One of our most effective mental defenses is our native ability, or need, to ignore the unpleasant and pretend it isn't there. This is very soothing, but if we ignore termites in the hope that they'll simply go away, we may find they will - and our house will go with them. I believe that the powers-that-be in square dancing are ignoring some disturbing termite signs - and our house may fall down around our ears.

The uninformed outsider who criticizes square dancing stirs up a hornet's nest, as all square dancers arise in their righteous wrath in defense - and I will be in the forefront of the righteous and wrathful. But unfortunately, the active square dancer who honestly criticizes a trend, or voices a warning against practices he believes to be against the best interests of square dancing, is also set upon as some kind of nut. This is ridiculous. Criticizing a woman because she allows her children to play with matches in a haystack does not mean that I am against motherhood or hate children - it means I am pro-motherhood and love children and want both to continue in happiness and health. This is what I want for square dancing. With this in mind, allow me to point out some termite signs:

A very noticeable trend this last year is that beginner classes are smaller, harder to come by, and harder to hold intact than they used to be. Drop-outs among beginner classes are much too high, and seem to be getting higher. There are still many clubs being formed, but both the new and old clubs are far, far smaller than they used to be, and many of the older clubs are folding or getting very shaky, simply because they can't field enough squares on workshop night to make it worthwhile. We all know couples who were steady dancers for years, who now come less and less frequently, or have dropped out entirely. Where are the hordes of eager newcomers that used to travel around to other dances, workshop nights as well as hoedowns? Look at the sidelines at some of our big dances - note the steadily

increasing number of people sitting out, becoming spectators instead of dancers. Look at the trouble the caller has in trying to get some of the people up and on the floor at workshop. And the most disturbing of all - what percentage of last year's beginner class graduates are still around - and if you want frightening statistics - what percentage of the beginner's class of TWO years ago are still dancing?

Some of you will corner me and indignantly point out that you have the biggest beginner class in years, your club is steadily growing larger, and the caller has a hard time getting the dancer off the floor to rest. Goody for you! You are very definitely the exception, not the average. Because I write a column, whether it be good, bad, or indifferent, many people write me, and many more tell me personally what is bothering them about square dancing, so I get a pretty fair sampling of the thinking of the average square dancer. AND THE MAJORITY ARE COMPLAINING OF THE ABOVE PROBLEMS AND LAY THE BLAME ON THE FACT THAT SQUARE DANCING IS GETTING TOO COMPLICATED AND TOO MUCH WORK.

Why do they tell me, and not the callers? I think it is because the average dancer, who is not deeply involved in the policy-setting part of square dancing, has no one else he can air his gripes to. Will the average dancer go up to a caller and tell him he did not enjoy the choice of calls? Or tell him a new basic or gimmick is lousy? Or that there is too much to remember and constant "Challenge" is work? You know the answer. So what does the caller hear? That he is tremendous, his calling is superb, and that everything is lovely, simply because most people won't gratuitously say something to his face that will hurt, embarrass, or deflate him. So he only hears one side, and acts upon what he naturally believes is the average reaction. I submit that what he hears is not the average reaction. I also believe the callers try to call what they believe the dancers want, but I don't think the majority of dancers really want what is presently being given.

What am I getting at? Simply that something is wrong, and even if you think I'm

nuts, isn't square dancing important enough to us to at least check up and make sure I'm nuts? Just on the off-chance that I might be right for a change? My opinion is the same as I've been preaching since I started this column - that square dancing has become too complicated, too jerky, too much work, and has lost the attraction that made it great in the first place - namely that, without too long a beginner period, we could dance, without work, without heavy concentration, and relax and enjoy ourselves. We have a parallel to compare to that should shake even the most unthinking dancer - namely, folk dancing. When I first came into square dancing, folk-dancing was at its peak, riding high, with the same type of fanatical adherents as we now have in square dancing. It was fun and it was easy - and then the competition began among the instructors, egged on by the same type of vocal minority we have, to get harder and more complicated dances, and to present more and more dances. The average folk-dancer began to get left behind, and those who sounded a warning got the same comments as I get, such as "You're getting old", "Old Fashioned," "Unprogressive" and so forth. Gradually folk dancing became work, not fun, and more and more sat out the folk dances and joined in only when a square dance, which was a minor part of folk-dancing, was called. A great many of our earlier square dancers, including yours truly, came into square dancing from folk-dancing, because that was the only part of folk-dancing we really enjoyed, so we formed square dance clubs. The result? Folk-dancing is all but dead as a major activity now - and all because of the shortsightedness of the leaders, who would not believe that the average dancer wanted to enjoy himself with relatively easy dancing. The parallel with today's square dancing is so close that I'm afraid. I think we have passed our peak and are on the down slope, for exactly the same reasons that caused folk-dancing to finally fade into oblivion.

There is only one way to reverse the trend. You dancers have to be blunt and tell the callers - your callers - what you really think. Don't let the "hotshots" scare you - they'll try to make you appear juvenile and not very bright because you express a desire for good smooth dancing - but remember, you are actually in the majority.

And you callers - many of you have expressed agreement with my point of view, but argue that you have to keep up with all the other callers who keep throwing new material at the dancers. Why? The callers that call good, solid, danceable dances haven't had trouble getting dates - but many of the hot shots are out of business. If you have the ability to be a caller - and that means the ability to lead as well as call - then have the courage of your convictions and do what you believe in.

To sum it all up, if we don't like the way square dancing is headed, and yet don't express our objection, we have no one to blame but ourselves if the trend continues. I maintain that the great majority of us do not want this trend continued, and ask that all those that agree with me speak out and make your wants known - to callers, leaders, Square Dance-Where? to any one who will listen, - so that at last the average dancer's voice may be heard. Do it now! I'll be listening!!!
