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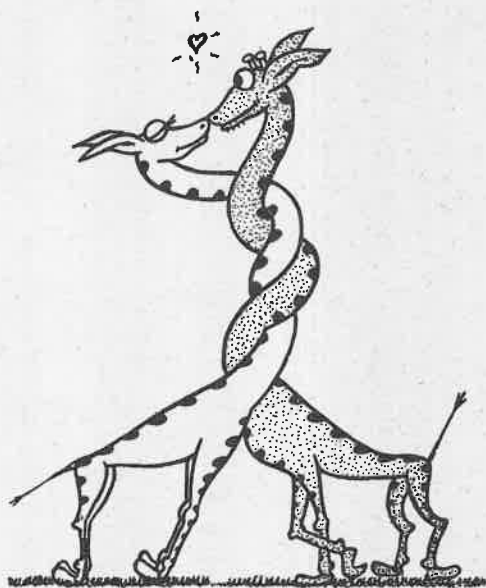
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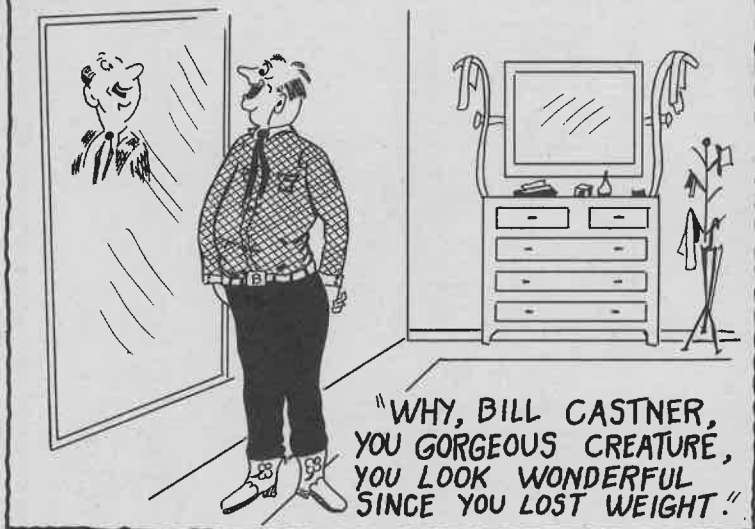

LET'S GO !

During the course of the last few years I've been holding forth ad nauseum on the subject of too many basics, too many non-directional basics, too many awkward and ungraceful and non-flowing movements, and maintaining that the average square dancer, if given the chance to vote, would throw much of the stuff into the garbage can where it belongs. During the course of those same years, I've heard of various committees of callers that were surveying the situation, with the purpose of trotting out with a list of acceptable basics. I always had a couple of simple questions, like "What ever happened to the committee?", and "List of basics acceptable to whom?", but no answer ever came back. Some of the committees were local, and some nationwide, but the results never filtered down to me, and to date I haven't seen results from any such survey.

Now we have another one - a joint committee of the Callers Association of Northern California and the Northern California Square Dancers' Association. The avowed purpose is the same as always - to bring some sense and direction out of a recreation that has often been guided more by second-rate status-seekers than by mature and capable caller and dancer leaders. They have come out with a first draft of their ideas and at this writing it is in the process of being discussed by the callers. Normally I try not to pin-point the action of any specific individual or group, but I'll break precedent on this, because maybe - just maybe - we can get something going. Many prior committees have been of well-known callers, who really represented no one but themselves - and after they came to some sort of conclusion, there was no one to help them get it accepted by any sizeable portion of the dancers. Also, it

was not unusual to see one of the authors of the new list be the biggest violators thereof. Other committees have been of lesser known callers, and although they may have represented some group or other, the prestige of the committee wasn't great enough to have their efforts taken seriously by anyone but their own group. My point is simple. Some of these prior efforts were excellent and would have accomplished a good deal - but

there was no machinery set up to pass the word to the callers and dancers or to work continuously and effectively for its adoption. So their work disappeared without a trace. However, the present committee has a couple of things going for it: First, two organizations that can work for the publicizing of the results and the enforcement thereof upon its members - if the members agree to submit to the enforcement - and secondly, "Square Dance Where", actually an arm of the Callers Association, (What am I doing here!) which can be a powerful influence if the callers choose to wield it. Therefore this committee, if it comes up with some good answers, may be able to do something about it. That makes this committee worthwhile in the first place.

I would like to address myself to three groups: The committee, the dancers, and the callers. The committee must remember that it represents only the thinking of the few members thereon, and must - and I mean must - keep a free and easy path open between them and the callers and dancers for ideas. This committee isn't - and does not pretend to be - the last word in callers and dancers, but is merely the focal point for the ideas and wants and desires and gripes of the callers and dancers, so they can be sifted and weighed and evaluated, and then passed back to the callers and dancers for a further evaluation. The callers must back the committee - the majority of whose members represent them - and feed the committee their ideas and convictions, and be ready to back the decision of the committee when the survey is completed.

The dancers? The sleeping Giant! Outnumbering the committee and all callers by hundreds to one, but never speaking up, never attempting to guide their own recreation, always meekly dancing what is called without protest. Dancers - this is your chance to actually do something about it! Time after time, after one of my rabble-

rousing articles against the garbage in square dancing, dancers (and callers) have come up to say how thoroughly they agree, but that they don't know what they can do. Now you know! Let's get our ideas before this committee. Remember, one voice is one voice, whether you're well-known or just one of the anonymous dancers. I've often wondered whether this column is worthwhile, and this is a good chance to find out. Maybe I can serve as a pathway between the committee and the dancer. If you will write me care of this magazine concerning any phase of the committee's interest, which includes square dance movements, square dancers' round dances, and the adequacy of beginners' classes and beginners' teachers, I will see to it that the committee gets your ideas, withholding your name if you request. Those who don't write can never again legitimately complain about the calls, round-dances, or square dance teachers, because they failed to do anything about it when given the opportunity. Let's go!

Square Dancers Ass'n No. Calif. Larry Butzer

This will come out in the April issue of Square Dance Where, and it may seem a little premature but - time sneaks up on us. Comments have been coming in from far and wide about Principal Callers calling at Fifth Saturday dances in competition with the Association Stampedes. Some against but an overwhelming majority in favor of the decision of the Committee. This is good, since it at last has been brought into the open and we sincerely hope that the will of the dancers of this Association will be respected.

We had the privilege of attending the Peninsula Stampede with local callers doing the honors. We have to be truthful and admit that this was one of the finest Stampedes we have attended in many a moon. The crowd was receptive, the calling was tops and from the way things looked everybody else had a good time too.

With regard to Stampedes and Fifth Saturday dances. There seems to be some misunderstanding about member clubs sponsoring a Fifth Saturday Dance if it is advertised as a "Beginners Hoedown". Our By-Laws specifically state that no member club shall sponsor a dance on a Fifth Saturday. There is no reference to any exception. We hope that this will clear the air on this matter.

According to Ed Kettwig, Advance Ticket Chairman, reservations are already coming in for the Round-Up. And - included in these reservations are requests for Breakfast tickets. Again this is good, because there is a limited sale of Breakfast tickets and first come first served.
