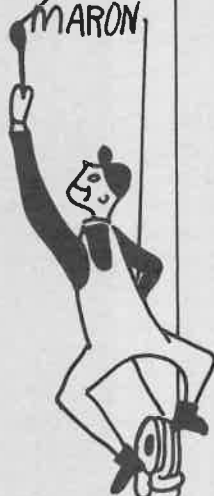

LET'S TALK WORKSHOP !!!!

ASKS **Larry Butzer**

Bob Barthol has departed from the scene after expounding his thoughts on Square Dancing for many, many months. Anyone who attempts to write a column soon finds out it is impossible to please everyone but if any columnist came close it was Bob. Yes, Bob, we will miss you, but knowing you as I do I am sure that in the future some little "problem" will start to bug you and to get it off your chest you will come forth with another of those so very interesting and opportune articles. Let's hope that something starts to bug you real soon.

In order to fill the void left by Bob's departure the Editor of this progressive little bundle of Square Dance information (if you doubt that it is "progressive" stop and think—has any other publication deliberately changed the calendar in order to have two months of June in one year and no July?) has asked me to try occasionally to fill up the space formerly used by Bob. That I can do, fill up the space. But to fill it up with material on the same level as Bob's—I'm not even going to try. All I can do is start the music and see who dances.

Had an opportunity to listen to a group of callers and dancers discuss workshops and their effect on the overall Square Dancing picture. This subject, like that of basics, seems to have no terminating point, it could go on from now to dooms day with no hope that a point could be reached where everyone could agree. But—even though everyone cannot reach a point of agreement, perhaps there is a point that can be reached where everyone will be more or less agreed that the workshop and the Square Dance club can in effect work together.

Workshops do have their place in Square Dancing. The only thing that is necessary to prove this statement true is the number of dancers who attend and enjoy them. If even a small minority of the total number of dancers feel that they want an opportunity to dance at a higher level than that provided by the average club then they should have the privilege of taking advantage of the facilities provided—by whom is beside the point. When these dancers do attend workshops they should not be criticized by those who do not because after all

Square Dancing is supposed to be fun and who shall say where any individual shall have his Square Dancing fun?

Now let's turn the record over and find out what's on the other side. I can't make myself believe that there is a single Square Dancer who does not believe that the Square Dance club as we know it is the heart of the Square Dancing picture. Square Dancing got to where it is today because of the efforts of small groups banded together to provide an enjoyable recreation for themselves. In these groups the newcomer learned to dance through the efforts of hardworking callers and club members. I can't help but wonder what would happen to the various workshop groups if all of a sudden all of the Square Dance clubs were to fold; where would the people come from who wanted to dance at a higher level?

Another point to consider is workshops conducted in schools. Obviously the caller conducting the workshop is not doing it for the sheer pleasure of providing entertainment for the dancer. He is doing it for one reason and one reason alone—the money he can make from this venture. He is not to be condemned for this—after all he is providing a commodity that is desirable to a certain cross section of dancers and they are willing to pay for it. But, and this is a major point, should a profit making venture for an individual be allowed to use public schools for the same fees as a non-profit Square Dance club? It is conceivable that eventually someone will ask, "How come?" and the end result might well be an increase in cost to the club. We now start the vicious circle. Increased costs to the club result in more clubs folding and a decreased source of supply for workshops.

In summing up the picture I believe that most of us will agree that both the workshop and the club have a place in Square Dancing. The workshop for those who enjoy the challenge of high level dancing and the club for those who enjoy the dancing at a club level. However the workshop does draw from the club thereby reducing the effectiveness of the club and when this occurs Square Dancing is hurt in a vital spot.

Might this be an answer? How about all dancers giving their blessing to the workshop and the workshop in return requiring a paid up membership card from an active Square Dance club as prerequisite for membership.

We were very surprised recently to find that there is a strong resentment on the part of some Callers, on the National as well as the Local scene, towards having to pay their way into some of the big Square Dance events.

They seem to feel that calling one or two tips in a weekend affair should discharge all of their obligations to the sponsors and dancers and entitle them to enjoy all the many benefits of the weekend free and gratis.

We fail to see where these callers have any complaints coming at all. They have two ways to answer this problem.

Accept the invitation to donate a half hour of their time over the weekend to help make the affair a success, pay their admittance fee, go and enjoy the opportunity to call for these people, then have a ball dancing the rest of the weekend. I assure you that you will get your money's worth.

You have one other choice. Turn the invitation down and stay home and sulk. It is as simple as that.

Realize that the people who are sponsoring this affair have assumed a tremendous financial responsibility in the way of rentals of dancing facilities, etc. When you have up to \$1200 a night hall rental fee to meet plus all the organizational expenses involved in an affair of this magnitude, you are well along on the ulcer trail.

Not every area is fortunate enough to have dancing facilities furnished to them free.

We find that there seems to be a strong feeling amongst some of the callers, mostly from the so called National level, because once in a while one of these hits the jackpot and winds up in the black instead of the red. So there's something wrong with an area making an honest buck that invariably

is plowed back into the Square Dance activity? We think the only sin there, is that the people doing the crabbing didn't get their hands on some of it.

We understand that some of the so called "National Callers" are very unhappy about having to pay their way into these affairs.

There can be no question that the presence of some of the callers of this caliber on a dance program is a very distinct drawing card, and also adds to the color of these big events. However, this works two ways you know. Where else is a caller going to get as large an audience to listen to what he has to sell except at an affair like this? As far as some of them crying because they have to pay for their advertising in programs, isn't that just good business practice?

We don't like the expression "Hiring Hall", but, isn't that exactly what some of our callers are apparently considering these affairs? We wonder if some of their resentment doesn't arise from the fact that perhaps they don't contract as many engagements as they think their "Talents" entitle them to.

In closing we would like to review one, from our point of view, very unfortunate remark. The "National Callers" resent having to take their place on the program among "Hundreds of Unknown Callers". For the National Callers who have this attitude, I've got some news. The dancers you are trying to sell your bill of goods to, are dancers that were trained by your Unknown Caller. If the activity depended upon those sent into the picture by the travelling caller, we would be in sorry straits indeed. Or could it be that some of these Unknowns rock your Apple Cart when they are on the same program with you? Nuf-Sed!

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- 1. Caller:** An active callers, calling to one or more classes or groups regularly for more than one year. Voting member. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
- 2. Teacher:** Teaches one or more folk or square dance group and is actively interested in improving square dance teaching. Voting member. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
- 3. Subscriber:** Either a caller or teacher as defined above but resides outside of the Northern California area. Has no vote. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
