C'Est Magnifique



C'Est Magnifique

RECORD: "C'Est Magnifique" - Hi-Hat 801
 POSITION: Intro - Open-Facing; Dance - Semi-Closed facing LOD
 FOOTWORK: Opposite, directions for M except as noted.
 MEASURES INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; TURN AWAY, -, 2, -; 3, -, 4, -;

Wait 2 meas in Open-Facing Pos (8 cts); Then circle away from each other (M LF, W RF) four slow walking steps L, -, R, -; L, -, R, - returning to take SEMI-CLOSED POS to start dance.

DANCE

1 - 4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP (to Loose-CP); VINE, 2,3,4; WALK, -, TURN OUT, -;

In Semi-CP and starting M's L (W's R) do 2 fwd two-steps prog LOD turning to LOOSE-CLOSED POS on last step; Do a quick 4 ct grapevine stepping L swd, R XIB of L, L swd, R XIF (W also XIF); Adjusting to OPEN POS take 2 slow walking steps L, -, R, - turning to a modified BACK-TO-BACK POS (stand slightly away and diag) M facing COH and slightly LOD.

5 - 8 SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS IN BACK (to L-Open), -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to CLOSED POS), -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (to Semi-CP);

In Back-to-Back Pos step L swd (and slightly away) at the same time re-leasing hands, close R to L, step L bwd turning to face RLOD and ending in LEFT-OPEN POS momentarily (M's L & W's R hands joined), -; Turning to face ptr step R swd, close L to R, step thru on R (both XIF) ending in CLOSED POS M's back to COH, -; Do 2 RF turning two-steps prog LOD ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEASURES 1-3.

17 - 20 WALK, -, 2, -; POINT FWD, - (Hitch) BACK, CLOSE; FWD, -, POINT FWD, -; (Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD, - (to BUTTERFLY);

In Semi-CP do 2 slow steps fwd L, -, R, -; Point L fwd, hold 1 ct, step L bwd, close R to L; Step L fwd, -, point R fwd, hold 1 ct; Step R bwd, close L to R, step R fwd adjusting to BUTTERFLY POS (M's back to COH), -.

21 - 24 SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (to Semi-CP);

Step L swd twd LOD, close R to L, step L thru (both XIF) to take momentary LEFT-OPEN POS (Facing RLOD M's L & W's R hands joined), -; Facing ptr step R swd (RLOD), close L to R, AGAIN step R swd, hold 1 ct while adjusting to CLOSED POS; Do 2 RF turning two-STEPS prog LOD ending in SEMI-CP facing LOD.

25 - 32 REPEAT ACTION OF MEASURES 17-24.

DANCE GOES THRU TWO TIMES

ENDING: TWIRL, -, 2, -; STEP APART (FACE), -, BOW, -;

After completing dance the second time thru W twirls RF under joined lead hands in 2 slow steps as the M walks fwd 2 slow steps L, -, R, -; Taking Open-Facing Pos step fwd and away to face ptr, acknowledge as music ends.

Those of us who danced to his calling on his visit to the Bay Area in the Fall will testify to the fact that Glen is an artist in the square dance field and a natural on the singing calls. Saturday nights dancing at the Round-up will be superb with Glen sharing the calling honors.

DON FRANKLIN

Don is a native of Colorado having lived all of his life there. His wives name is Ruth, and they have two children. He is an electronics technician by trade and built his own first equipment. He has been in the calling field for about four years and recorded for Marvin Shilling, but now owns his own recording company and has put out seven records in the nine months it has been operating. His latest effort is "Sugar-Coated Baby". Don has been very busy in the four years of his calling, having M.C.'d festivals in Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Nebraska. He calls for five clubs regularly in his area and will co-M.C. the Holiday in Dixie in Louisiana just before coming to California for the Round-up.

He has written some of the music for his singing calls and enjoys yodeling. Don will be calling on Sunday nights Round-up program.

JIM MAYO

Jim started dancing as a teenager in 1947. Two years later he started calling. Jim puts great emphasis on rhythm in music and has a beat that has made him one of the top callers in New England. He is a busy boy who calls for three clubs in his area and also teaches two round dance classes with the assistance of his wife, Clara.

Jim is presently president of the Tri-State Callers Association and Secretary of the New England Council of Callers Associations.

Even though the Mayos drove 24,000 miles last year in connection with square dancing, this is still a hobby for Jim. His occupation is as a buyer for a research laboratory. His only regret is that he would like more time for skiing in the winter months.

Jim will share the program Sunday night with Don Franklin.

LOUIS AND LELA LEON (Round Dance Team)

Louis and Lela have been called a most graceful and charming round dance team. They have been responsible for several favorite round dances. They have pioneered round dancing in the Bakersfield area and enjoy it thoroughly.

Both of the Leons are callers and share honors. Lela does the singing calls and Louis calls

the patter. At the square dance clubs for which they call, only Rounds of the Month are taught. The more difficult rounds are reserved for their Round Dance Groups. The Leons place a particular emphasis on styling. They feel that it is not so important as to what people dance as to what they look like when they dance. They place the next emphasis on being taught correctly as they do not want any dancer to have to un-do or unlearn something learned incorrectly. This they feel is discouraging and can break a prospective round-dancer.

The Leons will have composed for us and will dance in exhibition a new round entitled "The Golden State Waltz" and is so aptly named for our Golden State Round-up.

WHY A HALL?

I have always wondered why it is across the San Francisco Bay square dance clubs have choice places in schools where they can carry on their activities. Witness, for example, the Rockridge School used by the Berkeley Squares. And on this side of the Bay, folk dancers have at their disposal playgrounds and recreation centers. But when it comes up to square dancing, it seems we are like orphans. The city authorities will not give us a tumble.

And then I came across his honor, the Mayor, and put the question straight up to him, namely, why one, folk dancing, received favors from the administration, while the other, square dancing, was left out in the cold. He looked up at me and smiled, "I did not even know there was a difference between the two".

So there you are. What in all probability it amounts to is that the issue of folk vs. square dancing never reaches the highest echelon. By that I mean there is a Recreation Department which sets the policy of the administration to follow. And it is the

department's manner of misinterpretation which accounts for the present state of affairs, namely, that folk dancing is looked upon as a form of recreation, but when it comes to square dancing, they just look the other way.

A better hall we undoubtedly need. Not only that but it should be a school with a good floor, acoustics, well lit, and roomy with lots of space. Our job, then, is to direct our attention to the proper city authorities and present our side of the case to them. In other words, what we have to do is to convince them of the role that square dancing plays in the community...that it is a social-community affair, non-profit and for the benefit of residents of the area.

I am quite convinced that when we put our point of view over, we will get results - we will have the right school for our square dancing, and we will no longer have to depend upon a dingy, little hall, the kind we have to put up with right now.
