POSITION: INTRO: Diag Open-Facing; DANCE: Closed, M facing LOD
FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout; steps described are for the M
MEASURES INTRODUCTION

- 1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -; POINT, -; TOGETHER (to closed pos), -; TOUCH, -;
Wait 2 meas in Diag Open-Facing Pos M's R & W's L hands joined; Step L bwd, hold 1 ct, point R toe fwd twd ptr, hold 1 ct; Step R fwd to face LOD taking CLOSED POS, hold 1 ct, touch L ft to R, hold 1 ct.

DANCE

- 1 - 4 WALK, -; 2, -; (Scissors) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -; BWD TWO-STEP;

In CP M facing LOD walk fwd 2 slow steps LOD L, -, R, -; (Scissors) Step L swd twd COH, close R to L, step L XIF of R (W XIB), hold 1 ct; Step R swd twd wall, close L to R, step R bwd RLOD adjusting to CLOSED POS M facing LOD, hold 1 ct; (Bwd two-step) Step L bwd in RLOD, close R to L, step L bwd again, hold 1 ct.

- 5 - 8 BWD TWO-STEP; DIP, -; RECOVER, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

Starting M's R repeat action of Meas 4; Still in CP dip bwd in RLOD on L, hold 1 ct, recover fwd on R maneuvering slightly RF to face wall, hold 1 ct; Starting M's L do 2 RF turning two-steps prog LOD making a 3/4 turn to end in CP M facing LOD.

- 9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8 ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

- 17 - 20 WALK, -; 2, -; POINT FWD, -; (Hitch) BACK, CLOSE; FWD, -; THRU, -; VINE, 2, 3, 4.

In SCP facing LOD walk fwd 2 slow steps L, -, R, -; Point L toe fwd LOD, hold 1 ct, step L fwd in RLOD, close R to L; Step L fwd LOD, hold 1 ct, step R thru in LOD turning in to face ptr and assuming LOOSE-CLOSED POS M's back twd COH, hold 1 ct; Grapevine along LOD: step L swd LOD, step R XIB of L (W XIB), step L swd again, step R XIF of L (W XIF).

- 21 - 24 SLO PIVOT, -; 2, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, -; 2, -;

In CP M's bk twd COH starting M's L do a couple RF pivot 1 full turn in 2 slow steps; Do 2 RF turning two-steps prog LOD; M walks fwd 2 slow steps as W does 1 slow RF twirl under M's L & W's R hands to end in CLOSED POS M's back twd COH.

- 25 - 28 (Box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -;

(Breakaway) SIDE, BACK, FWD, -; SIDE, BACK, FWD, -;

In CP M facing wall step L swd LOD, close R to L, step L fwd twd wall, hold 1 ct; Step R swd RLOD, close L to R, step R bwd twd COH, hold 1 ct; (Break-away) Step L swd LOD opening out 1/4 R to face RLOD in a LEFT-OPEN POS, rock bwd in LOD on R (L remaining in place), rock fwd in RLOD on L turning 1/4 L to face ptr & wall, hold 1 ct; Release lead hands & join M's R & W's L hands step R swd in RLOD opening out 1/4 L to face LOD in OPEN POS, rock bwd in RLOD on L (R remaining in place), rock fwd in LOD on R turning 1/4 R to face ptr & wall in CLOSED POS, hold 1 ct.

- 29 - 32 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 25-28 - but on last fwd step of Meas 32 M remains facing LOD as W turns 1/2 L to face M assuming CLOSED POS M facing LOD, hold 1 ct.

PERFORM ENTIRE ROUTINE FOR A TOTAL OF 2 1/2 TIMES, THRU MEAS 16.

- ENDING: TWIRL, -; 2, -; APART, -; POINT, -;

M walks fwd 2 slow steps in LOD as W does 1 slow RF twirl in 2 steps under lead hands; Change hands to joined M's R & W's L step diag apart from ptr. (M bwd on L & W bwd on R), hold 1 ct, point M's R & W's L toe twd ptr, hold 1 ct.

