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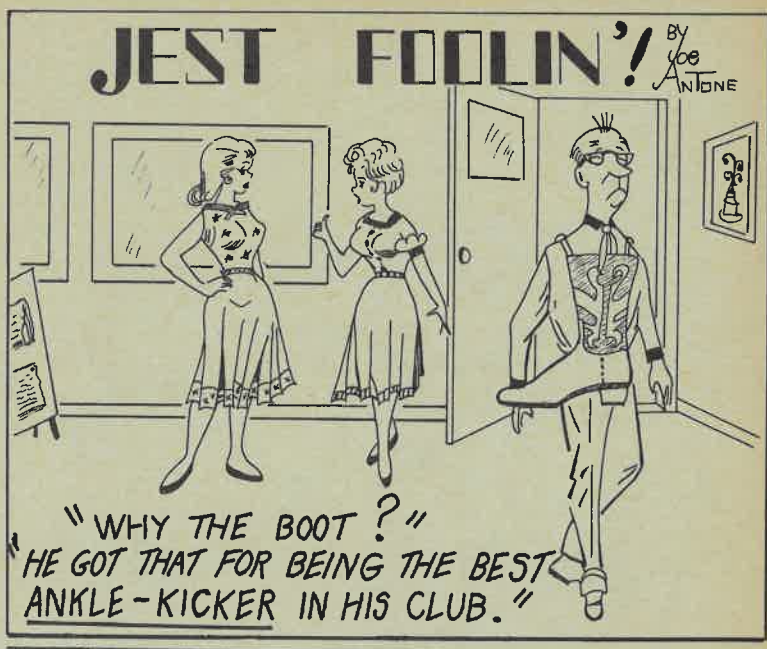

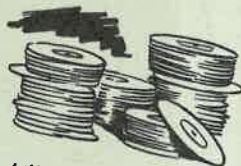

MEAS

INTRODUCTION

- 1-4 WAIT 2 MEAS; STEP APART, -, POINT, -; STEP TOGETHER SCP, -, TOUCH, -;
 In open position (inside hands joined) bal apart (M twd COH-W twd Wall), hold 1 count, pt R twd part., hold 1 count; step together in SCP on R, hold 1 count, tch L to R, hold 1 count;

DANCE

- 1-4 FWD TWO STEP; FWD TWO STEP; CUT, 2,3,4, DIP, -, RECOVER, -;
 In semi-closed position facing LOD do two fwd two-steps; Step L XIF of R, back on R; Dip back on L (W back on R), hold 1 count, recover fwd on R (Turning to face partner and wall in BUTTERFLY POSITION), hold 1 count;
- 5-8 SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, -; THROUGH, -;

Keep both hands joined in BUTTERFLY POSITION M facing wall and step side LOD on L, close R to L, L XIF of R (W-XIF) twd RLOD, hold - 1 count; step side RLOD on R, close L to R, R XIF of L (W-XIF) twd LOD, hold 1 count; Step side LOD on L, R behind L (W-XIB), side LOD on L, R behind L (W-XIB); Step side LOD on L, hold 1 count, step thru twd LOD (to SCP) on R, hold 1 count;

- 9-16 REPEAT MEASURES 1-8 ENDING BUTTERFLY FACING POSITION;

Man facing wall & both hands joined;

- 17-20 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, TOUCH; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, TOUCH (WOMAN WRAP); UNWRAP, 2,3, TOUCH; CHANGE SIDE, 2, FACE, TOUCH;

Both hands joined in BUTTERFLY POSITION M facing wall step side LOD on L, R behind L, side LOD on L, tch R to L; As man vines back RLOD R, L, R, bring joined M's L & W's R hands between Man & Woman, around and over W's head turning W L-face into wrap position M's L & W's R hands joined in front, M's R & W's L hands joined at W's right hip, end both facing LOD in wrap position & tch L to R (W tch R to L); releasing M's L & W's R hands M step in place L, R, L, tch R to L; as W unwraps R-face twd wall R, L, R, tch L to R, (ending in OPEN POSITION facing LOD M's R & W's L hands joined); Under joined M's R & W's L hands change side M turning R (W-L face) R, L, R, tch L to R; ending in BUTTERFLY-FACING position M facing COH both hands joined;

- 21-24 REPEAT MEASURES 17-20 in RLOD;

End in BUTTERFLY FACING POSITION Man facing wall both hands joined;

- 25-28 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE PIVOT, SIDE, BEHIND, OPEN, TOUCH; (OR FACE TO FACE, BACK TO BACK); VINE APART, 2,3, TOUCH, VINE TOGETHER, 2,3, TOUCH; (WOMAN ROLL IN)

In BUTTERFLY facing position both hands joined step side LOD on L, R behind L, side LOD on L, pivoting L-face (W-R-face) bringing R thru twd LOD into back to back position, keeping M's R & W's L hands joined step side LOD on R, L behind R, turn & step fwd LOD on R, tch L to R; end in OPEN DANCE POSITION facing LOD inside hands joined. Vine apart M twd COH (W-twd wall) step side on L, R behind L, side on L, tch R to L, as man vines back twd wall & partner R, L, R. Woman rolls L-face twd COH & ptr L, R, L, both turn to face partner in closed dance position M facing wall & tch L to R (W-tch R to L);

- 29-32 TURN TWO STEP; TURN TWO STEP, TWIRL, -2,-3,-4,-;

Two R-face turning two steps; two slow R-face twirls end in SCP to REPEAT DANCE;

SEQUENCE: ENTIRE DANCE IS DONE TWICE. REPEAT MEAS 1-23 MAN REMAIN ON OUTSIDE - Woman on inside, feet together hold 1 count & chug APART.

