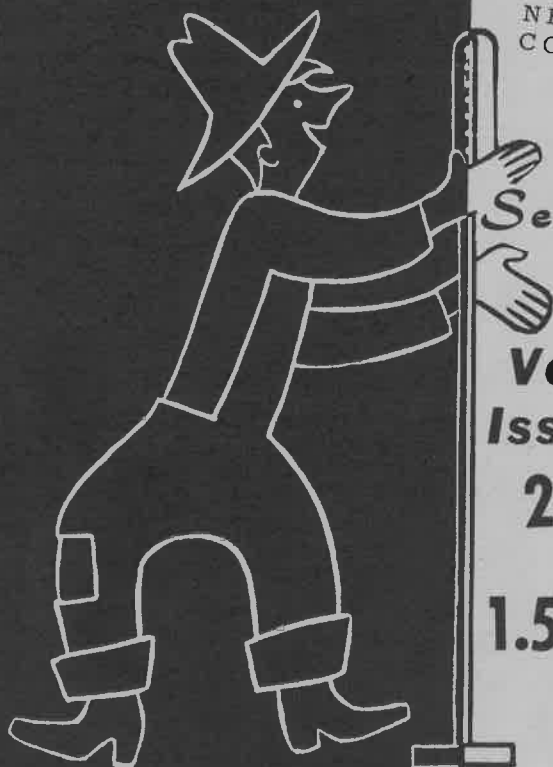

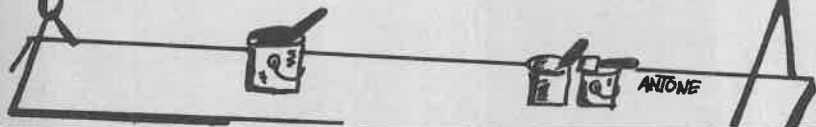

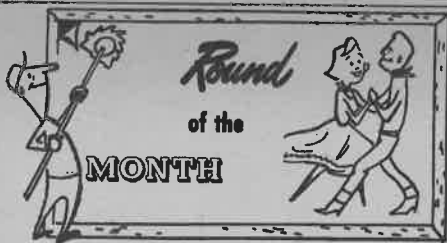

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER (to S Car), -, TOUCH, -;

Wait 2 meas in Diag Open-Facing Pos M's R & W's L hands joined; Step bwd away from ptr on L ft, -, pt R twd ptr, -; Step fwd twd ptr on R blending to SIDECAR POS M facing diag twd wall and LOD, -, tch L to R, -.

DANCE

1 - 4 CROSS TWO-STEP (to Bjo); CROSS TWO-STEP (to S Car);

CROSS TWO-STEP (to Bjo); CROSS, STEP, STEP (W LF spin - to CP), -;

In S Car Pos and moving LOD cross L ft in front of R diag twd wall (W XIB), close R to L, fwd again on L rising slightly on ball of L and turning into BANJO POS, -; Repeat previous action starting R ft and moving diag twd LOD and COH ending in SIDECAR POS; Repeat action starting L and moving diag twd LOD and wall ending in BANJO POS; With M's L & W's R hands joined and then releasing M leads W into a 3/4 LF solo spot spin (L, R, L, -) - as he steps R XIF of L turning 1/4 RF to face wall, steps L beside R, R in place, - to end in CLOSED POS M's back to COH.

5 - 8 (Box)SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BK (to SCP), -;

WALK, -, 2 (to CP), -; PIVOT, -, 2 (to S Car), -;

In CP M's bk to COH step L swd, close R to L, step L fwd twd wall, hold 1 ct; Step R swd, close L to R, step R bwd turning to SEMI-CP, hold 1 ct; Walk fwd 2 slow steps (L, -, R, -) blending to CP; Do 1 RF couple pivot down LOD (L, -, R, -) ending in SIDECAR POS M facing diag LOD and wall.

9 - 16 CROSS TWO-STEP; CROSS TWO-STEP; CROSS TWO-STEP; CROSS, STEP, STEP

(W LF spin), -; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BK, -; WALK, -, 2, -; PIVOT, -, 2 (to CP), -;

Repeat action of Meas 1-8 EXCEPT end in CLOSED POS M facing LOD.

