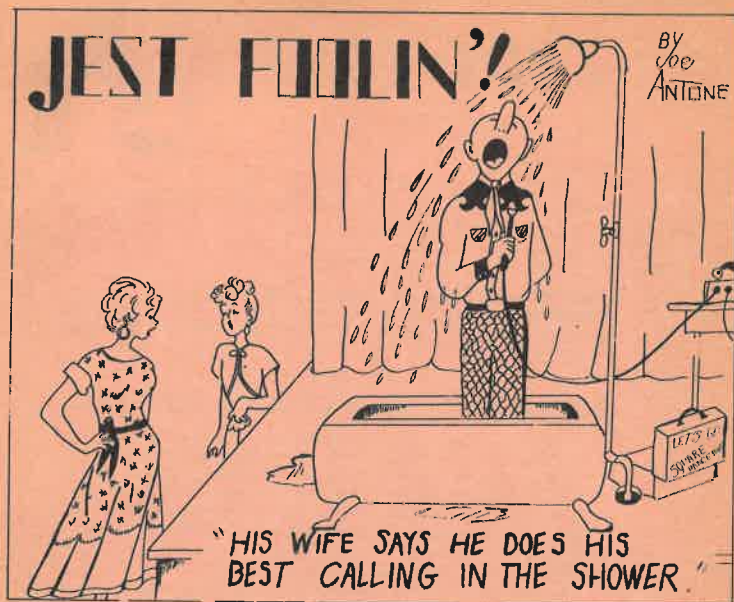

TRUE LOVE

(Waltz)



Dance Routine by Bob & Helen Smithwick, 2727 DeAnza Road, 0-31, San Diego, California

RECORD: Hactor No. 1502 B "True Love"

POSITION: Open Pos both facing LOD with inside hands joined

FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout, directions for M

INTRO: 4 Meas. WAIT; WAIT; BAL AWAY, POINT, -; SIDE, DRAW, -;

In Open-facing pos, wait 2 Meas; bal away on L ft, point R twd ptr, -; step side on R, draw L to R ft in open-facing with trailing hands (M's R & W's L) drawn well back twd RLOD, hold 1 ct;

Meas.

DANCE

1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY, 2, 3; WALTZ TOG, 2, 3; STEP, SWING, -; SPIN MANEUVER, 2, 3;

Starting M's L ft waltz away from ptr progressing in LOD, swinging joined hands thru twd LOD; starting M's R ft waltz together progressing in LOD, swinging joined hands back down and thru twd RLOD; M steps diag fwd twd COH on L ft, swing R ft XIF of L ft, hold 1 ct, swinging the joined hands thru twd LOD; swinging the joined hands back down twd RLOD and then releasing the M starts the W in a solo L-face Spin, the M then Maneuvers to CP R, L, R to end with his back twd LOD;

5 - 8 WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; TWIRL, 2, 3;

In CP starting bwd on M's L ft do 3 R-face turning waltzes progressing down LOD; twirl the W R-face as the M follows stepping R, L, R to end in open facing pos with inside hands drawn well back twd RLOD;

9 - 16 REPEAT Action of Meas 1-8 except to end in Promenade pos (M's R & W's R hands joined on top and M's L & W's L hands joined underneath) both facing LOD.

17 - 20 WALTZ FWD, 2, 3; TURN, 2, 3 (Backtrack); WALTZ BWD, 2, 3; STEP, DRAW, -;

In promenade pos waltz fwd in LOD starting M's L ft 1 Meas; keeping hands joined both turn individually (M R-face, W L-face) to face RLOD by stepping fwd on R ft, making the turn as step on L ft, close R ft to L; both waltz bwd in LOD 1 meas, M stepping L, R, L; both step bwd in LOD, M on R ft, draw L ft to R but take no wgt, hold 1 ct;

21 - 24 WALTZ FWD, 2, 3; TURN, 2, 3 (Backtrack); WALTZ BWD, 2, 3; FACE, TOUCH, - (to Butterfly);

Starting M's L ft waltz fwd in RLOD 1 meas; keeping hands joined both turn individually (M L-face, W R-face) to face LOD by stepping fwd on R ft and turning, step L ft in place, close R to L ft; both waltz bwd in RLOD 1 Meas, M stepping L, R, L; as M steps to side in RLOD on R ft ptrs maneuver to butterfly pos as M touches L ft to R, M's back to COH;

25 - 28 SIDE, DRAW, -; SIDE, DRAW, -; SIDE, DRAW, -; MANEUVER, TOUCH, -;

In butterfly pos M's back to COH step to side in LOD on L ft, draw R ft to L ft taking no wgt on ft, hold 1 ct; step to side in RLOD on R ft, draw L ft to R ft taking no wgt on ft, hold 1 ct; repeat twd LOD again starting M's L ft; as ptrs step to side in RLOD (M on R ft, W on L ft) they maneuver to CP and touch free ft (M's L, W's R); end with M's back to LOD.

