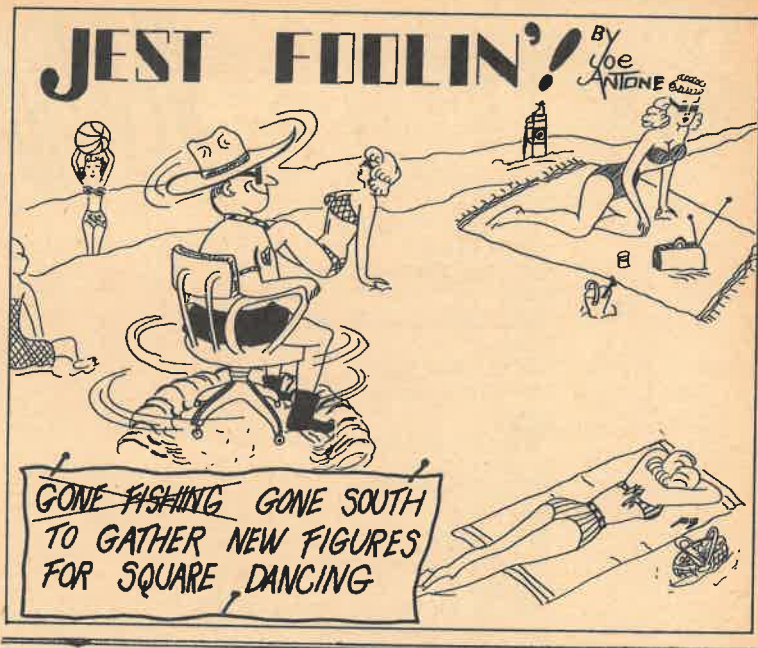

THE EYES HAVE IT !!

I analyzed the problem carefully, and with courage that would have brought a lump to your throat was dragged screaming to the eye doctor. THE CHANGING SQUARE

During the past ten years, the square dance picture has gone through many changes. Some necessary -- some not. Some good -- some bad. Yet we have lived through the bad to help push the good so that square dancing has survived to become a more healthy form of recreation.

As a pure form of dancing, it has become much more complicated. Whether this will help over the long run remains to be seen. It certainly makes it much more difficult for the teacher bringing in new dancers. If the average fledgling knew beforehand how much he or she had to memorize to become a competent square dancer -- well, we just wouldn't have any classes!

Many new basics have helped contribute to this complication of the square dance. How many in just the past year? Twenty? Thirty? How many were you exposed to? All of them -- or did you have a leader with enough common sense to sort them out and maybe try a few he thought might be workable?

The "average square dance couple" of today probably dances about once a week. They might attend one other dance a month if it is something special. This group of people will compose at least 90% of our square dancers. They still belong to P.T.-A.'s, Dad's Clubs, Church Groups, etc., as they very well should. This in itself will tend to give them a longer life as a square dancer. However, their capacity for learning and retaining basics (and rounds) is limited. It could be compared to a quart jar full of water. You pour another cupful into it and you still end up with just a quart of water. If you teach them a new basic, an older basic or movement is going to go by

the wayside. Is the new one better than the older, established and proven basic that will have to go? Just because it is new doesn't make it better! We should all take a long look at some of the newer basics before we put them on our permanent list.

The constant change of square dancing is with us. Unfortunately, I can't bring myself to believe it has all been for the best. We have stubbed our toes too many times. Let us hope that new basics do not become a necessary evil to keep people interested in square dancing. Too many callers today are using them as crutches instead of devising new ways to dance our existing movements.

New music rhythms have contributed to the change too. Most of these have been on the good side of the ledger. True, we have had 2/4, 4/4 and 6/8 with us for some time. We have not had rhythms such as Rock and Roll, Latin, Jazz and others in as true a form as we do today. While they can easily be overdone, some of these rhythms add greatly to the dance program and, brought in at the correct time, will perk up a floor of dancers. Competition in the recording industry has had a lot to do with this and the dancers will certainly benefit from it. Music for both singing and patter calls will probably continue to improve with the major companies looking for more sales. Let us hope this will help to override some of the bad things we are doing in square dancing.

Will square dancing be just as healthy and big ten years from now? If the changes now taking place are mostly for the good, then it will be bigger than ever. If not -- it will dwindle and die. We can only hope we are making the right decisions now for the future of this wonderful recreation.

THE QUALITIES OF LEADERSHIP

As Presented By Ed
Ferrario

DEFINITION

What is a leader? People follow leaders - if you have called a few years and have kept a club together you are a leader. That means that you have some or all of the qualities we shall discuss today - if you find with a frank look at yourself that there are soft spots in your shield of leadmanship, take stock. (If in doubt, ask your wife! She'll tell you, if you promise not to belt her.)

SINCERITY IN PURPOSE

I should list this first, because without it, you're a dead bozanga. You're sold on square dancing, because of what it stands for. I won't try to sell you because you wouldn't be here if you weren't. Along with this selling job let's add enthusiasm - if you yourself are sold, this should be no problem - one of the reasons we are losing some of our veteran callers, I believe, is this very lack. It would be wise however to avoid fanaticism. Not everybody in the world is going to square dance. My brother-in-law has fought me successfully for years, and I respect his tenacity. He plays a good game of poker, and I don't, so I shall be tolerant.

