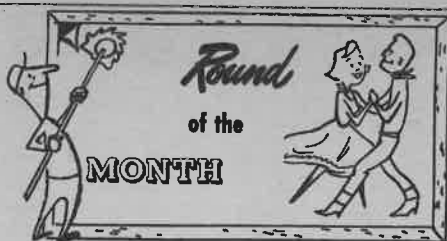

What ever Happened to Styling??

Way back in the olden days I wrote a column about styling and how important it was to square dancing. At that time I was making a plea for standardization of some of the maneuvers - now I am making a plea for styling of anykind. Over the last couple of years I've belabored the dancers for some of our shortcomings, but this time I would like to take our callers to task for this sin of omission that is daily becoming more obvious. Time was when every beginner's class put quite a bit of emphasis on the specific physical how-to of each of the various basics - not merely the over-all pattern, but also how to hold the skirts, the hands, the arms, etc., and the average newer dancer knew these finer points. They knew such things as how to hold their hands in stars, allemande thars, allemande lefts, and box-the-gnat, for example. There has been a lamentable lack of such instruction lately, and it is showing up in the increasing lack of smoothness and grace, and in some cases, downright awkwardness. A prime example of this lack of detail training is in the box-the-gnat. Note how many of the gals who have been graduated from beginner classes in the last couple of years do not know how to hold their hands correctly in a box-the-gnat. They hold their hands rigid, and after the turn-under is accomplished we look like we're playing thread the needle. The man has a choice of being a gentleman and taking the chance of being permanently deformed as his hand is turned backwards, or of laughingly breaking the wrist of his lovely lady if he holds firmly and turns her hand as he goes. In any case, the next maneuver is accomplished with the hand reversed - hardly the grace and styling desired.

I think the reason for this lack of training is that the number of basics and their variations has increased markedly in the last few years, and the length of the beginner classes has not. With so much more

to learn, something has to give, and most of the callers, not wanting to turn the class loose without teaching every basic, chose to cut the styling. This is also apparent in more than the handholds. For example, some of the newer dancers have not been taught that they shouldn't holler "short!" in a singing call - and as a matter of fact, many do not know the rule as how long the promenade should be - whether to do it short if they meet their partners at the end of a grand right and left one-quarter from home, or to go on all the way around. I find fewer and fewer of the gals are smooth swingers, and my wife informs me the same is true of the men. Even the shufflestep isn't universal anymore. And whatever happened to the pride we took in a small square? We find oval squares, oblong squares, and always, large squares. The dancers are not all taught to move in to the center on a promenade to close up the square.

These are only a few of the things that are no longer being stressed in beginner classes, or in workshop. I believe that the callers, who of necessity must be the leaders in this, should launch an intensive program of styling for the next couple of months to bring the area up to its former standards. If each caller would closely observe not only his group as a whole, but his individual dancers, spot the weaknesses in their training, and thereafter set up a program to iron out those rough spots, we could dramatically improve overnight. I'd like to see much more actual workshop on workshop night instead of hoedown-type dancing, and I'd like to see styling workshoped as a regular thing, not only during the projected intensified program. It is always more fun to do any athletic sport correctly, and therefore gracefully, and the more fun we have, the longer we will regain our dancers. If you like to whoop and holler and cut up in your own club, the styling won't slow you down or lessen our activity in the least. The smoother and more gracefully you dance, the more room and time there is for cavoring - and the cutting up should always be such that the dancers stay with the caller, and merely add the extras to suit their own fancy.

Certainly there are callers who still stress grace and styling, but I venture a guess that even the most conscientious do not do it as much as they used to. I'm also aware that part of the reason is that some of the dancers do not take kindly to being taught this, but I have always believed that the caller should be a leader, and have the integrity and personal pride to insist that his dancers dance correctly. If he is a leader, he should not only teach his dancers, but should be able to convincingly explain to them why they should want to learn this elementary styling. In short, we need more dedicated leaders among our callers, just as we do among our dancers. The caller's association might do well to pick this up. How about setting up some exhibition squares to show elementary styling - not exhibition-type twirls and tricks - but the correct way to do each of the basics? This would take work, but could be a tremendous benefit, not only to dancers, but to callers who would therefore have to make a decision as to how to teach each one.

I am writing this article at great personal sacrifice, because I know just what is going to happen as soon as this article reaches print. My many (?) good (??) friends (???) among the callers are going to gather around my square and with numerous helpful suggestions criticize my personal techniques into a shambles. I, with my customary foresight and aplomb, have already figured a way to withstand your criticism. From here on in, I intend to deliberately make mistakes so that you callers can be tested to see if you can pick them out. This will be a real test of my abilities, as I have danced so faultlessly for so many years it will be difficult to foul up. In the interest of square dancing, I will try.
