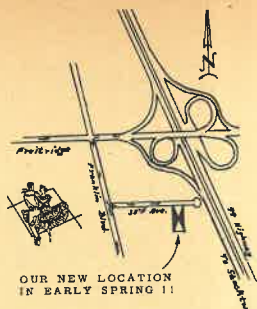

MORE THOUGHTS ON....

MUST A CLUB DIE?

Corinne N. O'Neal

TO FURTHER EXPLOIT THE THEME "Must A Club Die?" WE ARE OMITTING LARRYS' ARTICLE THIS MONTH TO ENJOY THIS FINELY PROVOCATIVE LETTER OF CORINNES'... Larry will be back next month with some thoughts you will find extremely interesting concerning the use of Basics !!!

I have just read Larry Butzer's "Must a Club Die?" Many square dancers will say, "So what? there are others----". But, there are also many who will have feelings of sadness, knowing so very keenly there were many who gave of themselves (beyond their families, their jobs and, yes, even beyond their experience and personal attributes), to either originate or to perpetuate this club which just died...for there was, in a sense, failure. And solemnly, and with feelings of apprehension, these sad people ask, "why?"

Internal friction? caller trouble? rat race dancing? Larry opened the door to some very provocative thinking as to why—and why we lose so many dancers. Yes, perhaps all of these play a part but I do not believe that they are profound in themselves. I think most of the trouble is in the pattern of our thinking, our reactions, our obsolete methods of approaching this national movement of square dancing, our lack of understanding, education and motivation and, the "hidden" elements involved.

And now, if I may, I would like to open Larry's door just a little bit more and bring a methodical person, let's enumerate.

1. Square dancers are the same as any other group of homogenous people—the givers and the takers.
2. Complacency—that beautiful, prolonged feeling of effortless smugness—just before the feeling topples. Complacency, the user and destroyer of love.
3. Involvement—that person-against-person kind. It just grows and grows and leads to ugly emotions, ugly faces and ugly end results.
4. The illusion of glorification. If we need to recognize someone let's be profoundly real about it. Let's recognize all who give

of themselves wholeheartedly, sincerely, humanitarially, without personal gain, those who by their knowledge and efforts have enriched our way of life and who have made individual contributions in the name of square dancing and square dancers. (There are many, many examples, our national and local leaders and among the rank and file—like working with the mentally ill).

5. Teamwork—usually only possible when the chips are down or, when the goal is either personally desirable, or needed, or both.

6. Leadership can be great, good, indifferent or, just plain bad. Whatever the category, an individual has made an effort. If you say it was bad, just take a good, long look at yourself. Did you try to make it "not so bad"? Did you withdraw? or, did you whisper criticisms, thus defeating yourself...and your club?

7. Reflections of self. How careful we should be of our thoughts, our actions, our loyalties and our honesty...for as we are and as we do...we stand there, alone, for all the world to see.

There are always percentages of loss and gains in every human endeavor, but it seems to me as though we, who know, enjoy, and value square dancing as an individual pleasure (and as a contribution to a world-wide recreation) we work so hard to survive...and perhaps to gain a little. I, too, have been doing some "research" as to "why?" I offer the following evaluation.

...The feeling of being "used" and "used up". This, of course, came from "ex" square dancers who had much to give and did so over a long period of time (It wasn't the giving, it was the abuse because of their giving).

...A more healthy mental approach to

square dancing. Instead of "bragging" how economical square dancing can be...why not reverse this pitch and give it the dignity of belonging to the 20th Century? In our present appeal...we actually eliminate the majority!

....Establish seminars, under the direction of NCSDA, for leadership education. Because club leadership (officers) usually serve only one year (officers being a mixture of people with different backgrounds, experiences, etc., but no experience in the conduct of a square dance social club), why not help them to understand the rudiments of their offices, what is expected of them, and how best to accomplish it with the minimum amount of effort?

....Establish an area Program of Events, under the direction of NCSDA, wherein all hoedowns, special events, etc., are known and available to other clubs. This will eliminate many hardships in duplication of hoedowns, etc.

....That an "open" column be originated so that problems, ideas, suggestions, etc., may be exposed and exchanged. There is nothing so penetrating as varied opinions...and nothing so vicious or detrimental as "not knowing" or, "they say".

....Mentioned in Sets in Order was a forthcoming program of national recognition of square dancing...are we getting ready?

....That the Association take the leadership in the solicitation (yes! solicitation!) in supervising, a healthy program for those who are interested in becoming teachers and callers...and, bring into focus that callers are callers, teachers are teachers, and seldom does the twain meet.

....Our present system is one of defeatism. We defeat the caller with potentials for great advancement by placing too many demands upon his time and energies. We defeat our teachers by assuming and expecting that which they cannot be. We defeat ourselves, our cause, our reaction by not placing the greatest emphasis and prestige where it belongs...upon qualified teachers. We defeat all our endeavors when we do not approach these areas...as a sound business investment.

And, there is the magic of enthusiasm. It is catching, too. I wonder what now the story might be, for the club which just died (with all its seemingly healthy relationships) if someone, just anyone, had stood up and strongly said, "I won't give up!"

MUST A CLUB DIE?

Dear Ed:

The Northern California Square Dance Callers Association has made a liar out of me!

