Last month I threatened to continue my article on the care and feeding of meetings, developing the thesis that the answer to most of our problems is in leadership, that it is through meetings that the leaders lead, and that the leader of a meeting is its chairman. I continue.

The relatively few meetings that involve large numbers of people, such as the general Delegate's meeting of the NCSDA, or the much more numerous committee meetings, are really easier to chair than are the business meetings of a club. The reason is simple - the people attending a general Delegate's meeting, or a committee meeting, are there for the express purpose of getting some business accomplished, while those in attendance at the business meeting of a club are usually there for the express purpose of dancing, and the meeting lies directly athwart their primary desires. The meeting is regarded as a nuisance by some and a necessary evil by most of the rest, leaving the chairman to face a group that is at best impatient, and often unruly and resentful. To overcome this we need to educate the rank and file dancer in our club to the vital need of the participation of that rank and file in the affairs of the group, and we need a good chairman to lead it. The education is the most difficult part. Sometimes a respected member of the group can give an inspirational talk and convince the majority that the meetings are necessary and should be supported wholeheartedly, but should this happy event take place, the chairman must be prepared to make the first few meetings snappy, humorous, and short. Once the policy of having meetings is well-established and the members expect them as a regular feature, most of the battle is over. But unfortunately, we don't always have a Grand Old Man of the club who can convince everybody, and we have to do it the hard way. Let's start by making the few little

preparations that often make the difference between success and failure.

We want to control the time and place of the meeting, but in a club situation, this is not easily done, because, of necessity, the meeting will be during the dancing evening at the dance hall. We exercise some control over the time by having it in the middle of the evening. If we hold it before the dancing starts there is tremendous pressure from the dancers to knock it off and start the dance, and also many of the members will not yet have arrived, particularly if they know a meeting is scheduled. If we hold it after the dancing ends, many will sneak out on the pleas of "babysitter" - or just sneak out. We control the place to some extent by at least concentrating the dancers in one end or side of the hall - and don't underestimate the importance of this maneuver. The quickest way for even a top-flight chairman to lose control of his meeting is to let them spread out too far, so the chairman loses eye-contact with some of the group. Once this happens, side conversations and horseplay starts and the meeting is lost. Don't apologize for the necessity of having a meeting but make it a little formal to the extent of having everyone pull up a chair or sit on the floor in one area so the chairman can stand in front of the group. Let them bring their coffee and soft drinks if they like. Be sure everyone comes - a couple of people away from the group, standing in the doorway or off to the side will break your control. Once you get organized, don't allow the meeting to drag, or get sidetracked in endless argument, which is a lot easier said than done. Some years ago my club got into an argument as to whether we would serve the cupcakes frosted or with whipped cream at a fancy party night - and the chairman allowed the argument to go on for over fifteen minutes during a dance-night meeting. It was surprising how much heat and animosity was developed during that time, and there was actually some residual bitterness. This was the chairman's fault entirely, and is a classic example of inadequate leadership. If there is a difference of opinion on a point

of no earth-shaking importance, allow brief discussion to bring out the major facets, take a simple vote to decide, and on with the meeting! Don't allow feelings to rise - it is better to assign the problem to a committee immediately and move on.

One of the important rules to remember is that a committee or board of Directors should hash out the details of most of the problems and make general decisions which can be ratified by the membership at large. Don't try to decide every little point at the full membership meetings. Most dancers couldn't care less, and the function of a board of directors is to take over this chore. On the other hand, the general membership must always be informed as to the decisions made, and have the opportunity of ratifying, modifying, or rejecting them.

As to the character who always hollers "Let's dance!" and refuses to conform, there are several gambits that may be used. If he is a real foul ball, the executive committee should take him aside and explain that the attitude is not appreciated. If he is trying to be funny, or is merely unaware of the importance of getting things organized, the chairman may ask him his opinion of the matter at hand, or just dump it in his lap as a one-man committee or research group to come up with an answer for the club. This doesn't always work, but most of them become less talkative thereafter. Some loud-mouths never learn. I am now the chairman of five committees and two research groups, am the only remaining member of six clubs, and have had dental surgery three times. But no one is going to deny me my right to speak my mind in my club!
