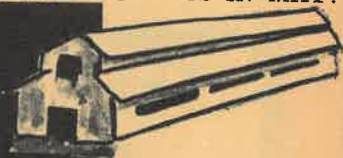

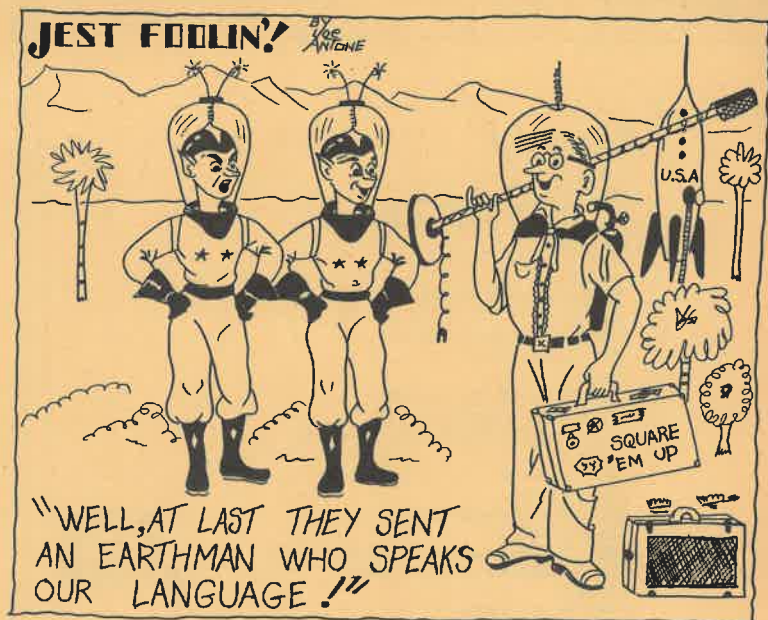

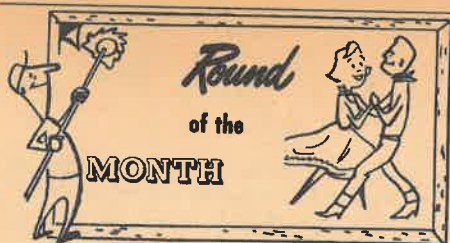

SCP M do 2 fwd two-steps twd LOD L,R,L,-; R,L,R,-; M fwd on L twd LOD, close R to L, bk on L, hold (W side on R twd LOD, close L to R turning to Bjo step fwd on R twd RLOD); M bk on R twd RLOD, close L to R, fwd on R, hold (W side twd RLOD on L, close R to L turning to SCP, fwd on L);

5 - 8 SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU,-; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

WHO'S BORED ??

ASKS

I'm getting slightly overwhelmed at the growing number of readers and their response to my efforts in getting dancers interested in the subject of basics. At a regular meeting of the Board (held while I was in the shower) a full membership was granted to Alice and Elmer DeGraf, bringing the total membership of the club to five—since I read my own column I also qualify for membership.

These two charming people start their letter by saying my articles have been interesting. For this little bit of intelligent reasoning I say "thank you". They then enter into a dissertation on boredom, stating that their own particular problem during fifteen years of Square Dancing was that they were bored. Somehow it seems to me that's a long time to be bored but they should be congratulated on sticking it out until they found a type of square dancing that would get them "unbored."

But—while they were getting "unbored" they took time out to attend a dance called by that top caller Marshall Flippo (where in all probability they danced with other dancers who didn't realize they were bored). According to the DeGrafs, Flippo used only ELEVEN basics in calling a dance that "All of us enjoyed—more than usual". Thank you, Alice and Elmer, for confirming what I have been writing about—namely, that a good dance can be called without using all the odds and ends of non-directional basics that should have remained in the pre-natal stage.

They then remark that Bill Davis' tabulations are "meaningless unless they fit them into the ability and training of the dancers involved. For example, beginners, intermediates and advanced dancers". Since I did not attend the Flippo dance I can only assume that among the dancers were newer dancers, intermediate dancers and so-called advanced dancers. Obviously some form of tabulation WAS kept at this dance and it fell right into line with Davis'. The only difference being that Davis reported that eleven basics were called 75% of the time while the DeGraf's reported that eleven basics used 100% of the time.

Next I read that they became bored "listening to the same old calls by the same

old callers to the same old tunes". Chronologically speaking I know of only one "old" caller—Ed Ferrario, but I know several callers who qualify to being "old" if you refer to length of time given to the square dance movement. I imagine that the Bob DeGrafs include them when they say that every caller in this area would profit by watching Larry Ward or Joel Pepper teach new material that is directional and fun to do. To this I can only say that each of the local callers could be very proud indeed—for they are the callers that taught these people to dance in the first place. How many beginners are Larry Ward and Joel Pepper teaching in this area? How much are they doing in keeping the square dance movement alive in this area? I have to agree that they are doing a fine job of keeping a certain percentage of the dancers happy and contented because these dancers want more than the average club level dancers want, as far as level of dancing is concerned. And—this is as it should be. There is a place for this type of club and no one should criticize any dancer who enjoys it.

On the other hand no one should criticize our local callers. Larry Ward and Joel Pepper are fine callers—I have danced to both of them and enjoyed their work. But I have enjoyed dancing to our local callers just as much and in most cases I have had more of the "fun" that is Square Dancing. I have said before and will continue to say that we dancers in this area are just plain lucky—our callers are tops. I also feel that when the DeGrafs finally find out what is "actually going on" they will be able to find plenty of clubs in this area to join that have callers who consistently do as good a job as ANY outside caller. They will also have the satisfaction of being a part of the square dance movement in this area—which is important if the movement is to continue.

No, Alice and Elmer, I have never attended a Larry Ward workshop, or any other workshop. Not because I have never been invited, I have—several times. I have not attended simply because I have found the level of dancing I enjoy plus the fact that I can honestly feel that I am contributing in some small way to helping keep square dance

ing the kind of "fun" that it can be if we will just let it.

To each his own, Alice and Elmer?

After all is said and done it was nice of the DeGrafs to take the time and effort required in drafting a letter to Square Dance-Where? More people should do it. As you can see Ed prints 'em all.

Heard over the grapevine that there might be a very interesting panel on much of this same subject at the Golden State Round-up in May. See you there? Until next month—happy dancing!
