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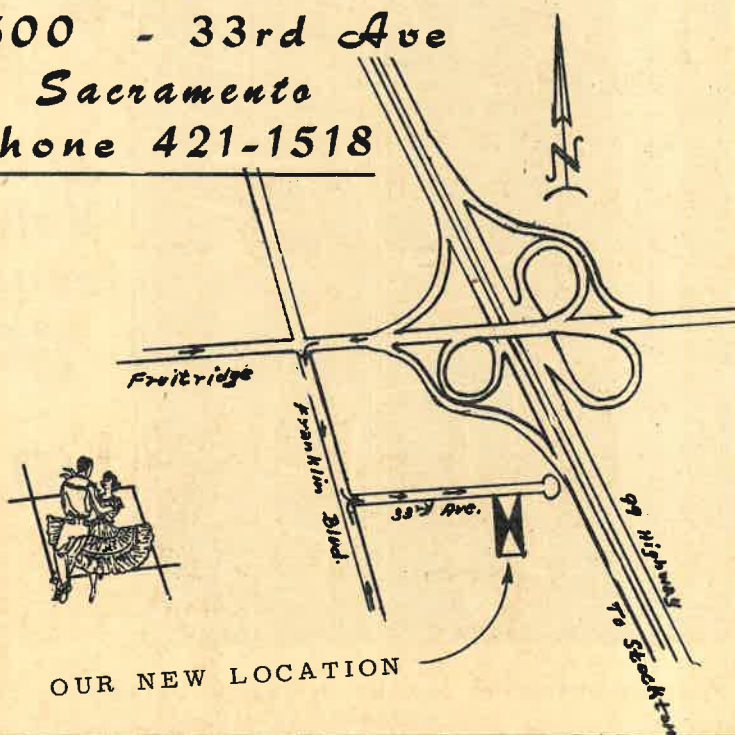
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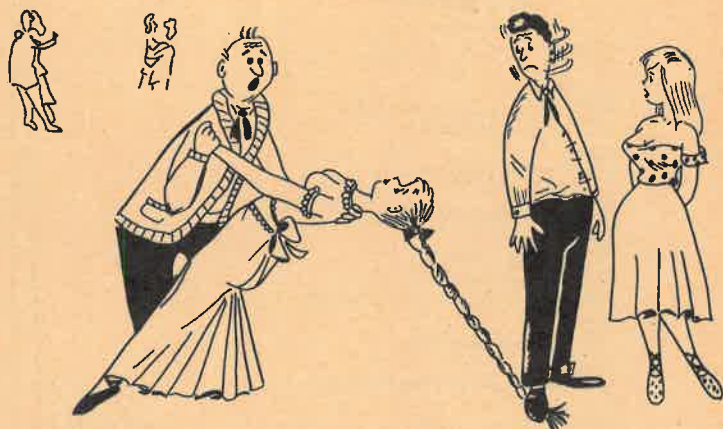

Do we really Need Panels?

One of the things I have been wondering about with relation to large Square Dances such as the Golden State Round-up, Squar-Rama, State Conventions, etc., are the various panels offered to the dancers by the Program Chairmen of these events.

In looking over some of the old programs I find that several interesting subjects have been offered but as I recall, when I attended these panels, the number of run-of-the-mill dancers in attendance was very small. By far the biggest percentage of the audience was made up of callers and a smattering of the "workers", such as Association and club officers. This is a sorry situation because in most cases the panel is set up for the Dancer, who after all, is the heart of the Square Dance movement.

The panel can very well be compared to the old fashioned Town Meeting where each was not only entitled but expected to voice his opinion. From these meetings a certain eclecticism was developed and the result was a society formed and functioning to the best interest of the majority. But—and this is important—the Town Meeting and all it stood for and hoped to accomplish would have failed miserably if the citizens, both the militant and the passive, had failed to take advantage of the opportunity to "have their say".

Just as the Town Meeting was good for society so is the Panel good for Square Dancing. You the Dancer have a chance to actively participate in an atmosphere that is both friendly and informative. You will leave the panel with a good feeling of accomplishment since you will know that you have been heard and that you have listened to others.

What do panels accomplish? This is a good question and one that is rather difficult to answer. In the final analysis I believe that any accomplishment would depend on the manner in which the results were publicised so that all dancers would be made aware of the opinion of this particular group, no matter how small. From this group the discussion could be carried to the club level and perhaps the Association level and eventually the opinion of the panel might become the opinion of all Dan-

cers. And—another step would be taken in making Square Dancing just a little more fun for everyone.

All panels are not of the discussion type. Some are informative such as those provided for the ladies where they discuss methods of making dresses. Others include planning for hoedowns, party nights, how to conduct a meeting, how to start a beginners class, and a multitude of other subjects. Whatever panel you attend you will find interesting and from each you will have learned just a little more.

I understand that at least two very interesting panels will be offered at the Golden State Round-up in May. Check on the publicity for this top event of the Square Dance year as to title, time and place. Then plan your dancing time so that you can sit in and help take over after the Moderators get things started. I'm sure that you will enjoy yourself.

I just thought of an excellent panel subject—"The Problems Involved in Teaching Dick Croke How to Square Dance". This in itself would prove that panels cannot solve all problems.

See you at the Round-up and, I hope, at the panels.

Larry Butzer's articles have been interesting but we have the feeling that he does not actually know what's going on.

We have been dancing for fifteen years and boredom was our particular problem. Boredom caused by listening to the same old calls by the same old callers to the same old tunes both at clubs and Saturday night dances. We changed all that by seeking groups that wanted stimulating dances by callers who made you want to dance to beautiful voices and interesting material. Butzer speaks of Bill Davis' tabulations. Rather meaningless unless you fit them into the ability and training of the dancers involved. For example, beginners, intermediates and advanced dancers. On February 13th we danced to Marshall Flippo. He used less than eleven basics but he combined them into routines that were interesting and new, called to tunes we had never heard before.

All of us enjoyed the dance more than usual.

Has Butzer ever attended one of Larry Ward's B-Sharp workshops where he teaches all the latest basics and gimmicks and styling? Or Joel Pepper's workshop where he teaches material not very often heard in this area? The reaction of the dancers is fantastic. Each leaves for home with a wonderfully satisfied feeling. They've had a wonderful time and show it.

Show us a club in the whole area with a caller that does as well and we'd like to be invited to join. Every caller in this area would profit by watching Larry Ward or Joel Pepper teach new material that is directional and fun to do.