I only mention this because while you have enthusiasm and sincerity of purpose, don't shorten the candle. It's a long stretch.

ARE LEADERS BORN?

Not necessarily - Sometimes it is envisionment. An emulation process. Very often, a crises. This is true of many of our great leaders. You may copy your favorite callers' qualities of leadership, and do very well. Possibly better than he does, or you may be thrust into a spot. Here it is, boy, you're stuck.

WHAT SORT OF A PERSONALITY SHOULD HE HAVE?

First of all I think he has to like people. I didn't say love, because here he could get into a lot of trouble. Like - and genuinely so - people must like him. This will not be too difficult since most feelings or emotions are reciprocal. A rich sense of humor will carry most callers over rough spots. A sense of humor will keep your dancers amused too, because you should remember that you also are an entertainer as well as a leader. But don't be a bore.

WILLINGNESS TO WORK

The worlds greatest leaders were tireless. If you are lazy, I urge you to stir yourself. Developing a sense of responsibility to do the very best job you can, increases your capacities. Very few of us have reached our full capacity.

CHARACTER

This may be perhaps the most difficult segment of leadership to define. We do know, however, there are accepted basics in fact involved. (1) Your private life. People will judge you strongly on this. See how world leaders have dried on the vine when they are tainted by scandal. You are no different as a leader. (2) Personal contacts in a professional way with your co-workers, the callers, brand you as either poison or a good guy. Try to trample your way to the top, and I'll promise you they'll break both your legs on the way up.

INTELLECTUAL LEVEL

Not your I.Q. particularly, but your decision - reasoning quotient. A caller must make many, some easy, some difficult decisions. Can't help you much here but if you're having difficulty in this department, better develop your logic, or better yet, get your wife to help you. Sometimes too, your decisions must be encased in a velvet glove, but there is no avoiding them.

CONFIDENCE

That which people have in you, and that which you have in yourself. You have to like yourself for what you stand for and for what you are. So many persons hold themselves in contempt, a deterrent to leadership. With confidence comes poise. Don't confuse poise with pose. Poise is that inner stature, that kinship with the world. You've got most of the tenents we have mentioned. You can do the job and people damn well know you can.

HOWDY BEGINNERS!!

With the coming of the fall season there are many beginners square and round dance classes going full swing. This is all very fine and when they graduate they will not only be an asset to the club sponsoring them but will also rehabilitate the club.

Just what does the club owe them? In many cases the time to make sure that these new dancers will go out and continue to enjoy square dancing is while they are still beginners. Many dancers are lost during this period and many could have been saved if the club members would go all out to see that they (the beginners) are properly indoctrinated into the square dance movement.

The caller does his best to see that they are taught their basics and fundamentals and that they will be able to dance smoothly and correctly, why not the club members attend these classes and teach them the art of friendship and fellowship? I know that the reaction to this question is, "we have been through beginners so why should we have to continue to pull beginners through". If you harbor any such thoughts, just remember that these same beginners will one day be dancing with you as fellow club members, or at least you hope they will.

If club members of the club sponsoring a beginners group would get together and make up a rotating list for members to visit their class on different nights, posing no hardship on any one person, your new dancers would get a chance to know you and if you did a good job of being friendly, they would be eager to finish their beginners and intermediate so they could become members of your club.

Many clubs do have members attending their classes, but it seems that in most cases they are the same ones every night and even though they do a good job your future club members begin to wonder if they are the only dancers in that club. This is when they start to think about going to some other club when they have graduated.

To be a successful recruiter, you must sell the idea that there is no other club for them when they graduate but the club who is sponsoring the class. Some clubs go so far as to invite their class to some of their parties and special functions when they have progressed to the point of going into intermediate. They arrange their program so that all the calls and rounds are ones that their new dancers can do with comparative ease. This can be a lot of fun for both the new dancers and the experienced if you club members will make it so. This is where you really sell your club and square dancing to these folks, they will be enthused and won't mind continuing on through intermediate so that they can join your club as a full fledged member.

Remember that the new dancers are the life blood of your club and without them it is only a matter of time before you are dancing alone! And I do mean alone. This is a horrible fact but none-the-less true.

After you have started a class for beginners your responsibility has only just started. Do see that they get the opportunity to meet and dance with you before they have gone very far with their lessons. Remember these are the folks you need to fill up those empty squares in your club, so get out and make them feel not only wanted but also welcome.

The practice of tape recording square and round dance music at clubs, classes, dances, meetings, festivals, conventions, and camps has become so widespread that it now constitutes a serious threat to the square and round dance record industry.....In many cases, the people who do it are not conscious of the harm they do the industry nor are they aware that several laws are being violated.

It should be pointed out that any individual caller, teacher, leader, festival or convention committeeman, association officer or camp operator who allows a program under his supervision to be taped is directly implicated in whatever violations may be committed by reason of such taping.
