

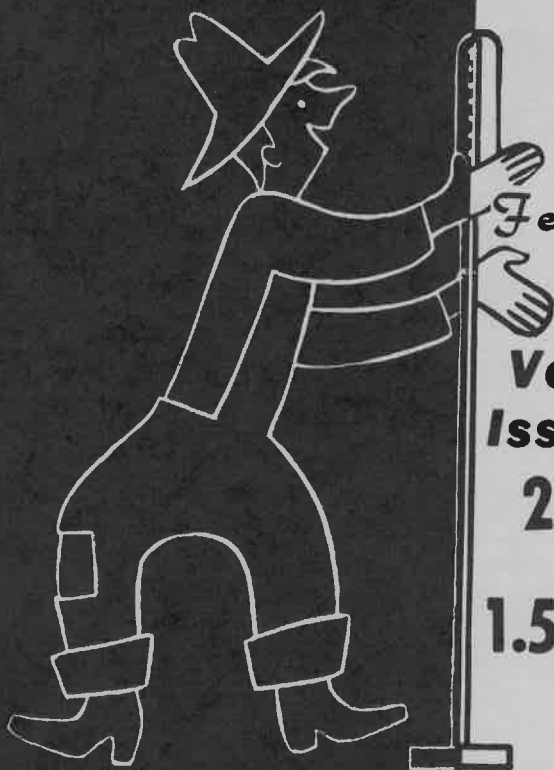

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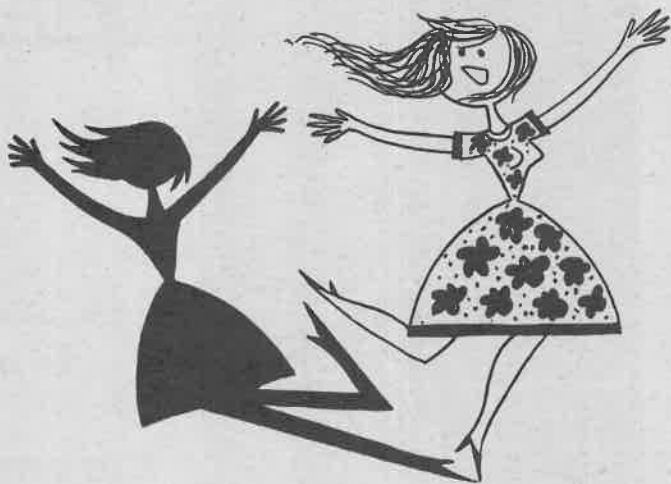

NEW ROUND DANCE

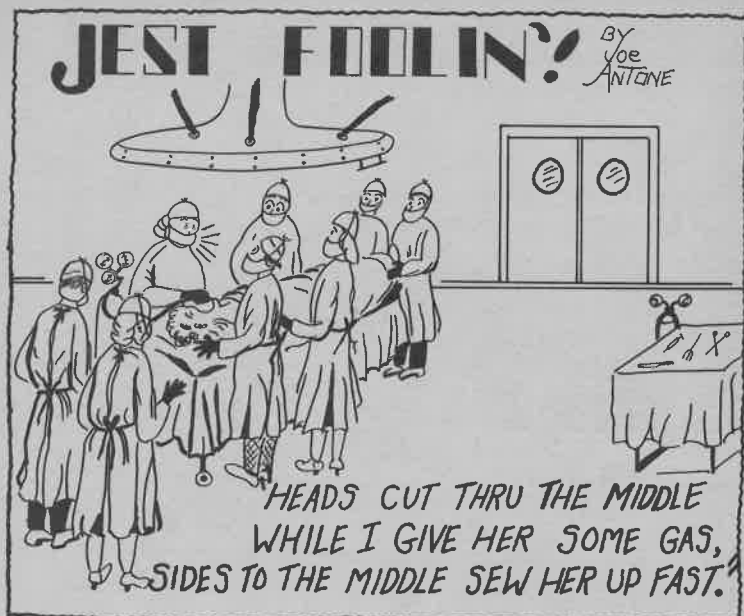

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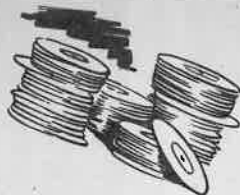

Because It's Fun, Brother !!

A recurring theme in these articles has been my slightly wide-eyed awe at how wonderful it is to be a square dancer among all the wonderful people who are square dancers. I've written a great deal about how different we are from any other recreation or sport group with our outgoing friendliness, exemplary conduct, respect for the rights of others, and bottomless ability to have fun. Often, as I wrote and thought about it, I was bothered because I was afraid I was gilding the lily a bit. After all, exactly the same sort of people play bridge, poker, or canasta, bowl, social dance, golf, swim, hike, knit, fish, or drink. Don't they have the same sort of camaraderie when they are gathered together in their groups as we do in ours? All we have to do is watch any of these groups at their play and know they didn't come within a country mile of it. But why!! It didn't make sense until I realized that there are some basic differences between our approach to our recreation and the approach of the other groups to theirs. Then I began to realize why we are unique.

First of all, most of the other recreations are competitive in one way or the other—as in bridge or other card games, where we compete against another couple or couples, or in golf or bowling where we not only compete against others but also against ourselves, by trying to beat par or better our average. Competition is exhilarating and a wonderful way of ridding ourselves of our aggressions, but it does not come under the definition of "fun" in the sense of laughter. On the other hand, in square dancing, we are not competing — we are cooperating. We get our enjoyment by helping others to become equals, not by trying to beat them. If a touch of Christian principle seems to have sneaked in here, don't knock it.

Secondly, we have the sense of belonging to some great secret fraternity. The attraction the secret fraternity has over the minds and emotions of men is attested by the fact that throughout the ages men have felt the need of banding together in a group, with really no other purpose than being a group. Many of these fraternities have endured for centuries and are still going. They have their rituals, and secret signs recognizable only by another member, and there is a feeling of comradeship generated whenever they meet a lodge brother, even if they have never seen him before. There is the obligation to help him if he is in trouble, to take him in if he is away from home, to accept him into their lodge if he has moved into their area. He is able to share, automatically and completely, their ritual, and feels perfectly at home in their lodge, even if he comes from half a world away. Why? Because he has learned the same rituals as they have, because the rituals have been standardized over the years for just that purpose — so every member has a common experience and heritage in the lodge. Isn't that square dancing? Don't we respond identically as the lodge brother, point by point? We have our rituals which are immediately recognized by another square dancer. We get the feeling of comradeship when we meet another dancer, even if he is a stranger. If a square dancer is in trouble, don't we rally around? Don't we take in the dancer who is away from home? (And one great and powerful truth is here — we do it because we feel like it and want to — not because we took an oath that says we have to!) and lastly, he is automatically and completely able to share our ritual and feel at home in our group, because he, too, has learned the same ritual. Try to feel this kind of comradeship in a bowling alley, golf club, or bridge table. Yep, we've got a real fraternity here!