I received a gratifying amount of comment on my last article concerning the present trend in square dancing, and quite a few enlightening side comments. One surprisingly tender spot were beginner classes, which I mentioned are getting smaller, harder to come by, and harder to hold intact than they used to be. This seems to be worrying a lot of people, and not only in this area, either. At the risk of playing the same tune too often, I say the major reason is that Square Dancing has become too complicated and too much work, and the beginners become discouraged and lose interest. (For my answer to this, see last month's Square Dance Where?) This is the basic reason, but even so, we are not doing the best job we can with the material we have. We still do get beginner classes, and probably enough to supply our immediate needs - if we kept them all. But there's the rub - we lose a frightening percentage. The big question, then, is "WHY?". There is no one simple answer, but the causes can be roughly divided into the following: Inadequate caller-teachers; insufficient training before going out to hoedowns; lack of assistance by the regular club members at the beginners class; and lack of acceptance by the regular club members after graduation.

Regarding the inadequate caller-teacher, I don't know how we can prevent some inexperienced jerk from starting a class when he doesn't know enough to stick in your eye. (The problem of inadequate teachers running caller's classes and graduating sub-standard products is one that has bothered Caller's Associations for some time too, and is not the subject of this essay.) But we can control the choice of whom we hire to teach our club beginner class. Unfortunately, emotion sometimes plays a greater role than common sense in our choice of the teacher. We usually hire our own club caller, or some other popular caller, and this may be a poor choice, because the fact that a man is an excellent caller may bear little or no relation to his ability to teach - and on the

other hand many horrible callers are excellent teachers. Possibly you should look to your past experience with this caller; did the great majority of his class go through to graduation? Was the class happy and imbued with the joy and fun of dancing? (If the answer to this is "yes", the answer to the previous question is probably "yes", and vice versa); did he insist they be thoroughly grounded in basics before they were turned loose? Did he do a thorough indoctrination job on the ground rules, habits, ethics and courtesies of Square Dancing? If he did all these things, he is your boy. If he did not, better get another teacher - or a lot of good material will be spoiled and thrown away.

As to insufficient training before going out to hoedowns, it is not unusual for a beginner to feel pretty doggoned proficient after a few weeks, when he finds he never muffs a call, and even helps correct errors by his less-fortunate classmates. So what is more natural than he feel he is ready to face the outside world on even terms - why should he be held back by the others! Woe betide this poor little lamb if he wanders out too early. The first full-scale hoedown, even a beginners hoedown, that he runs into will deflate his ego like a popped balloon, and he may never come back. This early discouragement has cost us a lot of budding dancers. They should be shepherd carefully by the teacher, and not allowed out until he feels they are ready, and then in a square of their own, often accompanied by the teacher.

In regard to the lack of assistance by the club members, it is generally accepted that some of the regular members should attend the beginners class each week and mingle and dance with the fledglings. The little rascals get to know all the club members during their training period, and the transition from class to club is done painlessly; but if the club fails to rally around, this easy transition is lost. What usually happens is that the regular club workhorses and those with strong consciences appear regularly, and the others always have some excuse not to appear. These are usually the

first ones to complain and to criticize the newly graduated beginners or the caller for some real or fancied oversight in the training. The best solution is to assign given nights to each member, with the understanding that if he misses one night, he is to make it up on another.

The most tragic waste of manpower occurs when the old hands do not accept the beginners whole-heartedly into the club after graduation. A club really works to assemble a class, works with and for them for umpty-ump weeks until they are graduated with honors - and then a goodly portion of the membership quietly and effectively avoids getting into squares with them because they are not up to experienced standards. (And the silly part is that if these hotshots get in with a square of really good dancers, they often look like raw beginners themselves.) Sometimes this isn't a conscious act - but it is something that all the dancers have to watch, and it is the responsibility of the club executives to see that it does not happen. I wonder if some of the ills that plague us today aren't caused by the gradually disappearing concern of the old hands for the less-experienced dancer. Snobbery and fellowship never did go together.

My club is trying an experiment. Due to lack of beginner classes, we were faced with a very small and still dwindling membership, so we gathered up all the beginners we could, and the entire club became a beginners class with the new recruits. So far, we've gone along six weeks without the loss of a single new or old member, and we hope to trot up to the finish line with a solidly-knot membership. The retraining has been good for the rest of us, too. You should see the terpsichorean magnificence of my patty-cake polka. It is enough to bring tears to your eyes! (Amen. Ed. Note.)
