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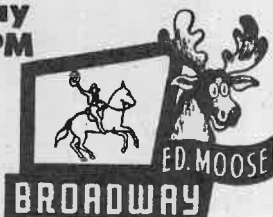
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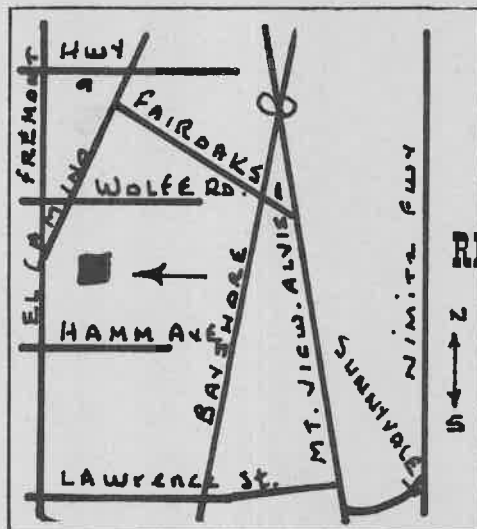
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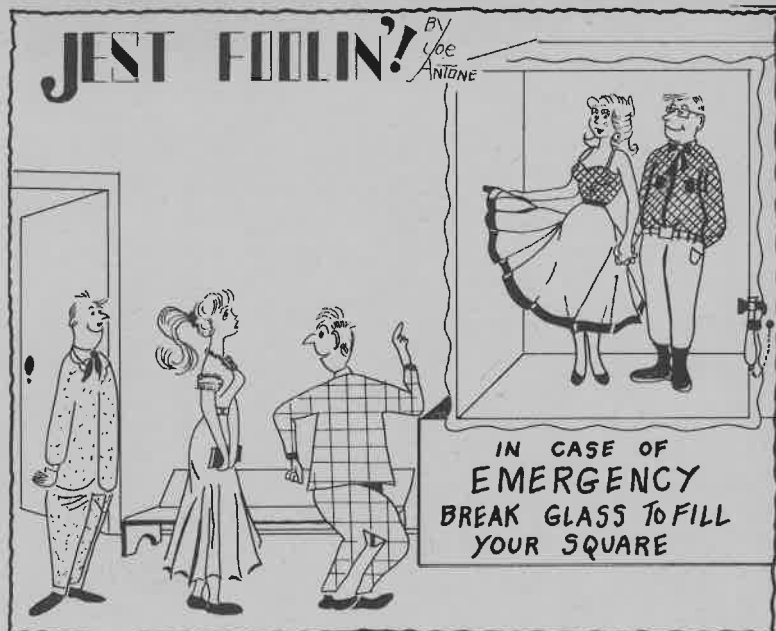

LET'S COME TO GRIPS !!!!

I never really thought about it before, but most of us have been laboring under a misapprehension about square dancing for a long time. We think in terms of having two left feet, and of stumbling around the floor because our feet don't want to go where they should. I suddenly got to thinking that we square dancers don't really dance with our feet as do other dancers—we dance with our hands. What have you been taught to do with your feet in square dancing? Only to shuffle! We don't follow our feet around in a square dance—we pull ourselves around with our hands and the feet merely follow! Think about it, and you'll be as surprised as I when the thought struck me. Do-sa-dos, weave the rings, and a few others are the exceptions where we proceed without hauling ourselves along like a mountain climber going up a rope. We feel sort of exposed and deserted when we have to go it alone. Now that I think of it, half our square dancing consists of reaching out for a hand, arm, or waist. No wonder we enjoy it! In terms of control, a really good dancer can subtly guide his partner by almost imperceptible pressure in the right direction, and a gal can tell me whether she wants to be twirled or assisted by a push in certain maneuvers by the pressure of her hands. This is an almost completely neglected area of styling.

Apart from styling, the presentation, feel, and withdrawal of the hands in square dancing is a tip-off as to who and what you are, by means of your grip or lack of same. The gals present everything from a limp bunch of boneless and nerveless fingers to a paralyzing grip that brings tears to my eyes, and I'm sure the gals say exactly the same thing about the men. This variation in type creates quite a problem when I try to fit my style to conform to that of my partner of the moment, and when I think that I have four different partners changing back and forth in each square, I wonder how I ever get through a square. (Many of us have been

wondering if you ever get through a square. Ed. Note.) Let's say the first girl has a limp grip, the second a knucklebuster, the third a quick slap and take out, and the fourth a lingering, caressing-type grip. After the first time through, I have them spotted, and react accordingly. This is fine until a grand right and left when I lose track of the sequence and grip down hard on the limp one and bring her to her knees, give a frail shake to the amazon who promptly renders my hand useless, give a long caressing grip to the third, who promptly freezes me with an outraged glare, and jerk my hand quickly from the fourth, who then decides that I hate her. Often you can tell who is squeezing who's hand, because they forget and squeeze the next one too. I've gotten so confused I've even squeezed my own wife's hand.

The men have peculiarities in hand-grips also. The gals have complained in the past about the too heavy grip many men give without meaning to, causing the wedding rings to become elliptical, and also about the amorous squeeze that some guys give to all the gals on the off-chance someone might respond. However, I'm referring to the grip men give each other, as when four men are in a square-through. I don't know whether it's because they think it is a little un-manly to be holding another man's hand, or if they have to impress the other three guys that they are the epitome of masculinity, but quite a few make sure that their grip is particularly hard at those times. Frail things like myself are in danger of severe bruising under those circumstances. I've often had to bite my lip to keep from whimpering. In order to counteract this, I've been using weights, squeezing a rubber ball, and using spring hand-grips for several months now. I can't dance any better, but try to take a sandwich away from me!