If you get around and visit the successful clubs, i.e., those that have survived for some years, it is very obvious that some have a lot more fun than others, and each club has its own personality, just like us people. Just like people, some clubs prefer to stay to themselves, while others love visitors; some never leave their own doorstep, while others aren't happy unless they are out visiting; some limit their activity to square dancing while others have numerous outside activities. There are myriad other contrasts and all sorts of combinations and degrees of the above, and by and large, I've noticed that the more active and outgoing the club, the better chance it has of surviving. The small club that keeps to itself may thoroughly enjoy life, but because of its lack of encouragement to outsiders usually fades away as one by one the members become inactive because of health or changing family situations, and there is no influx of new blood to keep it going. The history of our area contains many clubs that have already gone this route, and there are currently quite a few others that are far along the path.

The active club has two things going for it - by getting around, and therefore getting known, it will attract return visitors because the visitors know they will be welcome (and visitors are potential members), and more important, by having a lot of activities, the club will keep its members interested and happy. The key words are "keep them."

We talk about square dancing being our hobby, recreation, and absorbing interest, but actually the physical activity of dancing is not the only factor by any means. If it was, clubs would be unnecessary and we would just go anywhere and dance. What we really enjoy is the association with other people who also square dance. In our clubs we build up close friendly relations with individuals and we look forward not only to

dancing with our friends, but also to talking and eating with them. We gradually become closer and closer to one or several couples, who often become our social as well as square dancing friends.

This is our pattern, but if it is limited to our own club, we find that square dancing alone ordinarily will not keep our club going and growing after a year or so. Malnutrition will set in as more and more members find something else to do on club nights because nothing can hold our enthusiasm at a high pitch indefinitely without change. A club needs outside activities - as a club - to maintain the interest and enthusiasm after the honeymoon is over. Club picnics, cook-outs, parties, visits en masse to other clubs and hoedowns, or other group action not on the regular club nite will re-kindle dwindling interest. A club responsibility, such as undertaking a committee assignment at the Golden State Round-up, will weld the group together.

But inertia will kill these ideas aborning unless some one or some committee prepares and pushes the activities. Most members will happily go along if the ideas are set up and the details worked out, but most would never institute them. Many clubs have a "visiting committee" which looks over available outside hoedowns or club party nights in advance and recommends them to the club membership. The club decides which one to attend, and they go as a club. If a sizeable group decides to attend a small hoedown or party nite, the committee warns the host group so they can prepare for the invasion. A swarm of locusts is strictly in the amateur bracket compared to a gang of hungry square dancers when it comes to descending on a food supply and wiping it out. (You qualify as an individual. ed.note)

But non-square dancing club activities are also necessary as a break in the routine and as a method of welding friendships. Knowing people as square dancers only is knowing only one layer of their personalities, whereas being with them in other environments reveals facets of their character which were unknown and often unsuspected.

The more experiences we share, the closer we grow and the tighter the bonds that weld the club together. If we exchange letters with someone once every six months it is difficult to find something to write about, but if we correspond weekly it's easy. If we

talk to someone only occasionally there is little to say, but if we talk to them regularly, we can gabble away busily for hours. So it is with the club. If we are active, share many and varied experiences in and out of square dancing, the group remains fresh and interested, and as a result will endure for years. Sometimes I think the members of the small club struggling to survive would be far happier if they joined a larger active group. My own small club feels this way and are constantly suggesting I go join some larger club where my fantastic talents could be used to better advantage, in fact they are insistent upon it. Aren't they nice?

One of the problems facing Association clubs is setting up a hoedown without being aware of what competition they might face on that particular date. The Board has been working on some method whereby clubs would have some kind of an indication as to whether one or a dozen dances were planned for the same night. 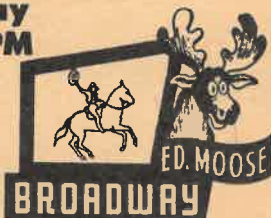

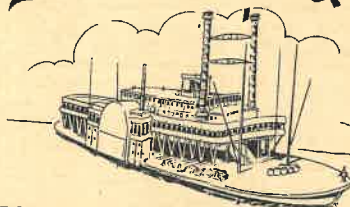

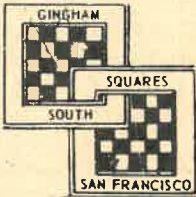
