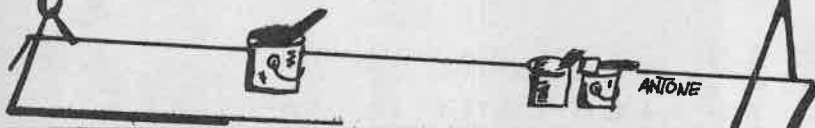

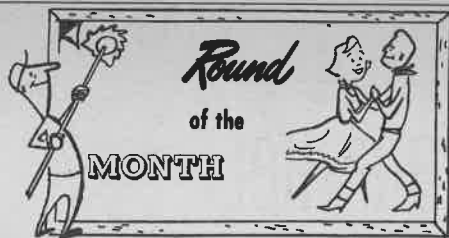

RECORD: "Cape Cod Waltz" - Windsor 4695
 POSITION: Intro: Open-facing. Dances: Closed Pos. M facing RLOD
 FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout -- directions for M
 MEASURES: INTRODUCTION

1 - 4

WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT, -; MANEUVER, 2, CLOSE (to CP M facing RLOD);

Wait 2 meas in Open-facing Pos; Step apart on L, pt R fwd, hold; Do 3-ct maneuver R, L, R to end in CLOSED POS M facing RLOD.

PART A

1 - 4

(R) TURNING WALTZ; TURN TO SCAR; BWD WALTZ; (L) TURN TO BANJO;

Standard R waltz turn starting bwd M's L for 2 meas prog LOD for a full turn plus blending into SIDECAR POS M facing RLOD; Start L for a bwd waltz LOD; Bwd on R turning L 1/4 into closed BANJO POS M facing LOD.

5 - 8

FWD WALTZ; FWD, FACE, OUT (to CP); (Box) FWD, SIDE, CLOSE; THRU, MANUV, CLOSE (to CP);

In Bjo Pos waltz fwd LOD; Do 1/4 R turning waltz into CP M facing wall; Do 1/2 box stepping fwd twd wall on L, swd R, close L; Adjusting to SCP step thru twd LOD on R (W thru on L), maneuver in 2 steps to CP M facing RLOD.

4 - 16

(R) TURNING WALTZ; TURN TO SCAR; BWD WALTZ; (L) TURN TO BANJO; FWD WALTZ; FWD, FACE, OUT (to CP); (Box) FWD, SIDE, CLOSE; THRU, SIDE, CLOSE (CP M fac wall);

Repeat action Meas 1-7; then step thru M's R into SCP, swd LOD on L as face ptr, close R ending M facing wall in CP.

PART B

17 - 20

(SCP) FWD WALTZ; LADY IN FRONT (to CP); (L) TURNING WALTZ; WALTZ (face wall);

Turning to SCP on 1st step do fwd waltz LOD; As M does another fwd waltz with small steps he leads W into 1/2 L turn IF of him to CP; Do 2 L turning waltzes prog LOD for 3/4 turn to end in LOOSE-CP M facing wall.

21 - 24

(Vine) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; THRU, MANUV, CLOSE (to CP); (R) TURNING WALTZ; TWIRL to BFLY;

In Loose-CP vine swd LOD L, R, L (W XIB also); Step thru on M's R (W on L), step L, R maneuvering to CP M facing RLOD; Standard R waltz turn starting bwd on M's L for 1/2 turn; M does 1 fwd waltz LOD as W starts a RF twirl stepping bwd on L, then R, L under his L and her R hand ending in BFLY POS momentarily.

25-28

WALTZ AWAY; TURN IN, 2, CLOSE; BWD WALTZ; TURN IN, 2, CLOSE; Swinging joined hands (M's R & W's L) fwd waltz fwd and away from ptr; Move on down LOD as turn in twd ptr (M 1/2 R) swinging same hands back twd RLOD then releasing to join M's L & W's R in L-OP facing RLOD; Do 1 bwd waltz LOD; Continue bwd LOD turning in twd ptr (M 1/4 L) as swing joined hands bwd and thru twd LOD and releasing to join new inside hands (M's R & W's L) to end in momentary BFLY POS M's back to COH.

29 - 32

SOLO WALTZ TURN; ON AROUND, SIDE, CLOSE (face out); (Box) FWD, SWD, CLOSE; THRU, MANUV, CLOSE;

Starting from Bfly on M's L and swinging joined rear hands thru twd LOD step fwd LOD on L starting M's L turn (W to R on R), swd R as release joined hands, close L in BACK-TO-BACK POS; Join M's L to W's R hands as continue turn stepping bwd M's R turning, swd L, and closing R assuming CP with M facing wall; Repeat Box-Manuv action of Meas 7-8.

DANCE THRU THREE TIMES

ENDING: On final Meas 32 -- THRU, SWD (LOD), close (M facing wall); APART, POINT, -; Ending M's bk twd COH (W's to wall) with his R & her L hands joined.

WHAT WAS THE FRESNO TRIP LIKE?

Every year the Square Dance Association of California has a convention. This year it was held in Fresno. It was attended by about thirty members of the BNB'S of San Francisco. Among those present were our President, Bill Gregory, Ex-President, Corinne O'Neal, Delegate, Al Zais, our caller, Don Shotwell and many others. Tropicana Lodge just outside of town served as headquarters and was an ideal place with a swimming pool, tropical gardens and latest improvements.

The convention itself took place on the Fairgrounds and lasted three days, commencing Friday evening. Over 11,000 attended it and three buildings were required to take care of them all. One was the Main Building which also served as headquarters, next to it the Armory and across from it for want of a better name may be called the "barn".

When we got to the Main Building the first night, it was already jammed. The place had a certain flaw in its structure in

that the building zig-zagged in shape, sort of bulging out like a bag in the center. It narrowed at the entrance and the exit making it seem as though it had two funnels. This was all-important as number one couple had to have its back to the caller and thus serve as a guide for the rest of the squares. An impromptu platform was set up and the caller had to call attention to the squares to be on the lookout as to what position they were in. A fine situation! Be that as it may, all you had to do was to look at the joyful faces of the couples moving around the square to see what a fine time they were having. And when you come to think of it how could it be any different when they were dancing to the music of the Westemaïres, and to top-notch calling.

After-dinner parties were given after the dances and the food, although served free of charge, was fabulous. Over five hundred people attended each party. This gives you an idea of the expense and trouble to which the square dance clubs of Fresno went to prepare adequately for the occasion. They deserve a big hand for the job they did. And we are all grateful to them.

Fresno is an ideal place for a convention as it is situated about half-way between San Francisco and Los Angeles. A member of the City Council gave an address of welcome. In so doing he informed us of a convention hall being built right now with all the latest improvements and conveniences. It should be ready in about two years and should take care of any existing problems.
