HI LILI, HI LO



By Marl & Delia Olds **** Los Angeles, California

RECORD: "Hi Lili, Hi Lo" - 510 3139
POSITION: Open-Facing for Intro; Open, facing LOD for Dance
FOOTWORK: Opposite, directions for M unless otherwise noted
INTRO: Standard acknowledgement
MEASURES

- 1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY, 2, FACE; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to Open);
WALTZ BWD, 2, FACE; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to Open);
In Open Pos starting with M's L ft waltz fwd along LOD moving slightly away from ptr (L, L, close L); turning to face ptr & without releasing hands change sides with W passing under the upraised hands and both turning to face RLOD in OPEN POS. (Star Thru) R, L, close R; Waltz bwd along LOD L, R, close L; Turning to face ptr again change sides with W passing under the upraised hands (Star Thru) R, L, close R turning on last ct to both face LOD in OPEN POS. NOTE: These 4 meas should move in a continuous, flowing action with only a slight hesitation on the "Close" steps.
- 5 - 8 STEP, SWING, -, SPIN MANUV, 2, 3; (R) WALTZ TURN, 2, 3; OPEN
2, 3;
Step fwd on L (W R), swing inside ft fwd and hold 1 ct; M maneuvers in 3 steps (R, L, close R) as W spins LF in place (L, R, L) to end in CLOSED POS with M facing RLOD; Do a RF turning waltz along LOD; Do another RF turning waltz along LOD opening out into OPEN POS, both facing LOD.
- 9 - 12 WALTZ AWAY, 2, FACE; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to Open);
WALTZ BWD, 2, FACE; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to Open);
Repeat action of Meas. 1-4.
- 13 - 16 STEP, SWING, -, SPIN MANUV, 2, 3; (R) WALTZ TURN, 2, 3;
WALTZ, 2, 3, (to Closed)
Repeat action of Meas 5-8 remaining in CLOSED POS and end with M facing LOD.
- 17 - 20 TWINKLE OUT, 2, 3; TWINKLE IN, 2, 3; TWINKLE OUT, 2, 3; FWD,
TCH, -;
In CP starting M's L ft do 3 twinkle steps (M XIF, W XIB) moving diag out twd wall and LOD; Repeat twinkle diag in TWD COH & LOD; Repeat twinkle diag out twd wall and LOD; M steps fwd R in LOD, tch L beside R, hold 1 ct ending in LOOSE-CLOSED POS.
- 21 - 24 BACK, -, CLOSE; BACK, -, CLOSE; BACK, TCH, -, OPEN, 2, 3;
M steps back in RLOD on L ft (W fwd R) in canter rhythm drawing trailing ft twd RLOD in 2 cts and closing at last moment; Repeat this action; Stepping twd RLOD on L (W's R) tch R to L, hold 1 ct; As M takes 3 steps R, L, R. W makes 1/2 RF turn in 3 steps (L, R, L) to OPEN POS both facing LOD.
- 25 - 28 STEP, SWING, -, FWD, FACE, CLOSE; (REV) SOLO TURN, 2, 3; ON
TO FACE, 2, 3;
Step fwd on L ft, swing inside ft fwd and hold 1 ct; Step fwd on R, turn to face ptr on L, close R to L momentarily assuming BUTTERFLY POS; Release trailing hands (M's R, W's L) and turn away from ptr RF (W LF) in a reverse solo waltz turn stepping bwd in LOD on L, swd in LOD on R, close L to R prog LOD & ending in a BACK-TO-BACK POS; Release hands (M's L, W's R) continue to turn down LOD in 3 steps (R, L, R) to end in CLOSED POS M's back to COH.
- 29 - 32 DIP IN, -, Manuv, 2, 3; (R) WALTZ TURN, 2, 3; TWIRL, 2, 3 (to open);
Dip in twd COH on L and hold 2 cts; Maneuver in 3 steps (r, l, r) to end in CLOSED POS M's back to LOD; Do RF turning waltz down LOD; As M completes another waltz W twirls RF under M's L arm to end in OPEN POS facing LOD.
- 33 - 40 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 25-32.
- DANCE THRU 2 1/2 times ENDING MEAS 24 with TWIRL & ACKNOWLEDGE 3rd TIME THRU.

SEALS DO IT-TOO!!