17 - 20 FWD, -, 2, -; FWD, 2, 3, -; FWD, -, 2, -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to SCP fac COH), -;

In CP M facing LOD walk fwd 2 slow steps (L, -, R, -); Then 3 rapid steps fwd (L, R, L, -); Continuing LOD walk fwd 2 slow steps (R, -, L, -); Step R swd twd wall, close L to R, step R XIF of L (W XIF also), - to end briefly in SCP facing COH.

21 - 24 SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to OP), -; CROSS, SIDE (TURN), STEP (W around 3/4), TCH;

TURN TWO-STEP 1/4; TURN TWO-STEP 1/4;

Step L swd twd COH, close R to L, step L XIF of R (W XIF also), - to end in OPEN POS facing wall M's L & W's R hands joined; M steps R XIB of L twd LOD, steps L swd twd LOD and wall, steps R turning 1/4 RF to face RLOD, tch L to R (W steps L, R, L in a sweeping arc twd wall and RLOD in a 3/4 RF turn) to end in CLOSED POS M facing RLOD; M starts on L stepping diag bk twd LOD and wall for 2 RF turning two-steps (1/4 turn each) to end in CLOSED POS M facing LOD.

25 - 32 FWD, -, 2, -; FWD, 2, 3, -; FWD, -, 2, -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -;

SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to OP), -; CROSS, SIDE (TURN), STEP (W around 3/4), TCH;

TURN TWO-STEP 1/4; TURN TWO-STEP 1/4 (to S Car);

Repeat action of Meas 17-24 EXCEPT end in SIDECAR POS M facing diag LOD and wall ready to repeat dance.

DANCE GOES THROUGH 3 TIMES

ENDING: On Meas 32 last time through "ease-apart" and acknowledge.

WORKING FOR SQUARE DANCING

BY... **Larry Butzer**

Let's use our imagination for a minute and picture a square of dancers trying to dance with no music and no caller. Confusion would reign supreme.

First, there would be no incentive since there is no music; second, there would be no sense of order since there would be no leader, each couple would be either doing a different pattern or trying to tell the other what pattern to follow and third, there would be no feeling of accomplishment.

Now, let's put the brakes on our imagination and return to realities. I think we would all agree that under the above conditions, if it were possible to get square dancing started, it would fall flat on its face before it ever got off the ground. Square dancing NEEDS an incentive, a leader and a feeling of accomplishment.

The incentive is already there and has been brought out many times by the use of such time honored phrases as "an enjoyable recreation", and "opportunity to become part of a fun group", etc.

If everything goes right the feeling of accomplishment is also there. Do you have this feeling of accomplishment if your couple and three others get through a rather complicated square without a goof? Of course you do. You wouldn't be human if you didn't.

There is only one other requirement that is necessary for square dancing to survive as a group activity. The LEADER. An important leader for square dancing per se is, of course, the caller. He is the one who gives directions to dancing. Because of his ability to teach we learn to dance, because of his ability to call, he can lead us through the sometimes intricate movements and at the end of the dance we have the "feeling of accomplishment". Here, in this area, we are lucky. We do have top callers and teachers—that is why the level of dancing is as high as it is.

But—there is another leader needed. He, in my opinion, is the most important factor in square dancing today. He is the Square Dancer who becomes the leader of

his group by holding one of the various offices. It is ONLY through the efforts of all square dance leaders, past, present and future that square dancing got off the ground, maintained its high standards, and will continue to provide each of us an opportunity to prove that "Square Dancing is Fun".

There are some individuals who enjoy serving as officers of their group. For them the work involved, and there is a lot of it, is fun. It stops being fun, however, when they realize that a good workhorse is being worked to death. They begin to look around for relief and most often find no takers. What happens? For them square dancing has stopped being "fun" and we are on the way to losing another dancer.

Why, in so many cases, are there no "takers" when it comes to serving the group as an officer? Do you as a dancer have a feeling of BELONGING to your group? You should, and this feeling should make you want to take an interest in the group's activities and affairs. Taking an interest means more than sitting in on meetings and voting. It means taking part in the WORK that is so necessary if the group is to retain its identity. And retain the groups identity it must if square dancing is to survive.

You don't have to be a "Pro" to be an officer. All you need is a sincere desire to help your group and square dancing. This will overshadow any lack of knowledge of the "Rules of Order" (sometimes it is easier to solve problems without the "rules").

