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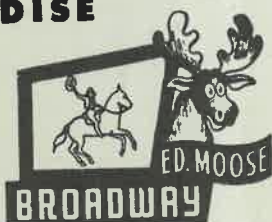
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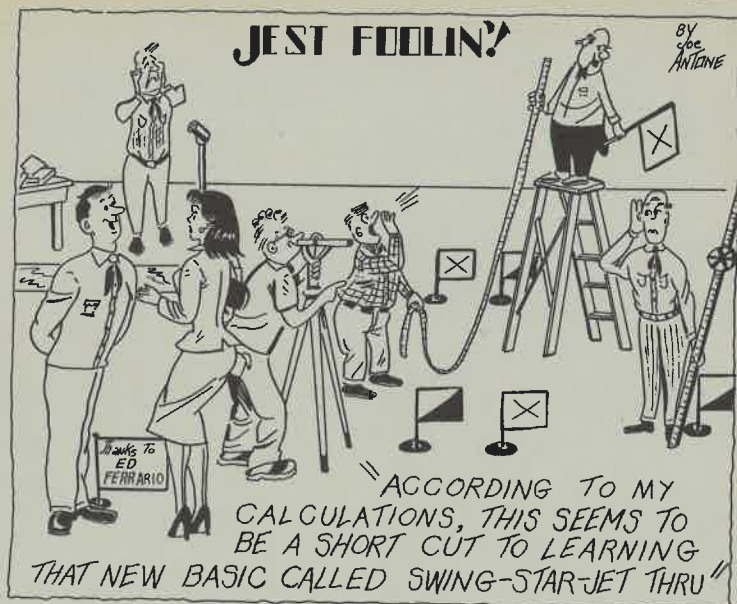

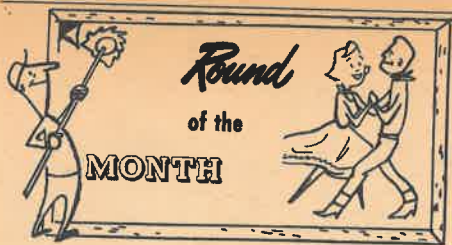

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

- 1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, TCH, -; TOGETHER (to SCP), -, TCH, -;

Wait 2 meas in Open-Facing Pos M facing wall and ptr M's R & W's L hands joined; Step L bwd twd COH (W bwd twd wall), -, tch R to L, -; Step R fwd turning to face LOD and assuming SEMI-CP, -, tch L to R, -;

DANCE

- 1 - 4 STEP, CLOSE, STEP, BRUSH; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, BRUSH;

VINE APART, 2, 3, BRUSH; SPOT TURN (M LF, W RF), 2, 3, TCH;

In SCP do 2 fwd two-steps LOD (L,R,L, brush R fwd; R,L,R, brush L fwd); Vine twd COH (W twd wall) L swd, R XIB of L, L swd, brush R fwd; Solo spot turn LF (W RF) R,L,R, tch L to R ending apart facing ptr and wall.

- 5 - 8 STEP, BRUSH, STEP, BRUSH; WALK FWD, 2, 3, TCH (to BFLY);

SIDE, STEP/STEP, SIDE, STEP/STEP; ROLL RLOD, 2, 3 (to SCP), TCH;

In apart pos step L in Place, brush R XIF of L, step R, brush L XIF of R; Walk twd ptr L,R,L, tch R assuming BFLY POS M's bk twd COH; Do a quick swd two-step balance twd RLOD R, L/R, do a quick swd two-step balance twd LOD L, R/L; Both roll twd RLOD (M RF, W LF) R,L,R ending in SCP facing LOD, tch L to R.

- 9 - 16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8 EXCEPT END IN BFLY POS M's BACK TO COH.