Some months ago, Ralph Page, editor of NORTHERN JUNKET (the square and folk dance Journal of New England), wailed that "the woes of square dancing" are due in large part to callers and that, aided and abetted by record companies and square dance magazines, they are likely to "kill square dancing". Particularly, he pointed the finger of guilt at "the welter of odd-ball movements euphemistically labeled 'new basics'". In another part of the Journal, Walter Meier complained that "the friendly fun and spirit of square dancing is gone—so far as the multitude of dancers is concerned". In another article there, Pat Pending, backed them both up with the statement that "The procedure now followed by many callers... of hurling every new trick in the book at their dancers in order to be known as 'Fustest with the Mostes' is leading to suicide" (of the square dance movement). And now Larry Butzer comes out with much the same complaint in last month's SQUARE DANCE—WHERE?

The burden of the sorrows of those and other Cassandras of the impending doom of square dancing is that too many junky, non-self-explanatory ('non-directional') new basics are being foisted on the helpless masses of non-professional square dancers, that these people can not "take it" and are turning away from square dancing to golf, bowling, poker, T.V., and what not.

I had personally seen and participated in the growth of square dancing in Northern California, from the days of the two-couple "doceydo" to the latest brainstorm, "Hacey-dusy". So I wrote Ralph; "Tain't so! Here in Northern California—despite, or maybe because of, the new basics—, the square dance movement is going stronger than ever, with ever more newcomers to the field, ever more clubs and classes and ever so many "old timers" (like myself) either still square dancing or coming back to it anew. Here, as everywhere, many 'new basics' are called. But, unlike other areas, 'few are chosen'. The run-of-the-mill square dancer here (like myself) who dances for fun and socialibility rather than for expertness is neither plagued with junky non-directional 'new basics' nor burdened with too many new calls, no matter how good. We get just enough

new material to provide us with sufficient 'challenge' to keep us coming to workshops and to enjoy square dancing, visiting other clubs and going to Hoedowns.

"How does this come about?" I wrote. "Because we here in Northern California have a Caller's Association with a sense of responsibility both for the growth of the square dance movement and for the enjoyment of square dancing by the masses of ordinary dancers rather than by 'hot shots'. At its monthly meetings, the Association analyzes the reports of those of its callers who have tried out any 'new basics' in their own clubs and classes. It then approves for general use at Hoedowns and parties such new material as has met with considerable favor at such clubs and classes.

"So far", I wrote, "not very many 'new basics' have been thus approved and authorized. But enough new ones have been so introduced and popularized from time to time to keep our 'high level' dancers happy, without discouraging the less expert or making it too difficult for graduates of beginning classes to join 'intermediate level' square dance clubs.

"So—the number of square dancers and square dance clubs and classes here are growing continuously. Our square dance movement is growing and progressing satisfactorily. As you may note from the enclosed clipping of an editorial by Ed Ferrario in the tenth anniversary number of SQUARE DANCE—WHERE?"

I may have been overly optimistic at the time I wrote all this to Ralph Page. But I truly believed it—until several months ago. I then noticed—with amazement and chagrin—at my own square dance clubs, at others that I visited, and even at Hoedowns, a "rash of new basics": And, before these could be assimilated, another series; then another raft of them—most non-directional like "Spin the Top," "Curley Cue," "Explode the Line," "Hoop de Doo," "Ocean Chain," "Triple Wheel," "Wheel and Wave," etc., etc., before the last series was mastered enough to be done without a "walk-through" every time they were called. What was worse, every caller seemed to be putting on different 'new basics', so that dancers from one club found little satisfaction in visiting other clubs. And, when a beginners' class 'graduated' and joined the regular club sessions, after six months or so of the standard basic instruction, the whole intermediate or high level club had to start in again on the new basics—or drop them for others still newer—to the annoyance of those who had long since gotten beyond the beginners stage and who wanted to get some mileage out of the 'new basics' they had already learned.

Then I began to hear of one or another square dance clubs in our area folding, and one or another square dancer quitting this field of "recreation" or deciding not to come back to it after some unavoidable, temporary absence (the 'flu, or a "blessed event"). I began to wonder whether Ralph Page's dour declamation of dolor, decay, and doom for square dancing was about to come true in our hitherto booming Northern California square dance movement. I asked my favorite caller, Jim Mork—who was fighting hard to keep his new basics to a minimum despite the rat race of other callers and of eager-beaver dancers demanding to be taught anything new

that came along—about this worsening situation in our own midst. He then informed me that our Caller's Association no longer exercised any control over the quality or the quantity of new basics being introduced—the callers wanted "a free field"!

So, Ed, what I wrote to Ralph Page so pridefully about the superior situation of square dancing in Northern California over that in New England or other parts of the country where square dancing was being "killed" by the callers' rat race to be "Fustest with the Mostest" of the new gimmicks ('basics' to you), was not true. At least it is no longer true. Our Caller's Association has made a liar of me!

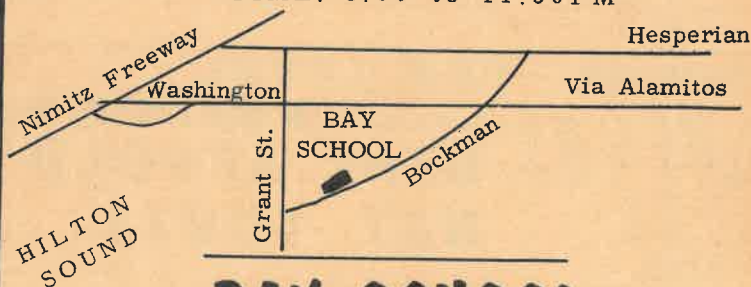

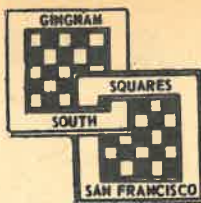

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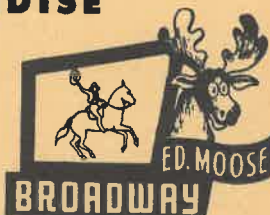