I say again "Square Dancing is Fun"—but you will find it is a lot more fun if you rephrase the saying so that it will read, "Square Dancing and WORKING FOR SQUARE DANCING is Fun".

Think it over—are you going to refuse the next time you are offered the privilege of serving as an officer of your group?

'President's Message'

September—fall season; vacations nearly ended; vacationers back to work to rest up for next vacation season (and recoup financially); football season and Square Dance Beginners' Class Season.

All clubs sponsoring beginners' classes should screen their applicants carefully—it has been reported by an unusually reliable source that Larry Butzer is again attempting to enroll in a beginners' class, this time by using a fictitious name.

My club is sponsoring a beginners' class and some of the members have been most insistent that I show up to help the newer dancers. I was very happy to think that the club thought so much of my ability as a square dancer, but from a couple of conversations recently overheard, am beginning to think that there may be some other reason for their interest in me. You don't suppose . . . Larry, let me know if you get in a class and I'll join you. I can take a hint.

If your club does sponsor a beginners' class, and you are asked to help either in the recruiting or the actual class, give it some serious thought before you decide you are too busy and decline. Remember you were a beginner once, and no one can argue that without new dancers Square Dancing would soon pass out of the picture. New dancers bring new ideas, new personalities and new interests to our activity. This has been said over and over again, but it bears repeating—"You will never meet nicer people than Square Dancers". Why should we be selfish and keep all us nice people to ourselves. Besides, there might be one or two nice people left on the outside for us to recruit.

If you are lucky enough to be a member of one of the clubs sponsoring a beginners' class, get out and work to insure the suc-

cess of the class. You will find that working with the beginners is a rewarding experience, and you might even learn how to do some of those basics that have been bugging you. (The last beginners' class at which I "helped", I almost mastered the "right-and-left-through", and this time I'm going to make it.)

In all of the discussion about how much we are imposed upon to help at a beginners' class, we sometimes forget the tremendous job our local callers do in this respect. Sure they are compensated for teaching, but I'll bet their "compensation" in most cases does not cover the cost of the gas to get to the class, let alone cover the cost of the equipment they furnish. The caller has to be there whether he feels like it or not. He can't miss "just this once" with the idea of making it up later. Without the time and effort expended by our local callers, our square dance movement would not be nearly as enjoyable as it is now.

So, even if Larry and I show up at your beginners' class, grin and bear it—we may learn one of these years.

Speaking of callers, we feel very fortunate in having secured the services of Mark Bates to fill the job of Program Chairman for the 1965 Golden State Round-up. Mark and his wife, Fran, who call for the Bucks and Does, are already hard at work lining up the top callers for our pleasure at the Round-up.

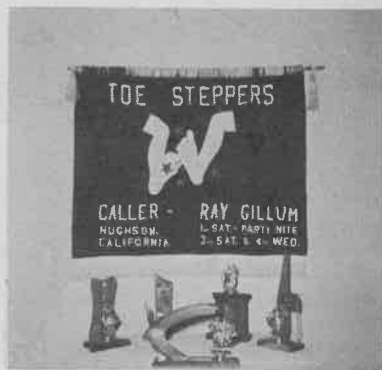

CONCERNING HALLS *Martin Parl*

A couple of months ago an article appeared in these pages in which the need of a new hall by the Bachelors 'n Bachelorettes of San Francisco was taken up. In so doing it was brought out that folk dancers have facilities at their disposal furnished them by the municipal authorities. And the issue was raised as to why the same does not apply to square dancing.

I have looked into the subject since then and learned that such facilities come

under two distinct departments. One is the Board of Education and the other the Recreation Department. Now if one wishes to obtain the use of a school for square dancing, there are several prerequisites. Among them (1) You have to obtain the permission of the Principal of the school and make out an application. (2) There is a charge ranging from \$10.00 to \$20.00 for janitorial service and the use of electricity and heat.

As of now only the Recreation Department furnishes folk dancers with centers for their activities where there is both folk and square dancing. There is no charge for admission and it is subsidized by the Recreation Department which furnishes the teachers. They qualify and are on the payroll. Folk dancers can, of course, make use of schools but only under the conditions stipulated above.

I want to emphasize the fact that we are interested in this matter from a purely constructive point of view, as something from which the community as a whole can benefit and that we, the B N B's are a non-profit organization. With this in mind, we are further looking into it to see if we cannot obtain appropriate results.