- 17 - 20 TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3, TCH; REV TWIRL VINE, 2, 3, TCH;

CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to L-OP), BRUSH; FWD, 2, FAC (BFLY), TCH;

Keeping M's L & W's R hands joined but releasing others M vines along LOD L swd, R XIB of L, L swd, tch R (as W twirls RF R,L,R, tch L under joined M's L & W's R hands); M vines along RLOD R,L,R, tch L (as W twirls LF under same joined hands L,R,L, tch R); With M's L & W's R hands still joined change sides with W XIF of M twd COH as M moves in back of W twd wall L,R,L, brush R ending in L-OP facing LOD; Move LOD R,L turning to face ptr and assuming BFLY POS M facing COH, step R, tch L.

- 21 - 24 TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3, TCH; REV TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3, TCH;

CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (to L-OP), BRUSH; FWD, 2, TURN (to OP), TCH;

Repeat action of Meas 17-20 (W twirling under same joined hands) in RLOD ending in OPEN POS facing LOD.

- 25 - 28 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH; FWD, 2, 3 (BFLY-BJO), TCH;

BJO AROUND (1/2), 2, 3, -; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3 (BFLY), -;

In OP walk fwd LOD L,R,L, brush R fwd; Continue fwd R,L,R turning to face ptr & wall & assuming BFLY POS M's bk to COH, tch L; In Bfly-Bjo Pos walk around RF 1/2 turn L,R,L,-; Change sides in 3 steps (as in Calif. Twirl) W crossing under joined M's R & W's L twd wall turning LF on 3rd step (M RF) to face ptr assuming BFLY POS M's bk to COH.

- 29 - 32 BACK AWAY, 2, 3, BRUSH; TOG, 2, 3 (CP), TCH; TURN 2-STEP; TURN 2-STEP (to

OUR BASIC FREQUENCY

Gosh! After all these months it is rather gratifying to discover that there are some readers of the "space filler" we send to Ed each month. What makes the discovery increasing valuable is that both of them took the time to voice their opinion in the form of articles of their own. To each of them, Corrine O'Neal and Harvey Lebrun, I say "Thank You."

Each of my two favorite people has published in last month's issue of Square Dance-Where? extremely interesting and timely essays on the same subject—"Must a Club Die". These were in reply to an article I had previously written on the same subject. It would be fun if more people would take the time to drop a line or two to Ed and express their views on subjects pertaining to Square Dancing. Why don't you?

I don't mean to run the subject of new basics into the ground but I would like to comment on Corrine's contribution. Her article was well written and gave evidence of some serious thinking on the subject and I find much to agree with and little to criticize. I agree with her concept of the faults of Square Dancers such as: givers and takers, complacency, involvement, illusions of glorification, teamwork, leadership, and reflections of self. I do hold, however, that these faults not only apply to Square Dancers—they also apply to every single endeavor where more than one individual is involved. It is a "fault" when a Square Dancer gets fed up with doing a new basic, learning a new basic, and forgetting a new basic he won't use—all at the same time? I think not. A little later I'll try to prove that MOST of the time spent on new basics is wasted time as far as Square Dancing is concerned.

As part of her evaluation as to "Why?" Corrine suggests that the NCSDA set up a Program of Events. I wonder if she has any idea as to the number of hours of time spent by the officers of the NCSDA in trying to do just that. The result? The clubs (made up of dancers) did not want it. She further suggests that the NCSDA take on the task of supervising a program for teachers. This is

not a function of the NCSDA but is a function of the Callers Association. They are, and have been, working on this problem—and I might add—doing a good job. Evidence of this fact is that we do have good dancers in this area—where did they learn?

Now enthusiasm. The club that died DID have enthusiasm, just as most dancers have. But enthusiasm for recreation tends to wane when the recreation becomes work—except for the semi-pros. She also asks "—what now the story might be—if someone, just anyone, had stood up and strongly said 'I won't give up!' ". I answer that by stating they did say it for a long, long time but theirs was a voice in the wilderness. If enough dancers will say "I won't give up the FUN of Square Dancing" and refuse to act as little magnets for callers to work out new basics then, and only then will Square Dancing get back to where it belongs—an enjoyable, relaxing form of recreation carried out with a group of people that are homogenous to the extent they enjoy each others company and the fun they have as a group.

