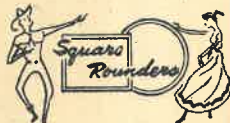
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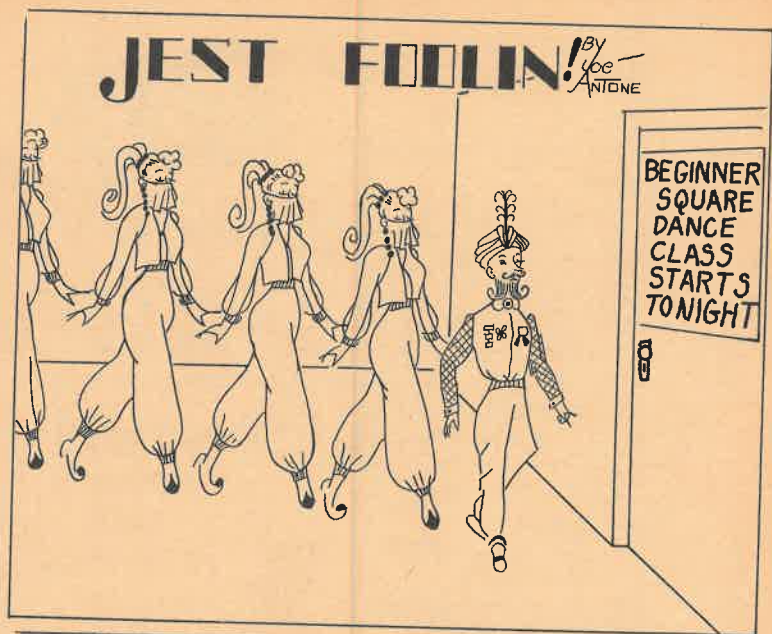

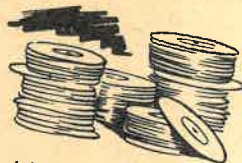

Over the past couple of years, in writing of many things, I've touched on the subject of food for square dancers, and many of you must have the idea that I like to eat. This is an absolutely correct assumption. Normally, when you're in a chow line, you'll be looking at my back, somewhere up ahead. If you look around and see me behind you, be assured that you didn't get ahead of me, but that I'm queued up for seconds. (Or thirds. Ed. Note.) The art of foodsmanship includes subtle and refined methods of easing into the food line ahead of the majority at all times, and whenever possible, ahead of everybody. I am an acknowledged expert in beating the group to the grub. In my own club, when it becomes necessary to allow the guests to precede the members in line, you will normally find me on the food committee, as I long ago learned that the choice morsels are set aside by the kitchen crew.

Therefore it may seem strange when I admit that I am generally not in favor of the formal serving of food at hoedowns. Don't misunderstand me - if the food is there, I will rattle anyone - man, woman, or beast, guest, member, or caller - for the choice morsels, but I will weep no tears if you do not serve. Possibly I should explain this apparent paradox. (Please do, or this will be a short editorial. Ed. Note.) First, I frankly don't believe the serving of food is much of a selling point as far as your hoedown goes - most dancers consider the food as an extra, and many don't know you are serving until the tables come down. They care more about the caller and the reputation of the club sponsoring the dance. In the case of the small club, the hoedown that makes a lot of money is rare, and food can be the decisive factor that dumps the hoedown into the red. It can also be a real nuisance for the small club because it takes a large proportion of the membership to prepare, serve, wash, and clean up, which cuts down their opportunity for dancing and socializing, and generally reduces their en-

joyment of said hoedown. It has always been my opinion that unless the hoedown is strictly a money-raising activity, it is given for the enjoyment of the members and their guests. I suggest that you skip the food if it knocks you out of some of the fun. I'll bet nobody misses it.

A second point, and the real reason for this article, is that the serving of food often hurts the dance as a whole. I'm speaking of the custom of stopping the dance somewhere past the half-way mark, dropping the tables, and then ringing the dinner bell. After eating and gabbing, up come the tables, and on with the dance. If I were a caller - a competent caller - I would not look kindly on this custom. Any good entertainer, be he comedian, caller, or speaker, carefully arranges his material so it builds the audience to a peak, so that at the end they leave on a high point. At one of these food-serving deals, the caller builds the dancers to a high point - and then everybody leaves the floor for the chow line. Afterwards, who wants to go back to dancing! Certainly the carefully built-up excitement and spirit the caller fashioned has disappeared, and he must start all over, but without enough time to build to a peak again. The dancers leave with a lesser opinion of the caller than they had just before the food break, which is unfair to the caller. The dancers themselves are cheated, because the last part of the dance is done on a full stomach, and the spirit and fun just won't be as high again during that evening. Who gains by this custom?

If you feel the need of serving food at your hoedown, why not serve it after the dance is over - then there is no letdown for the last couple of tips. My personal preference is that coffee and some light goodies, such as cookies or itty-bitty sandwiches, be available throughout the evening, so I can drop by and recharge my batteries or chat a bit with my friends. (Your what? Ed. Note.) This way, I can take a

break if and when I feel like it, and the caller can handle the program at his own pace and according to his own plan. He's happy, I'm happy, the dancers are happy, and the overall impression of the dance will be better.

These "dinner dances" are making a schizophrenic out of me. ("Schizophrenia" means "split-personality", but in his case, "Shattered" is a more accurate word than "split". Ed. Note.) Eating and dancing are both major recreations, each requiring full concentration, and we can't concentrate on two things at the same time. Did you ever try to do a grand right and left with a piece of cream pie in your hand?
