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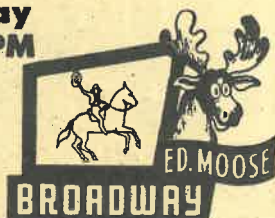
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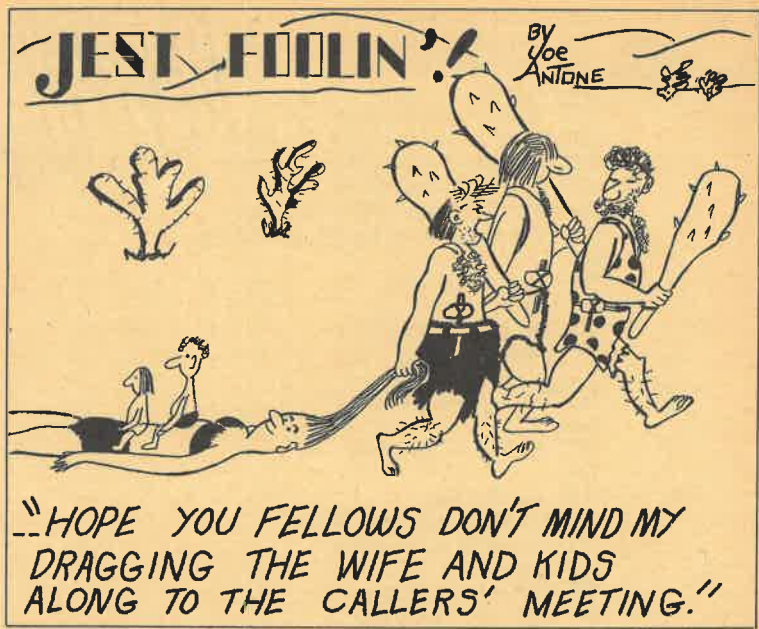

CITY LIGHTS

Dance Routine By: Elmer & Pauline Alford, The Dalles, Oregon

POSITION: Intro: Open Pos fag LOD. Dance: SCP.

FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout

RECORD: Blue Star #1657-B, Music By The Shannonnaires

INTRO: WAIT; WAIT; ROLL, 2, 3, TOUCH; ROLL BACK, 2, 3, TOUCH (To SCP);

Wait 2 Meas in OPEN POS fag LOD & slightly fag ptr with joined inside hands drawn bk twd RLOD; M rolls 1 full LF turn prog LOD (W roll RF) in 3 steps LRL, tch R; M rev rolls 1 full RF turn prog RLOD (W roll LF) in 3 steps RLR, tch L to end in SEMI-CLOSED POS fag LOD.

MEASURES

PART A

1 - 4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP, FLARE; BACK TWO-STEP; BACK TWO-STEP (To Open);

Dance two fwd two-steps prog LOD, flare L fwd with short "swing" & slight outward motion; Prog RLOD with two backward two-steps sliding apart on last two-step to assume OPEN POS fag LOD;

5 - 8 RUN, 2, FACE, TOUCH; ROLL/ACROSS, 2, FACE, TOUCH (to Butterfly); (Vine) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, TOUCH; LADY/UNDER, 2, 3, TOUCH ?(To SCP);

Prog LOD with 3 running steps fag ptr on 3rd step, tch R beside L; Release joined hands and change sides with a 1/2 free RF roll (W rolls LF) (Pass R shoulders so W rolls behind M) in 3 steps RLR, tch L beside R to face ptr in BUTTERFLY POS M's bk twd wall; "Grapevine" twd RLOD stepping side L, behind on R, side L, tch R; Release M's L & W's R hands & change sides W going under joined hands XIF of M as M passes behind her twd LOD & COH to end in SEMI-CLOSED POS fag LOD with RLR, tch L (modified Calif. Twirl);

9 - 16 REPEAT MEASURES 1-8 except M leads W in front to end in CLOSED POS M fag LOD.

PART B

17 - 20 WALK, -, 2, -, RUN, 2, 3, TOUCH; BACK, -, 2, -, RUN/BACK, 2, TURN, TOUCH (To face wall);

Prog LOD with 2 slow steps L, R; Prog LOD with 3 running steps LRL, touch R beside L; Prog RLOD with 2 slow bwd steps; Prog RLOD with 3 bwd running steps turning 1/4 RF to face wall RLR, touch L beside R; (Maintain CP throughout these 4 meas.)