About Harvey's article? I'm sorry the Callers Association made a liar of him but I'm glad that he saw the light. I agree with his article in its entirety and can only say if you haven't read it, do so. I think he is right (ain't human nature wonderful?)

Now for some information on the basics you actually dance. Bill Davis, popular Bay Area caller, has come up with an interesting tabulation concerning the commands given by callers at average hoedowns. I wish it were possible to publish his effort in its entirety so that all of you could see just exactly what basics are actually CALLED at an average dance.

He first noted that there are currently about 50 to 60 "basic" movements that the intermediate-advanced dancer may be exposed to, at a typical hoedown. Over a period of 10 hours of dancing (over 30 tips and 3200 commands) he computed the frequency on a percentage basis of basics currently being used. It is interesting to note that less than half of the basics accounted for over 90% of the commands.

Bill listed the first 25 basics with the

percent of the time they were used plus the cumulative total and—wonder of wonders—ELEVEN basics accounted for 75.5% of the calls. If you will bear with me I'd like to list them. Swing, Promenade, Allemande Left, Right and Left Through, Do Sa Do (includes All Around Your Left Hand Lady), Pass Through, Square Through, Star Through, Right and Left Grand, Ladies Chain, and Star (right and left).

What does this mean? Simply that you are dancing three-fourths of the time to only 11 basics and 96% of the time to 25 basics. ALL THE ODDS AND ENDS OF THE OTHER NEW BASICS THAT YOU SPEND YOUR TIME WORKSHOPPING ARE DANCED ONLY 4% of the time. After you have spent time workshoping the new basics how many times is it called at a regular hoe-down? Do what Bill did, check and see. But be prepared for a surprise. Thanks to Bill Davis we finally have concrete evidence as to what you dance.

I agree that the rash of new basics is not the only reason dancers are dropping out but I do believe it is one of the major reasons and the one reason we as dancers (this does not include Dick Cruk) can do something about.

I keep thinking how nice it would be if we had a beginner dancers explosion similar to the current population explosion. Which reminds me of two gentlemen who were involved in a discussion of the population explosion. When one of them was informed that every three seconds a woman gave birth to a baby he replied, "Gosh! Let's find her and stop her."

**SQUARE DANCING—DEAD—ALIVE—OR
INDIFFERENT**

In the past two months there have been a number of provocative articles in SD-W? on the present state of square dancing and the possible future of square dancing in this area.

One of the dominant themes in these articles was the present policy of presenting basics, or new figures to the dancers.

Last year your Dancer's Association, working with the Caller's Association, attempted to answer the question of new basics—too few or too many, too confusing or too simple, too much challenge or not enough challenge. After a number of meetings of the Basics Committee, composed of members of both Associations, a list of suggestions, or recommendations was presented to the membership of both Associations. Perhaps the recommendations of the Basics Committee were too radical, but they were presented only as a guide with the idea that the Association members would modify them to find the happy medium.

Out of 100 clubs in the Dancer's Association, replies to the recommendations of the Basics Committee were received from SIX CLUBS. The majority of the members of the Caller's Association indicated they would not accept the recommendations and would teach what they decided their clubs wanted.

Obviously the problem with basics has not been resolved as evidenced by the articles in SD-W? The indifference shown by the clubs of the Dancers Association did nothing to help the problem, nor did the attitude adopted by the members of the Caller's Association.

If square dancing is on the way out in this area, as we have heard, do we sit by holding our hands and watch it go? I personally have received too much from square dancing to even consider this course of action. I sincerely hope a lot of you feel the same way.

The next General Committee Meeting of the Dancer's Association will be held at Washington School, 9th and Santa Clara, Alameda, at 1:30 p.m., Sunday, March 21, 1965. How about discussing the past, present and future of square dancing with your club and then send your Delegate to the General Committee Meeting with some definite ideas and suggestions. Club Presidents and guests are always welcome at these meetings.

Also on the agenda for the March meeting are the By-laws changes presented at the December meeting and Round-up Committee assignments. All in all, a meeting at which you will be sure to want your club represented.
