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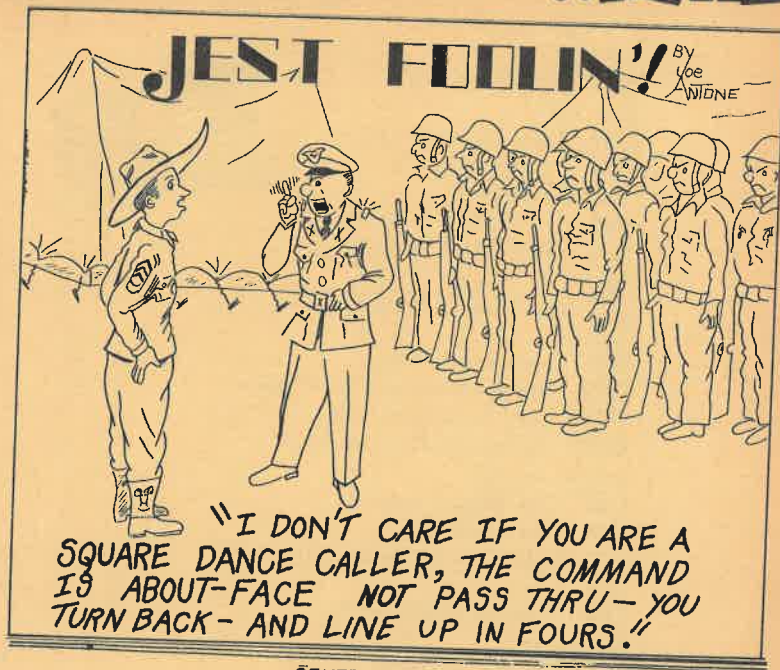

St. Louis Blues

RECORD: Grenn 14044

POSITION: INTRO - Open-Facing, M's bk to COH; DANCE -Semi-Closed fcg LOD.

FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout, directions for M unless otherwise indicated.

INTRODUCTION (As danced in Northern California)

WAIT 2 MEAS; AWAY TWO-STEP, TCH; TOGETHER TWO-STEP, TOUCH;
(To SCP)

Wait 2 meas in OPEN-FACING POS, M's bk twd COH; M steps bk on L into COH (W twd wall), close R to L, step bk L, tch R beside L; Step fwd R twd ptr & wall, close L, step fwd R to assume SEMI-CLOSED POS both fcg LOD, tch L beside R;

MEASURES

PART A

- 1 - 4 (Fwd Hitch) FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -; (Bk Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD, -; RUN, 2, 3, BRUSH; RUN, 2, 3, BRUSH;

In SEMI-CLOSED POS step fwd in LOD on L, close R to L, step bwd twd RLOD on L, hold 1 ct; Step bwd in RLOD on R, close L to R, step fwd on R in LOD, hold 1 ct; Run fwd LOD L,R,L, brush R; Run fwd LOD R,L,R, brush L;

- 5 - 8 (Fwd Hitch) FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -; (Bk Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD, -; RUN, 2, 3, BRUSH; RUN, 2, FACE, TOUCH; (To CP)

Repeat action of Meas 1-4 except to end the 2nd run with a Face, touch to assume CLOSED POS, M's bk to COH;

- 9 - 12 (Box Two-Step) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -; CHANGE/SIDES, 2, 3, BRUSH; FWD, 2, 3, FACE; (To CP)

In closed pos starting M's L dance one Box Two-step stepping side on L, close R to L, step fwd twd wall on L, hold 1 count; Step to side on R, close L to R, step bk twd COH on R, hold 1 ct; With M's L & W's R hands joined W crosses to inside under joined hands (W passes in front of M diag twd LOD & COH under arch of joined hands) as M crosses to outside stepping L,R,L, brush R; Moving fwd in LOD, R,L,R, touch L and assume CLOSED POS M's bk to wall;

- 13 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 9-12 (except prog RLOD in Meas 15-16) ending in BUTTERFLY POS, M's bk to COH;

PART B

- 17 - 20 (8-Step Grapevine) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; SIDE, TOUCH, SIDE, TOUCH; SIDE, TOUCH, SIDE, TOUCH;

Starting L & moving to L side prog LOD to do an 8-step Grapevine; Step to side in LOD on L, touch R beside L, step to side in RLOD on R, touch L beside R; Repeat action of meas. 19;

- 21 - 24 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-20, maneuvering on the last 2 counts of meas. 24 to assume SEMI CLOSED POS fcg LOD;

- 25 - 28 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; WALK, -, 2, -, 3, -, 4, -; (W twirls twice) (To SCP)

Starting M's L dance two fwd two-steps prog LOD; M walks four steps in 2 meas. L,R; L,R; alongside W as she does 2 slow RF twirls in 4 steps R,L; R,L; under joined lead hands to end in SEMI-CLOSED POS fcg LOD, ready to repeat dance.

