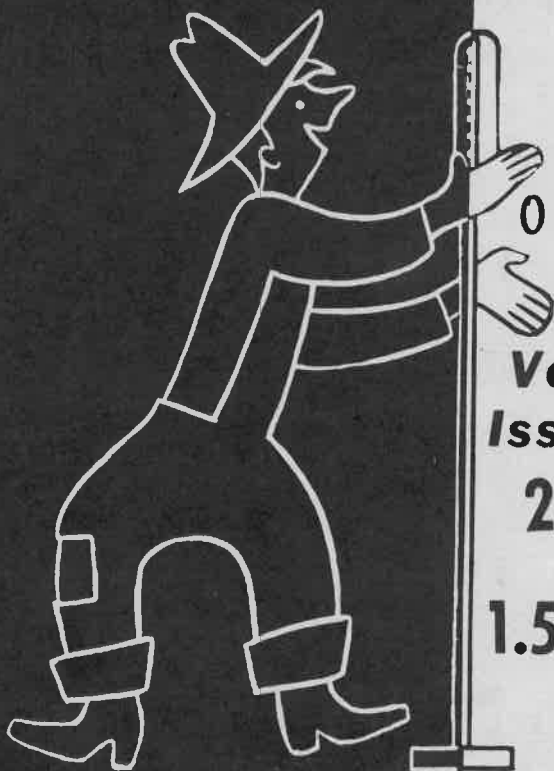

'IS YOU IS, OR IS YOU AIN'T'

"Is you is or is you ain't?" Is you a "top level" dancer who enjoys dancing only with other "top Level" dancers to calling and basics that present a definite challenge? Is you a "long time" dancer who plods his way along at club level, attending Hoedowns and doing his share of goofing? Is you a "newer" dancer who is just beginning to find out the wholesome fun that is Square Dancing? Is you a "beginner" who is beginning to wonder how in the heck anybody can follow the commands of the caller and why in the heck did I start this in the first place?

It takes all of the above types of dancers, and perhaps many more types, to complete the overall picture of Square Dancing. But—somewhere along the line some of us are losing sight of the fact that Square Dancing is a form of recreation that is intended to provide fun and enjoyment for ALL of us.

Since I have never been conditioned to the idea of being at the bottom of a pile made up of irate dancers clamoring for bits of my hide please let me make myself clear. I do not mean that all of us should attend the same dance ALWAYS. "To each his own" is a fine adage but again it does not hold true always.

Each issue of this progressive rag (??) carries ads announcing dances at various "levels". Some beginners, some newer dancers, some run of the mill hoedowns and some for workshops. This is as it should be and dancers should pick the level of dance they want to attend. Then again there are large dances such as Association Stampedes, club anniversary dances and special hoedowns with name callers. Here, with the exception of those attending beginners classes, there should be no breakdown as to "level". Here, we should all be just Square Dancers.

A complaint that is heard far too often is that "the dance was ruined for us because there were some people there who were not good dancers". May I ask—in whose opinion? I have yet to hear of any dancer who does not miss a call once in a while. When you do miss a call does this automatically place you in the "poor dancer" group?

Another type of dancer I have never heard of is one who starts in a beginners class and immediately becomes a top level dancer. All of us had to pass through the learning and practicing stage and since Square Dancing is a group activity it can't be done alone. While we were passing through these stages someone more advanced than us danced with us, gave us a helping hand and laughed with us not at us. This is the one big ingredient that makes Square Dancing the fun it is.

Some dancers, no matter how long they have danced, will never reach the level of the average dancer (DICK CROOKE?). But this does not stop them from having fun and, have you noticed, these "fun" dancers usually are charter members of the good worker group?

Just as the fellow who is not really intoxicated if he can lay on the floor without hanging on do you honestly think you are carrying on the spirit of Square Dancing if you dance without helping those on the way up? Remember, someone helped you. Also remember when you want to get away from it all for a while (which you should do before you lose interest) there are plenty of dances advertised.

So—"is you is or is you ain't". Is you one who can't stand it when someone goofs a call (but once in a while goofs yourself) or is you one who laughs off a goof and remembers that in the past you goofed more often than you now do because someone along the line steered you the right way?

had one of the biggest crowds to attend a Richmond Stampede recently. Unfortunately by 10:30 p.m. the floor had a number of vacant spots. Please accept my personal apologies for the Richmond Stampede and may we make one last request? Come back on October 31st secure in the knowledge that the caller will be oriented to our dancing pleasure and his program will be subject to close scrutiny prior to the dance. callers for the Anniversary Dance must be returned by mail to Walter Tupitza, Association Secretary, by October 15th, or brought in person to the October General Committee Meeting.

Looking forward to seeing all of the Association Delegates and their guests at the October Meeting, and looking forward to seeing all of you at the Square Dance Stampede on October 31st at either the Richmond Auditorium or the San Bruno Armory.

- 4. Associate:** Does not qualify as a caller or teacher as defined above. Prospective or beginning callers or square dance teachers qualify as associates. Has no vote. Membership fee \$1.00 per year.