29 - 32 WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; TWIRL, 2, 3;

In CP starting bwd on M's L ft do 3 R-face turning waltzes progressing down LOD; twirl W R-face as the M follows stepping R, L, R to end in open facing pos with inside hands drawn well back twd RLOD;

DANCE ENTIRE ROUTINE THROUGH "2" TIMES

ENDING: WALTZ AWAY, 2, 3; WALTZ TOG, 2, 3; STEP, SWING, -; FACE, TOUCH, -; TWIRL, 2, 3; STEP APART and BOW.

Repeat action of Meas 1-3; bringing R ft back twd RLOD to face ptr, tch L ft to R ft, hold 1 ct; M joins his L and W's R hands and twirls W R-face in place as he steps L, R, L in place; as M steps R ft in place then quickly apart on L ft changing hands to bow.

Traveling to a square dance in a place where I have never been before is a real adventure to me. Not because of the dance, the caller, or any such ordinary reasons, but finding anyplace - near or far - is an uphill battle against overwhelming odds as far as I'm concerned. This is partially due to the fact that most square dance ads don't even hint as to how to get there, or else give some such helpful information as "across from the Upsie-Daisie Drug Store". This is not particularly illuminating, as I usually haven't heard of the street it's on, let alone the store, and possibly haven't even a good idea where the city is. This, combined with my natural lack of a sense of direction, makes our appearance at said dance problematical. Some of you more efficient advertisers will undoubtedly come up to me wearing a superior smile and bearing a marked copy of "Square Dance Where", triumphantly pointing out the accurate directions and carefully drawn map in your well-designed ad. I salute you in advance - you are the progressive thinkers that are the hope of the future - but you have failed to reckon with the depths of my personal problem. Long after I have left home and am hopelessly lost in some exotic by-way, I think longingly of your fine ad in SDW which is resting uselessly back at home in my dresser drawer. The tickets are quite often nestling in my wallet in the same drawer. I have been getting lost ever since my dear mother first allowed me out on my own, several years ago. I didn't even get my Pathfinders Merit Badge as a Boy Scout - not because I couldn't pass the test, but because I couldn't find the place where the test was being given.

The mysterious people who design our cities, streets, and freeways use diabolical ingenuity in their endeavors, and their handiwork defeats me every time. Let's take a typical Saturday evening. Now that I've found the way to the freeway, I start out in excellent spirits - even with a feeling of confidence - as the white freeway

stretches ahead of me. Who can get lost on a freeway? Then comes the helpful sign that says, "Oakland - Next Ten Exits". I know the dance is in Oakland - but eight miles of exits to the same place seems to be overdoing it a little. No one has told me which exit to take, and if I guess wrong, I'm out in the boondocks, heading in the wrong direction, and what's worse, don't know it. If, by some miraculous stroke of luck, I hit the right exit, which way do I turn when I leave the Freeway, right or left? At least I have even odds this time, instead of the ten to one odds on guessing the exit. I flip a coin, and go bravely ahead, trying to read the street signs. Have you ever noticed that the signs are always on the far corner on the other side of the street? No matter which way you're going? And how they are cleverly designed so that a street light is directly above the sign, putting the sign in deep shadow and forcing you to look directly into the light? This not only completely blocks your attempt to find out where you are, but leaves you night-blind to boot. This can't be accidental - there must be a master intelligence behind it!!

I have developed a sneaky little trick to confound their plans - I make a U-turn at the intersection and come up on the sign from the rear. I then send Jane out with a flashlight to read the sign, then make another U-turn and repeat the procedure at the next two intersections. This not only tells me which street I'm on, but identifies consecutive cross streets. I can then pinpoint my location on a map, and head off on a new tack. By repeating this procedure often enough, I finally arrive within striking distance of the school or hall.

I then try to zero in by looking for lights and parked cars, and upon sighting same, I used to park hurriedly, and run sobbing toward my goal. Having skidded unhappily into PTA meetings, political rallies, church socials, and lone custodians by this method, I have now learned caution, and always stop short of the door until I hear the unmistakable sound of square dance music, which is proof positive that I have found a square

dance - maybe not the right one, but a square dance. I normally cap off the evening by entering through the wrong door and am accused of trying to sneak in for free. I sometimes do, because who would have the heart to charge me for the last tip?
