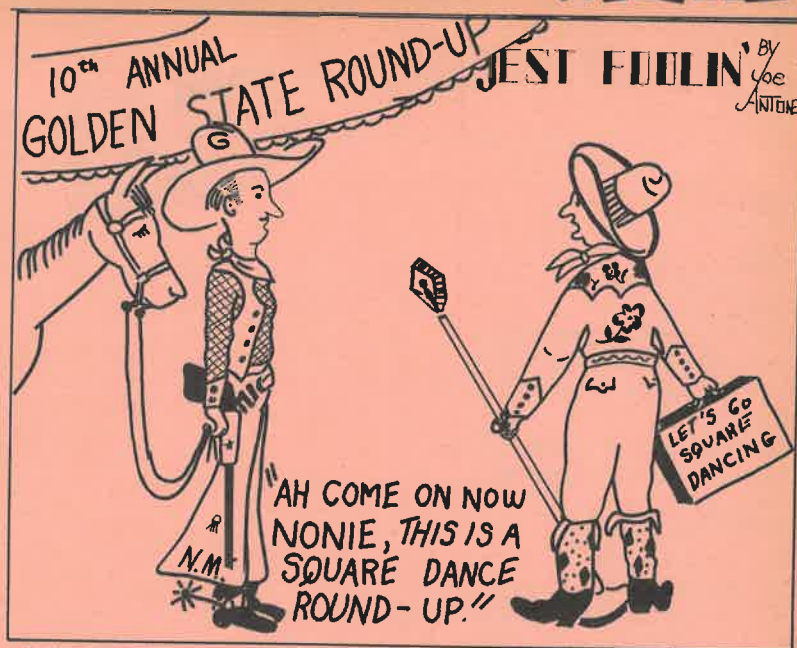

SCRIBBLINGS ON TRAINING A RETRIEVER

Every hobbyist or sports fan carries along the tools necessary to the pursuit of his interest, plus additional clothing such as coats, hats, and raingear. There is normally no problem in the transportation of the gear, because that which isn't worn is thrown in the car. When he gets there, there is no storage problem, because the gear is used in the sport itself, like the golf bag and clubs, the fishing rod and tackle box, etc. However, that which isn't used is usually dumped in the car during the time he's playing. But what about the specialized sport of square dancing? What is the impedimenta we carry? Besides raingear, coats, stoles, and the like, the gals also carry purses, compacts, fans, lipstick, etc. These items are brought into the dance arena with us, and are not used during the dancing. Question - what in the ever-lovin' world do we do with them!

The problem is complicated by the places we dance - usually gyms or all-purpose school play rooms - where there are normally no cloakrooms, coat-racks, or hooks on the wall. Instead, we have chairs around the perimeter, often just barely enough to seat the assembled multitude, and sometimes far short of that. Sometimes it is an auditorium, with multitudinous seats - but only the first couple of rows are used, because the rest stretch back into the dark and mysterious recesses of the hall. So what do we do with our excess gear? We dump it on the nearest chair, table, or seat. Right here we note another of the fascinating peculiarities that makes square dancers different from the average population. We leave our purses, stoles, clothing, and valuables of all kinds alone and unattended for three hours, easily accessible to up to five thousand square dancers. If they were just people, our chances of finding something missing would be about 100%, but they are square dancers, and in all the twelve years we've been dancing, we've lost not one single article, and I don't recall any complaints of thievery from the Golden State Roundup, Stampedes,

or any other association function. We have no need for police supervision or protection from disorderliness or dishonesty. I know of no other group that can say that!

But there are some pitfalls we run into - and, as usual, I have some sneaky answers. One of the pitfalls is the retrieving of the stored articles - which we carefully draped over a chair when we came in. Since then, numerous other couples have utilized the same chair. Because I am a natural-born gentleman - and because Jane ordered me to - I usually wander over to collect the gear while she gabs with other gals whose husbands are corraling their stuff. My first problem is that I never have the faintest idea as to what she wore. I paw through four or five sweaters of varying degrees of whiteness, wishing unhappily that I'd paid more attention to what her sweater looked like, pick a likely looking one, and hesitatingly offer it to my love. Invariably, I am treated to a look of withering scorn, and am informed - in what I regard as an unnecessarily loud voice - that:

1. That does not resemble any sweater she ever wore.
2. She wore a coat that night.
3. My shirt is wrinkled.

I have never understood what connection the last remark has to do with the subject at hand, but something of that nature always seems to creep in.