21 - 24 APART, 2, 3, TOUCH; TOGETHER, 2, 3, TOUCH (To CP); TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN;

Release ptr & back away M twd COH (W twd wall) LRL, touch R; Do 3 fwd steps RLR, touch L, twd ptr & wall to assume CLOSED POS M's bk twd COH; Dance two RF turning two-steps prog LOD to end in CLOSED POS M fag LOD;

25 - 32 REPEAT MEAS 17-24 except end in SEMI-CLOSED POS fag LOD.

DANCE GOES THROUGH THREE TIMES

ENDING: TWIRL, 2, 3, ACKNOWLEDGE

W does RF twirl under joined lead hands as M takes 3 steps in place (W also takes 3 steps) fag ptr on 3rd step M's bk twd COH to change hands and ACKNOWLEDGE.

SEQUENCE: INTRO; AB; AB; AB; AB; ENDING.

A LEAD FOR LEADERSHIP

I would like to make a plea for understanding and support for those who have voluntarily taken on a job for the furtherance of our recreation.

I would like to rise in defense of meetings and the chairmen who handle them. One of the most necessary but most thankless jobs in square dancing - or in almost any other like recreation - is that of being chairman of a meeting. There is always some donkey who shouts out "Let's Dance!" As soon as the meeting is called to order, and a goodly number grumble that they are there to dance and not to conduct business. True, we are there to dance, but I wonder if these unthinking people ever consider what would happen if there were no meetings, and the clubs, associations, or committees conducted their business in casual conversation whenever two or more of the officers or members happened to meet. The usual complaint of "we're over-organized" is not based on facts - actually, we're not organized enough. A well-organized meeting is quick, productive, and satisfying - it is the poorly organized meeting that drags on and on, without results and without satisfaction. A meeting can be informal, and contrary to popular belief, the use of Roberts Rules of Order is not required for a meeting to be legal. But formal or informal, small group or large, routine or of grave importance, the success of the meeting usually rests on the shoulders of the chairman. A good chairman makes it seem easy and enjoyable, and a mediocre chairman difficult and unpleasant - but a biased, incompetent, or frightened chairman can cause a real shambles. More than one club has been torn apart by emotions born and bred in that kind of meeting, and the tragedy is that often those emotions never would have grown if a competent chairman had done his duty.

A chairman has to be tough enough to crack down - even in a friendly, sociable meeting in the rumpus room - when the meeting gets off the track, and yet he must instinctively know when to let humor and side issues have their innings. I know of no book that will teach these instincts - they come from experience and a native talent.

Why all this space for this subject? Because I am certain the answer to most problems is in leadership - and it is through meetings that the leaders lead. It is also through meetings that leaders are developed, and through meetings that the membership watches and evaluates the personalities and thereafter chooses its leaders. It is through meetings that the membership is apprized of what is going on, and has its opportunity to agree, disagree, or modify the actions that are suggested. (Here is the playing field of the aforementioned donkey who hollers "Let's Dance!", during the heart of the meeting. He stampedes the rest of the group, and the committee, or Board of Directors, or President, has to go ahead with actions without any help from the rank and file. Then guess who makes a bitter denunciation of the decision-making group or individual with cries of "railroad!" or "Dictatorship!"). And a lot of the membership agrees with him! And what is worse, the decision-making group feels guilty! Methods of dealing with this kook will be discussed next month.) It is also through meetings that the attitude of a club can be molded. Some clubs are noted for their spirit, outside activities and general whoop and holler attitude. Don't ever make the mistake of believing that this just happens! Behind this spirit lies a guiding group (the leadership) who makes decisions and pass them on to the membership (meetings), the necessary inter-action of leadership and meetings.

Before we get the idea that meetings are a necessary nuisance as a transmission line for leadership to the members, let me suggest that the meeting itself is a spirit builder. One of the attractions of square dancing that few people realize is that the act of square dancing necessitates close teamwork, and teamwork generates spirit. A football team generates tremendous esprit de corps, so that the team becomes larger than the members. A meeting, properly handled, is a form of teamwork that leaves us with a feeling of satisfaction and appre-

ciation of each other that is separate and apart from the results accomplished at the meeting. I'll have to continue this next month, because right now I'm attending a meeting at my home. The leadership (Jane) has just announced to the membership (me) that if I don't get this article to the editor (Fuzzy old Ed) right now the readership (you) won't have anything to read. We took a democratic vote on the matter, but I abstained. So how come I lost three to nothing?