DANCE GOES THROUGH THREE TIMES. At end of 3rd time thru, W ends twirl to assume BUTTERFLY POS M's bk twd COH for ENDING: SIDE L, TCH R (In LOD), SIDE R, TCH L (In RLOD); TWIRL, ACKNOWLEDGE, -.

Getting Along at the Roundup

This is the month of the Golden State Round-Up, to me the high point of the Square-Dancing year - a feeling shared by a pretty fair number of people throughout the country. I haven't missed one yet, and still get the same feeling of excitement when I walk into the Auditorium as I did the first time. It doesn't seem possible now, but on the first Roundup we helped decorate the Auditorium on Friday nite - actually Saturday morning - showed up again before nine A.M. Saturday, and proceeded to dance every square throughout Saturday and Sunday, with time out only for meals. And felt great afterwards. Today they'd bury me. The spirit is willing but my wife isn't.

About the only thing that could be improved is the crowded condition of the floor, which condition is caused by the popularity of the affair in the first place. There are quite a few things we could do that would improve the situation considerably, if all the dancers cooperate. This should be easy, because square dancers are normally cooperative, only asking that they understand what they should do. Like I always say, let's analyze the problem.

Analysis: The floor is too crowded. End of analysis.

Reason: 1. Too small an Auditorium.
2. Too many people.

Solution: 1. Enlarge the Auditorium
2. Reduce the number of people
3. Reduce the size of the people
4. Modify our style of dancing.

Enlarging the Auditorium is impractical, according to city officials. They want us to put up some amazing number of millions of dollars for the project, and our treasury just won't stand the drain. Rubber walls and double-decking have been discussed and discarded. There are no bigger halls that are satisfactory for square dancing. Therefore, this is no solution.

As for reducing the number of people: This would be easy-merely put on a poor roundup. People would stay away and there would be plenty of room to dance, and pretty soon we could hold it in somebody's rumpus room. Then, of course, the committees would over-crowd the space and we would have the same old problem on a

smaller scale, so I guess holding a lousy roundup isn't the solution.

Reducing the size of the people: This could be handled in several ways. We could limit the sale of tickets to persons in the lightweight or welterweight class, but this would create the nasty situation of breaking up families where the wife is a lightweight and the husband fights in the heavyweight division. When I think of the heartbreaking scenes of parting I am convinced this is not the solution either. This leaves the fascinating alternative of reducing the size of each individual people. From what I, as a married man, can gather, this is a constant process among women anyway - my wife loses on the average of 60 pounds a year, at five pounds a month. It's the same five pounds each month, which she gains and loses. If all wives follow this pattern (and from listening to their shapetalk, they do) all we have to do is get them all to complete the losing cycle of their diet on Friday night, May 24th. With a conservative average of five pounds of lost weight per girl, think of the amazing results. 300 squares, containing 1200 girls @ five pounds each equals 6000 pounds! Think of all the extra room! And this is counting women only. If some of the men joined the crusade, we would have no problem whatsoever, except too much room.

Modify our style of dancing: We can easily and effectively eliminate much of the discomfort and jostling of a crowded floor by adopting standard techniques experienced dancers use in this situation, consisting mostly of the elimination of maneuvers that flare outside the boundaries of the square or entail sudden and/or fast movements. We eliminate or curtail such frills as the balance-out at the end of a swing, the twirl

when meeting your partner after a grand right and left, and sometimes the swing at home. Most of the collisions and jostlings are caused by this sort of action. Ergo, eliminate that action and the collisions are reduced.

There are other preventative measures to

be taken: Simply trying to keep the square tight (which we are supposed to do anyway) creates an amazing amount of additional dancing room. (If your square is all tight, no wonder they give you a lot of room. Shame on you!! Ed. Note.) When parading around in a promenade, keep the elbows in - much of the justling is elbow-to-elbow contact. When turning your partner at the end of a chain, hold her in close to the square boundaries and close to you - and if you don't like those instructions, you're older than I am.

I am confident that each of you will cooperate wholeheartedly in my program of reducing the size of the dancers to meet existing conditions, and feel that some recognition of your sacrifices and esprit de corps should be given. Therefore, if those of you who have made a valiant attempt to occupy less space than heretofore will contact me during the Roundup, I will be pleased to place a Golden Star on your badge to signify that you are an honored member of Barthol's Bitsy Brigade.

They might enjoy themselves more and are less apt to become discouraged so soon and become lost to Square Dancing forever.

CLUB CALLERS - You can help a great deal by doing your job, through education along these lines, for the betterment of Square Dancing. In the final analysis, it's our loss, isn't it?