The time I dread most is when Jane says "Get me my purse." in the middle of the evening. Without exception, I find the group of chairs among which I laid the purse occupied by a group of women I never saw before. I slither around ingratiatingly, trying to look behind them to spot the missing article. I never see it. I look helpless and unhappy. They ignore me. I know it's behind one of them, but which one? The only answer, of course, is to ask them to get up for a moment. They do, and I finally find the purse behind someone ten seats away from there. By then the next tip has started,

and it's too late to get in a square. If the article to be retrieved is under the chair, you're dead. Don't ever make the mistake of trying to paw quietly around under the chairs to find it. The cold and accusing stares from the gals sitting there would unnerve the most calloused man ever born, and I leave feeling that I am a loathsome, depraved creature who should be locked away from decent society. (True. Ed. Note.) To avoid these unpleasant scenes, I took to hunting out isolated chairs in the most unlikely spots, such as behind the platform, or under the stage. Invariably, at the end of the dance I find that the chair has been needed for the refreshments break, and my stuff moved to some unknown spot. Or even worse, a whole group of chairs was moved, and the entire warehouse-load of garments has been thrown into a pile somewhere. I find the only answer to this is to be the last one to leave the hall, and take what is left, uncomplainingly.

HAPPY EATING...

CRANBERRY WREATH SALAD

- 1 Pckge Strawberry Gelatin
- 1 Cup hot water
- 1 Can Whole Cranberry Sauce
- Dash Salt

- 1 14oz. can Crushed Pineapple
- 1 Pckge Lemon Gelatin
- 2 Cups Tiny Marshmallows
- 1-3oz. Pckge. Cream Cheese Softened
- 1/2 Cup Mayonnaise
- Dash Salt
- 1/2 Cup Whipped Cream

1st Layer:

Dissolve Strawberry Gelatin in hot water, add cranberry sauce & salt. Pour into 6-1/2 Cup ring mold, chill until firm.

2nd Layer:

Meanwhile Drain pineapple, reserve syrup. Dissolve Lemon Jello in boiling water, add marshmallows & stir till melted. Add reserved syrup. Chill till partially set. Blend cream cheese and mayonnaise & salt, add to marshmallow mixture. Stir in pineapple (If mixture is thin, chill until it will mound slightly when spooned) Fold in whipped cream. Pour over first layer. Chill till firm. Unmold on curly endive, fill center with tiny lettuce leaves. Makes 10-12 servings.

DATE LOAF

For 12 people.

- 1 lb Chopped Dates (2 C)
- 1 lb Quartered Marshmallows
- 1 C Chopped Nut Meats
- 3 C Graham Cracker Crumbs
- 1 C Thin Cream

Mix together (or turn on bread board) and knead crumbs into mixture. Form in rolls 2" in diameter - wrap in wax paper. Refrigerate. Cut in slices. Top with Whipped Cream.

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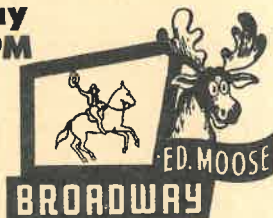

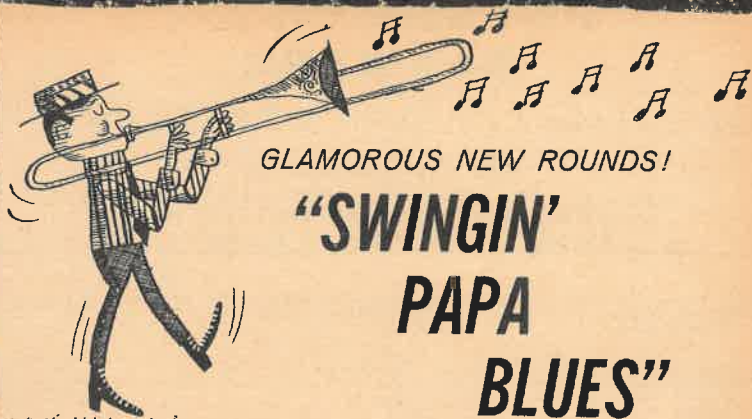

This is one of those "cannon-ball" numbers that lift the dancers three feet off the floor, and the kind that Max loves to rock. Easy for other callers to deliver, too. PETE LOFTHOUSE and seven other sturdy musicians got together on the music with highly effective results.
