Ten years ago, the basics and figures seem so uncomplicated as compared in todays light. Adding a new basic then created quite a stir. I suppose Bill Hansen's square thru, introduced in 1958, was really the turning point. After that, we could do so much more variations to what we already had.

Looking at todays caller, he (or she) takes a much more professional approach than before. Competition is keener. Standards are higher. (The dancer has become more sophisticated and demands these things.) I think these are good signposts, unless we get too deadly serious over our hobby.

NASTY LANGUAGE FROM DADDY!!

Each year at this time, we skip square dancing and go on a restful vacation to our cabin at Echo Lake, 7,500 feet up in the Sierras. In past years I've regaled you with fascinating stories of our trip up, and of our naval equipment, and I promised that this year I'd tell about the cabin.

Echo Lake is a mile or so off Highway 50 at Echo Summit, and the road ends at the lake front, so to get to the cabin, you take a boat or hike about a mile in rarified air. When you arrive, there is no electricity, gas, telephones, or roads, cooking is done on a wood and coal stove, clothes are done in a galvanized wash tub and wrung out on a hand-wringer, wood is chopped for the fires - and we love it. The cabin was originally built by amateurs, and every contractor friend of mine who sees it has the same comment: "With this type of construction in heavy snow country, it can't last through a winter." It has lasted over forty, which gives you a rough idea as to the professional calibre of my friends. This year we are to renovate the joint, which is in about the same state of repair that I am. We are about the same age, neither of us has ever had any major repairs, and it is clear from close observation that neither of us will last much longer without major help.

Money being a factor, the family took a vote, and it was decided by a four to one margin (the dog abstained) that the cabin should be repaired first, not only because it was more important, but also because there was a better chance of success. So, on the second day of summer (June 22nd) we went up to put on the new galvanized iron roof, and proceeded to do so - in a snowstorm, in a hail storm, in a sleetstorm, in a rainstorm, and in below-freezing weather. This was all in one day. Try that some time for real fun and relaxation. It did make for "Togetherness" - we huddled in one tight little group to keep from freezing to death. It wasn't as though we really needed a new roof, except that while it alternately snowed, hailed and rained outside, it also alternately snowed, hailed, and rained inside. Our problem was

somewhat complicated by the very heavy snow run-off, which also caused an itsy-bitsy drop in our spirits when we noted that the run-off swept by the rear end of the cabin and into the lake - via the inside of the cabin. This does make for buckled floors and curling linoleum and mildewed bedding and rusted equipment and nasty language from daddy.

But the roof is on and the run-off has run off and the sun came out and the lake and I laid down for a while. Then I started on the porch, which is to run around three sides of the cabin. I'm supposed to start at one corner, and by means of a level and handsaw, maintain it at the same level all the way around to the other side where I can't see, and have the porch come out right at the level of the far-side door sill. For a man who has trouble cutting his toast straight, this is a large order. I've completed one and a half sides, and am afraid to turn the last corner to see how I'm doing. Although what I've completed has a certain rakish, what-the-hell air about it, it does hold my weight. I was afraid to let anyone else step on it at first, until I realized that all the creaking I heard was me and not the porch.

When our vacation is over this year, we will therefore be the proud possessors of a fine roof and a new porch. The rest of the cabin still looks like the "Before" photo of a slum clearance project. The rain can't get through our pretty new roof, but I keep falling through the floor. The wind whistling through the chinks in the walls and the waves slapping energetically against our eroding foundations gives the sensation that you are on a ship - a sinking ship. The rats left it long ago because of unfair working conditions, and the field mice still on the job are getting time and a half hazard pay. None the less, our flag is still flying bravely - somewhere. It blew away the first day.

Item number two is one that has been bothering us for a long time. It deals with Principal Callers calling 5th Saturday Dances in competition with the Association's Stampedes. The Association has no desire to control the activities of callers and their calling but, and I accept full responsibility for this statement, the callers have a moral obligation to the Association clubs they call for. The callers and their clubs expect attendance at their hoedowns and I feel that the Association is entitled to expect attendance at its hoedown four times a year without the competition offered by dancers following their callers to dances held on the same night. A large share of the monies earned by principal callers is paid them by the Association clubs they call for and the club and square dancing is stronger because of the Association. What do you think? Give your Delegate your thoughts so that he can express your views at the next General Committee meeting on August 18th.