In spite of my wild-eyed crusades against too much change in square dancing, I must admit that in many ways we are the most conformist group in existence. As individuals and as a group, we tend to act and react to most things as though there are rules that force us into a pattern, and the funny part is that most of us are not aware of it. For example, look at where we dance on the floor. I almost always can be found in the front of the hall, a little to the caller's left. I feel better there. Other people may square up at the rear, the right center, or what have you - but the point is that, barring outside influences, they will be at the same place on the floor, give or take a few feet. The original reasons for each of us choosing our own individual spot are many and varied, but there are few among us who haven't a regular place. When I want to see some friend at a big dance, I can make a pretty good guess as to where he will be. (Keep moving around and you can successfully avoid him most of the time. Ed. Note.)

Probably the most noticeable conditioned reflex developed in the square dancer is the automatic applause and laughter. We are constantly holding hoedowns, box lunch sales, and white elephant auctions, or having down-right assessments to get some money in our treasuries, but all the while we've been sitting on top of a gold mine without knowing it. If we merely took a group - any group - of square dancers to a TV producer and demonstrate these automatic reactions, he would forever afterwards pay us unbelievable sums as permanent studio audiences. We are conditioned to laugh on cue, applaud on cue, or laugh and applaud on cue, in any combination. If you doubt this, just listen at your next dance. With an audience like that, they could make a comedy hit out of the weather reports. Callers, who just as conformist as dancers, tend to use the same routine gags week in and week out, often written right into the calls, and in spite of the fact that

we have heard the gag thirty times in the last thirty weeks, we laugh. Often, he will tell a joke that four other callers have told before him, and we will laugh. We applaud after every dance, whenever anyone is introduced, after all announcements, at any jokes, good or bad, and for most ad libs. We applaud when we haven't the remotest idea as to what is going on, when we miss what the caller or who ever is at the mike says, but when we hear others applaud, we do too. We are so far gone that we applaud statements we disagree with completely and for people we dislike. When we stop and think about it, the entire program for many of our social affairs consists of the Master of Ceremonies introducing all the celebrities, honored guests, committee chairmen, callers, dishonored guests, and the janitor who is waiting to sweep out the joint when we leave. We applaud each one and laugh uproariously at his weak gags, and go home happily, firmly believing we just listened to a fascinating program. We're dopes and and my hands are all calloused.

I said that callers are as conformist as dancers, and rightly so, as they are former dancers, and some even still dance. Their conformity is reflected in their patter, which has changed very slightly over the years. I'm talking about the fillers that are used between the actual commands, such as "Chicken in the Breadpan, peckin' out dough" or "Swing with Mary, Swing with Grace, Allemande left with old Pruneface", and dozens of others which we've heard innumerable times. With so many people frantically writing new dances and inventing newbasics, it's amazing that no one has turned his hand to writing new patter. I give this idea for free to any aspiring caller - just write some clever and catchy patter, and you will get more recognition than you ever will from newdances or basics. Everybody's in the new basics field, but the patter field will be all to yourself. In the interest of furthering creative writing, I am hereby starting a contest for the best new

patter bits. (You could further creative writing best by getting out of the business. Ed. Note.) The panel of judges (me) will be the sole judge of all entries and none can be returned. The first prize is my autographed photograph, (Applause) and the second prize is two autographed photographs. (Laughter) The caller who wins the booby prize will have me at his hoedown. (Applause and Laughter.) See what I mean?

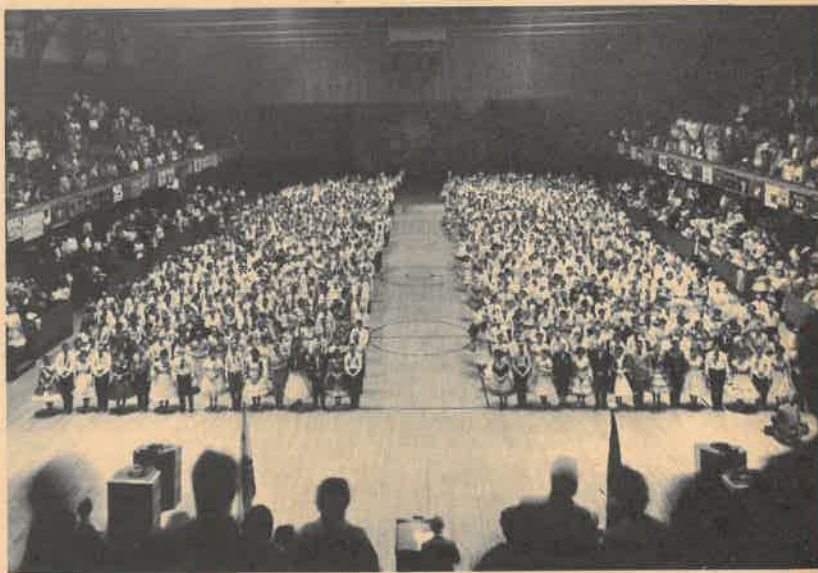
